

Visit with Fran Greehan: SRI=Marketing Internal Records

I had another quick chat with Fran Greehan yesterday evening. We looked at the query file that I have begun to put together (LJOURNAL, 22757, 1:W) as per our last talk (LJOURNAL, 22696, 1:W). He seemed pleased with it (as far as it went),

The intent of a query file would be to satisfy some basic questions SRI folk might ask of the Marketing people. 22757 just has some NSF programs in it for demonstration. Its structure allows one to query through either an agency (I want to know about NSF,) or through SRI's organizational structure (I'm in the physical sciences, what's available?).

A second purpose for Augmentation is to organize the Marketing Department's data for internal use. Fran described a few types of information he deals with:

1) contact reports, which may be submitted by anyone in the Institute, describing a visit with a (potential) client,

2a

2) the organizational structure of SRI's (potential) clientele (though the government is fairly stable, it does change from time to time, like creation of FEO and move of some group to that new office, so this must be maleable),

2b

3) notes about various nodes in these organizational structures (such as mission, programs, budgets), and

2c

4) private notes about organizations or people (this guys is impressed with big words,...).

2d

I suggested that each contact report be journalized seperately. It could then be referenced from both the query file and a file designed for internal record keeping, and would follow these in their changes over time. The file for internal (to SRI=Marketing) use might be structured perhaps as follows:

Of course other nodes and these nodes may appear at any level. There may be a contact for the bureau as a whole or programs within an office. 4

Someone would have to be responsible for receiving journal citations in their subcollection and seeing that the proper links get placed in the proper places. 5

Fran would like to be able to put on an effective demonstration to management there in Menlo (he and I linked to JCN perhaps?) and to his colleagues here in the near future. 6

We thought that the next step in our experimenting, assuming SRI will buy a slot on the utility, would be to get some of the information they have online, in that structure. He will have his notes cleaned up by Monday (APR 22). Some of their contact reports might be put online too for the sake of demonstrations. 7

Fran would also like to begin writing an introduction to any demos we might put on. He will write up some rough notes which I will have typed into the system, then we will get together and fix it up. 8

I just had another series of 3 blow-ups with the line processor. It would get in a state of receiving tons of garbage from EP and sending to display, and then occasionally (in some cases continually) sending stuff back to EP. I have a feeling it is a heat related hardware problem, because taking the cover off the LP seems to help. It is independent of whether I'm in LP or tty mode, and happened once when I wasn't even logged in but sitting at the herald. The following patterns came up (were repeatedly printed on display): "AB6B2f7" "CaB6Sr" "R0PPR6" and "\_AB6S AB6SwV". Of course I couldn't tell where the beginning of the pattern was, but thought they might ring a bell with someone. Systems reset on LP sometimes gave me the chance to get through to the TIP and disconnect. Reconnecting and attaching, the garbage was gone.

Subject: Wrap-up of Catalog Operations and Securing the Database

Speaking as a veteran of the transition from the 940 to the 10, and considering some of the conditions that appear in the offing by 30 June 1974, perhaps you would consider the following suggestion:

#### Background Information

We now have on- and offline a considerable database of catalog material that is of real value. It presently is somewhat scattered:

The "A=SOURCE" files are on a tape and some archived, the "CIT" files input since then are in <nic=work>, <jernigan>, and one file lost...will have to hunt it on a dump tape (someone deleted it without archiving it). The "CIT" files are input according to the numerical identity of the material at hand and the range of CIT files are not in numerical order (i.e., they are input as they are available, and material arrives for input in random order).

The "A=SOURCE" files are set up in strict numerical order, each file named to contain no more than 500 entries (no file, of course, will contain 500 entries, because interspersed numbers are used for some other purpose than catalog entries -- journal, etc.). As a result of the format and naming convention of the A=SOURCE files, it is easy to find an entry.

I have one hardcopy printout of the A=SOURCE files through 1 June 1973. The hardcopy printouts of CIT files are, of course, for individual files, necessitating a search of each individual file to find an entry.

In addition to the numerical listings on hardcopy of the A=SOURCE and CIT files, there is set up in the hall outside my office an alphabetical card file, with a card for each

entry, filed by top "filing identity", with no cross indexing of filing names; i.e., one card per entry. The filing entry is the topmost item in the coding and would be:

2a1d

1) First author, if there is an individual author.

2a1d1

2) Issuing agency, if the item is a report, brochure, manual, user guide, or similar material and has an identifiable issuing site, but no personal author.

2a1d2

3) Publisher, when the item is a book and there is no individual author and no corporate author (there are few like that, such as the NTIS and GPO issued directories and one Auerbach book that I remember of this type).

2a1d3

4) First word of the title when the item is something like a newspaper article and there is no writer's name listed (a few from Computerworld and Palo Alto Times are in this category).

2a1d4

5) First word of the title, or a dreamed-up word or name when the item is some obscure item with no identification, and I had no reliable information as to its source (there are a few like that).

2a1d5

6) The author's (writer's) name when the item is a letter or memo.

2a1d6

7) The name of the company when the item is equipment brochures/info and the like; also true of equipment catalogs.

2a1d7

The total size of A=SOURCE and CIT files combined will probably be between 1000 and 1200 disk pages.

In order for this database to be safely preserved for some future time when it may be usable (used), it should be gathered

into one collated set of files and put on one tape. Then the online files may be safely erased and the database will be immediately available for reading onto some future system at some site for possible future work. Knowing Doug's habit of "bouncing" back up when he gets a setback, I have every faith that this will be the case here; however, the bounce in the "catalog department" can be enormously eased if the way of a future online endeavor is prepared by keeping a properly safeguarded database on tapes,

## Suggested Format of Retained Database

It is suggested that the database be prepared, collated, and put into one complete set of A-SOURCE files. From that point, it is suggested that the files be put into 3 forms, or versions:

2b2a

1) An NLS version. Utility here is obvious: in a system using NLS.

2b2a1

2) A sequential version = TENEX compatible. This can be utilized at some remote TENEX site, possibly Datacomputer, etc. The holding of the database in this version would enable sending the files across the Net without the necessity of loading a large database into a possibly small computer or system, and then converting it before transmission across the Net.

2b2a2

3) A sequential version which is output from NLS into what we call a "print file": This type of file is compatible to IBM 360 and may be read onto such a machine directly, with no processing beyond proper disk placement for batch operation. Again, holding the database on a tape in this form would ease transmission across the Net into a batch mode 360 operation such as UCLA=CCN or UCSB.

It is suggested that the database be stored on 3 tapes in the above 3 formats, each tape plainly marked for utilization in the desired system-mode,

It is suggested that some directory now "closed" here at ARC be re-opened to receive the present CIT files and the A=SOURCE files now stored on tape and in archive. Give me about a week to collate everything, get printouts, and put the files into the to-be-taped format, and the tapes can be safely accomplished. It might be easier to do the taping if when the database is ready to be taped, another directory could be emptied (or empty directory opened) and the specially formatted files could be placed in that directory for mass taping onto one tape. As soon as the tape is checked and confirmed as good, then the formatted files in that directory could be erased. (This would enable taping a directory with only one kind of file-format on the tape; thus removing any problems with file structure if the tape is shipped somewhere for input of that particular format.)

2b3a

I would need to do the file manipulation over a weekend because the sorting of these fairly large files would be a heavy burden on the system during regular prime time.

2b3b

I would also appreciate some assistance in taping from someone really knowledgeable in that area, since I am hesitant to trust my inexperience here to a job that obviously has a lot depending on it.

2b3c

Since we have a lot of tapes and security at the beginning may well be advisable, I would suggest making more than one copy of the final tapes.

2b3d

While the NLS files are online and in final (taping) form, I can obtain more than one printout of the database, giving ARC a good hardcopy for use during the future work, when the database will be on tape and not available online.

2b3e

Let's please don't wait till the last minute when everybody is taping and trying to get prints,,let's prepare in advance before the last minute rush.

Conversation with Dick Schmitt: ARC's Performance for DEIS, Support  
for the Electric Power Research Institute

As the date of his leaving SRI approaches, Dick Schmitt grows more reflective. I had a casual chat with him Monday morning the 15th in which two things came to light.

First, although he had complained with feeling in the past about insufficient service from ARC and insufficient opportunity for him to be involved with NLS, he had recently read over Jim's proposal of December (journal, 21447,) and said, "You guys did exactly what you said you would do, no more, no less,, you pulled your punches very gracefully."

Secondly he said he was still interested both in NLS and other aspects of the ARPA net. As you may know he is going to work at the Electric Power Research Institute at the end of this month. He said they faced information handling problems similar to the DEIS. Could they somehow have access to NLS? I told him about Utility slots. Would that give them access to the ARPA net? I told him no, not in itself and explained about commercial users. I told him that to get on the net they would have to have a basis in the eyes of ARPA. He said that the Electric Power Research Institute was going to sponsor some work jointly with ARPA, and that he was going to talk with Rudy Black about those matters at the end of that week. He said he would ask Black about access to the net for EPRI.

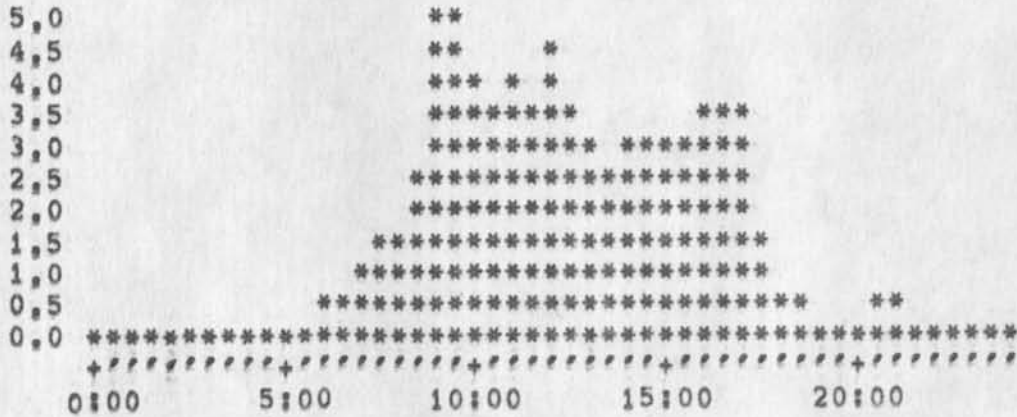

Superwatch Average Graphs for Week of 4/14/74

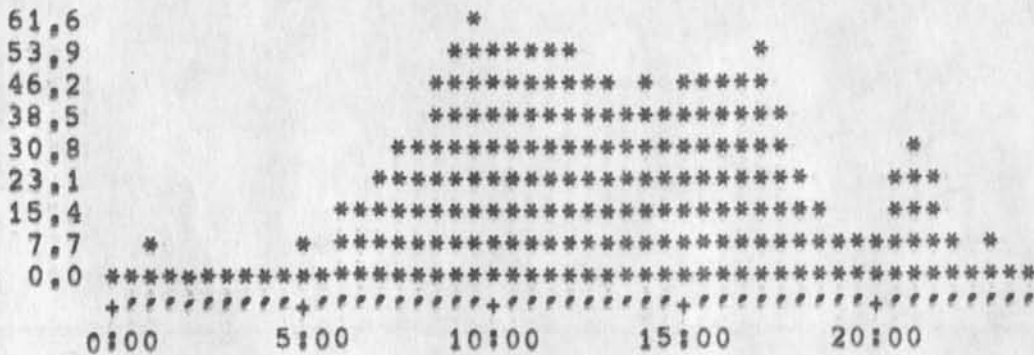
TIME PLOT OF AVERAGE NUMBER OF GO JOBS FOR WEEK OF 4/14/74

x axis labeled in units of hr:min, xunit = 30 minutes



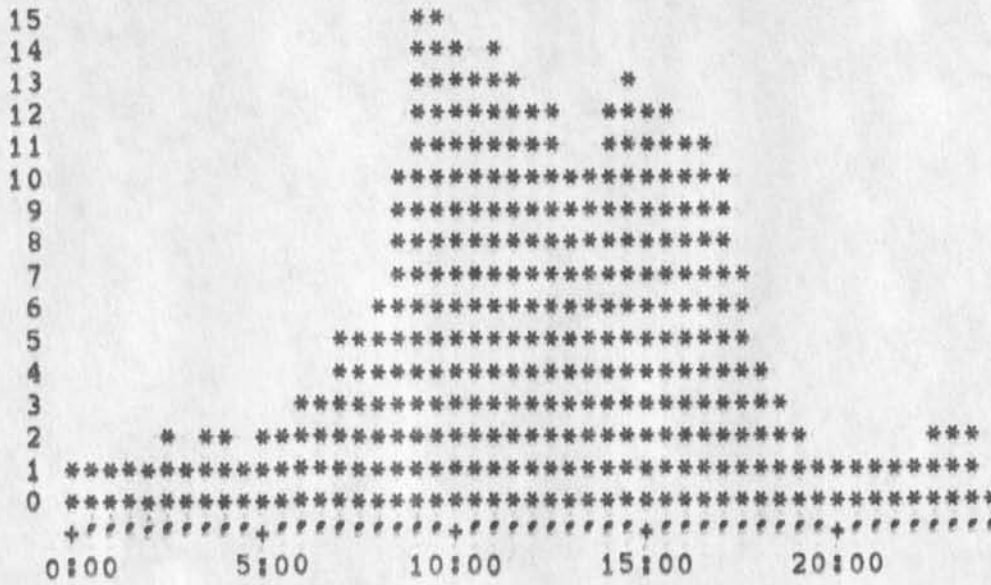

x axis labeled in units of hr:min, xunit = 30 minutes

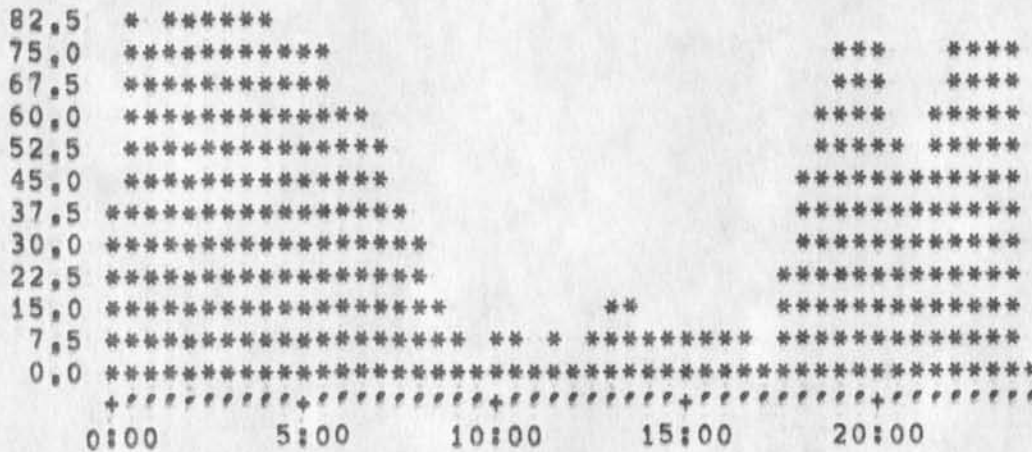

x axis labeled in units of hr:min, xunit = 30 minutes

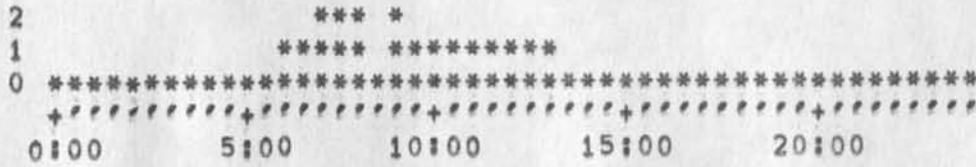

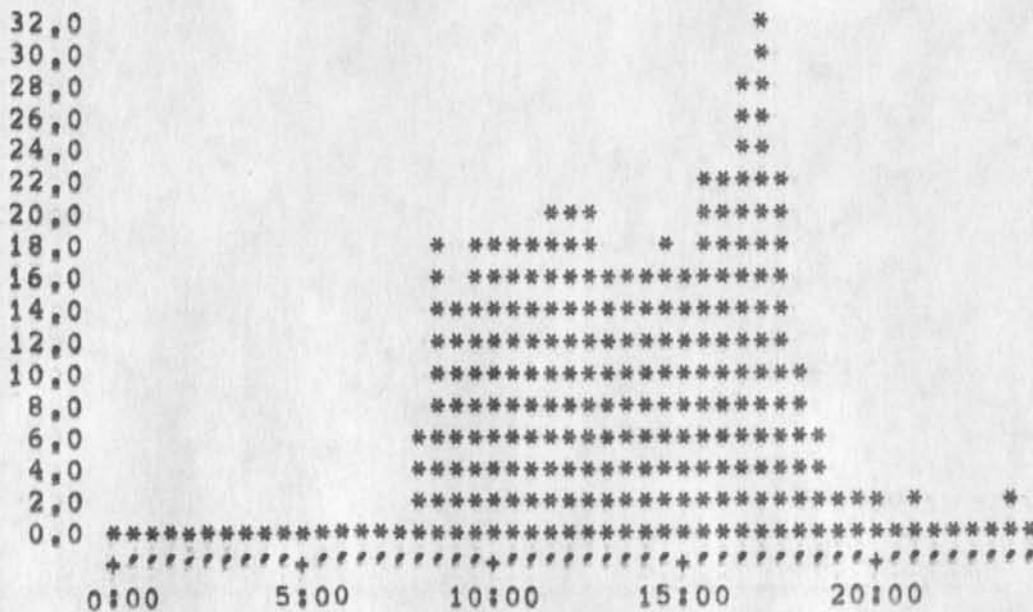

The first is that many of the mailboxes given above contain Attn XXX where XXX is some alphabetic group of characters. This is because we have many people sharing the same account who are physically miles apart. Thus we have a program which looks for "Attn" and diverts the mail to specific message files. If it is possible to include the Attn XXX in the ARPANET directory I would be grateful even if the journal system cannot insert the appropriate string in the message. (Seriously, I do not really expect such major changes being put into the journal system, but it would be valuable if the Attn bit were in the ARPANET directory.)
