



all nce upon a time, on a distant planet

The people of the kingdom worked hard, but they did not mind because there is great satisfaction in doing one's job well and being rewarded in proportion to the value of one's work. And so the most important rule in the kingdom was: "People first, products and profits will follow." There was the dreaded DESC dragon that reared up its especially ugly head and was slain when product testing problems were solved. And then they slew the dragon of merely being an alternate source when the people of AMD anticipated what customers would really want and invented their very first proprietary magic chips. And indeed, these magic chips were truly worth their weight in gold! W And there were plagues of dragons in '74 and '81 when harsh times fell upon the lands and even at Christmastime there were no great feasts. But with courage, sacrifice, hard work and innovative efforts—the noble qualities that always prevail against dragons—good times and prosperity returned to the people of AMD (who by this time had come to be known as AMDers). 
gainst this dismal scene, in the winter


ow this response caused the famous

By order of Good King Jerry, AMD will reward extraordinary efforts in service to customers by superior performers. Awards will be made on a monthly basis in two categories: Dragonslayers and Dragonbusters.

- Employees eligible for the DRAGONSLAYERS PROGRAM include full time U.S. salaried (exempt and SNE) and indirect hourly employees, European and South East Asia sales support personnel and professional employees in the European Test Center.
- The DRAGONBUSTERS PROGRAM is for direct, full-time hourly employees in the U.S. and in the European Test Center.
- In order to be eligible for these awards, employees must be on active status at the time awards are distributed. Directors and above are not eligible, nor are employees on bonus or incentive programs such as field sales personnel and field applications engineers.
- The DRAGONSLAYERS PROGRAM will last through December. Each month, managing directors and directors will nominate employees who have made extraordinary efforts in overcoming obstacles (slaying dragons) and satisfying the needs of AMD customers. Vice presidents will select finalists from among the nominees, and the names will be submitted to the Council of Dragonslayers, who will review accomplishments and determine winners.
- Each month six \$1,000 prizes, two in each category, will be awarded to the winners for significant accomplishments that demonstrate RIGOR in engineering (including all engineering positions primarily involved in the development of new products and new technologies); VIGOR in manufacturing (including engineering positions primarily involved in manufacturing and customer service, production supervision, quality assurance and reliability and back-end activities); and NIMBLEness in all other eligible positions including marketing and non-technical SNEs in all areas. All awards are made at the discretion of the Council of Dragonslayers.
- The six monthly \$1,000 winners will receive a special Dragonslayer medallion designating them as Grand Knights. All finalists will receive a Dragonslayer award and are eligible for a grand prize drawing at the end of the year for a trip to England, the home of St. George, the most famous of all dragonslayers.
- TRAGONBUSTERS will be nominated by GFs and shift supervisors on a monthly basis through December for exceptional efforts that help AMD slay the dragons that stand between the company and satisfied customers. Management will choose four Dragonbusters each month, each of whom will receive \$500. All Dragonbuster nominees, including monthly award winners, will receive a Dragonbusters t-shirt and will be eligible for a special year-end grand prize drawing.
- The accomplishments of all Dragonslayer and Dragonbuster finalists will be highlighted in a monthly Dragonslayers newsletter distributed to all employees.
- More information on selection criteria and procedures will be forthcoming. The aim of the Dragonslayers campaign is to find and reward RIGOR, VIGOR and NIMBLEness at AMD.
