The Information Processing Branch is concerned with the direction of exploratory, advanced and engineering development in support of computer software error control, transferability, and cost reduction as it pertains to AVIONICS and Command and Control Systems,

Responsible areas of technology are:

1. Higher Order Languages: to produce high quality compilers in an automated fashion, thereby cutting down on the cost and time necessary to build compilers, and to develop methodology necessary to control HOL's in order to eliminate certain problems with their use and thereby promote their use.

2. Software Error Control: to investigate and develop techniques for controlling the error rate in the production of software.

3. Programming Tools: to develop software tools which will assist the writers or programmers of software, and support test engineers and maintenance personnel.

4. Modern Programming Practices: to develop techniques for formalizing the design of software.

5. National Software Works: to improve productivity of DOD software development by making available to programmers and managers software tools already in widespread use in the research community.

6. Software Executive Services: to provide requirement analysis, quality assurance, testing support and design recommendations for the Air Force World Wide Military Command and Control System (WWMCCS) community and to provide system software support to operational users requiring capabilities to manipulate large data bases.

The goal of HOL has been to produce a prototype Compiler Implementations Tool. The JOVIAL language was selected for this development because of its WWMCCS importance. The resultant compiler has been installed at SAC and Norad Sites. Plans are underway to develop similar tools for FORTRAN and COBOL. The design of a Language Control Facility and the implementation of a reporting system for a set of std AF HOL's has been initiated.

Background: 2

During a current FY, a plan is conceived for expending the next fiscal year's funds. The plan consists of OIR's and planned new efforts. This plan (with modifications) is implemented as we progress through the next FY. The cash flow of IS is the rate at which the funds we are authorized to expend is paid to contractors. Authorizations are on a fiscal year basis and expenditures are normally made during the fiscal year. Forward financing approval (approval to expend current fiscal year funds during the next fiscal year) is always a possibility. From the time the plan is conceived until actual obligation, expenditure rates can be considered to be estimates and can change one or more times during this period.

2a

Definitions and Objectives: 3

An on-line accounting system will be built under NLS utilizing L10 programs for program planning and to aid in the control of money that is obligated during a fiscal year. The purpose of this accounting system is to track an effort through its life cycle (through the planning stage, during the various phases of procurement and then through actual implementation) and to collectively represent selected efforts in such a way as to aid the management process. To do this, it must handle Initiated, Committed and Obligation money as well as estimated expenditure rates and actual money spent by the government. The system should support both near-term and long-term planning. Progress reports will be generated that will deal with schedules and financial data.

3a

Scope and Boundaries: 4

Money controlled by the accounting system will include OIR's, new starts and planned efforts (estimated). This will give the system control of financial data for the fiscal year in the form of pre-initiated, initiated, committed, obligated amounts and estimates.

4a

Algorithms will be developed to project the expenditure rate for each effort. Its application will aid in the forecasting of actual money expenditures at any point in time during the fiscal year.

4b

There will be three types of expenditure rates: a straight linear function to deal with study-type contracts, a bell-shaped curve to handle hardware buys and a point function

for off-the-shelf buys where the entire contract amount is spent when the contract is signed. The first two functions must be capable of incorporating no-cost extensions.

The estimated quantities in the system will be readjusted as necessary. For example, if an effort is initiated three weeks early, the estimated dates for commitment and obligation will be re-estimated.

4c

Actual expenditures will be kept track of for the current fiscal year. The range of control for obligated amounts in the form of OIR's will extend over as many fiscal years as necessary.

4d

A symbolic model of the system will be designed that will be suited for the prediction or determination of effects of changes in the actual system.

4e

Efforts will be available on an individual basis, or grouped by project or division or TPO area.

4f

A graphics capability will developed that will be used in the formulation of reports.

4g

Operational Scenario:

5

The financial picture of the IS division for a fiscal year consists of OIR's that represent efforts carried over from the prior fiscal year, new starts that might be in varying stages of procurement and planned efforts that might start in that or subsequent years. The accounting system must control this information by tracking the expenditures being made and by incorporating the changes in status of planned efforts.

5a

The developed algorithm for expenditure rate will allow the organization to more intelligently predict how much money will be spent. Its sensitivity is open to debate but a good starting point might be done on a monthly basis.

5b

The accounting system must also contain the capability to perform simulations of the organization's financial picture. This will allow management to judge the impact of real or projected changes in the actual system. This will include addition or deletion of money to the total allocated project fund. Another possible exercise will involve letting the starting dates of new efforts slide in order to give management the ability to improve the cash flow of the organization by having certain efforts temporarily postponed and even inserting new efforts into the picture on a projected basis. If an effort is cancelled, its associated values will be deleted from the accounting system.
