
# by Marie Gattnig Fat Fund Treasurer



SDA continues to make progress. As I told you in the June Newsletter, SDA Products had lost approximately \$400,000 through April 1980. In May and June SDA Products made a profit of approximately \$100,000. I hope that for the balance of the year, SDA Products will at least break-even. The professional services part of the company made a pretax profit of \$650,000 for the first half of the year, and I believe the pretax profit for the entire organization (services and products combined) will exceed \$1,000,000 for the year of 1980 -- the highest such profit in the company's history.

Our new offices continue to develop, and our New York branch now constitutes less than half of the professional services revenue of the company. Our branches also represent significant opportunities for future growth. We hope to open at least one new branch before the end of this year.

I visited our office in London during August, and we are making excellent progress in that city. We have about seven people on the staff with more to join in the coming months. We have established relationships with several fine clients and are in the process of promoting a technical manager from the U.S. to the London office. Our plan is that the London office will be the first of many overseas offices and that this development will allow our staff members not only professional opportunities but also the chance to live and work in other parts of the world.

I am happy to announce the addition of two new staff members into management positions within SDA. Ron Episcopo has joined SDA effective early September as Training Manager. Ron joins us from Chemical Bank and will be responsible for in-house training and developing our training products for sale in the outside market. Gus Mansur has joined SDA as Product Manager for SCORE. Gus will be responsible for all sales and marketing management for our COBOL Program Generator - SCORE.


Gus joins us from Information Science where he was Vice President and General Manager of one of their business areas. Gus has already started to have a positive impact on SCORE marketing, and I am confident that he and Ron will both be successful and contribute to our future growth.

Probably the most important accomplishment that I can note in this column is the fulfilling of a commitment (made in the rain last year) of sunshine on all SDA picnics. New Jersey, Philadelphia and New York all had picnics and nary a drop fell.
