The purpose of the Community Memory Project is to enhance and encourage full participation and free expression in society by providing and promoting tools through which individuals and groups can share knowledge, opinion, resources, and friendship.

Since the early 1970's, the Community Memory Project has served as a catalyst to encourage individuals and organizations to explore the potential of new technology to strengthen community life. Not only do we educate opinion-makers and the general public about community telecommunications, but over the years, we have developed a number of demonstration projects that put our ideas into action.

We currently manage a ten-terminal public access community network in Berkeley which anyone can use to read or write messages. It is on this easy-to-use computer network that the Alameda County War Memorial lives.

We were delighted when Country Joe McDonald came to us and convened, under the leadership of YaVette Holts, Community Memory's Outreach Director, a group of veterans and volunteers from across the political spectrum who were interested in creating an interactive war memorial. Nonetheless,

The Alameda County War Memorial is only one part of this vital resource — the Community Memory Network.

Home to almost one hundred discussion and information forums, the Network is used by a wide range of people — senior poets and high school hackers, homeless people and college professors, small community groups and large local institutions — to share ideas and inspirations, exchange goods and services, meet, talk, gossip, debate, and support each other.

Computer technology has tremendous power to encourage participation in society by bringing together people who might not ordinarily have a chance to get to know each other and by allowing voices often silenced to be heard. The work of the Alameda County War Memorial volunteers demonstrates that computer technology need not serve only "smart bombs" and high-tech weaponry. Rather, this technology can foster human understanding and hopefully lead to innovative solutions to the difficult problems facing our communities.

## USING THE MEMORIAL

### SOURCE OF INFORMATION

This printed version of the computerized Alameda County War Memorial includes the names of all Alameda County Veterans who died in wars during this century. Veteran information was provided by the United States Department of Defense. The format and breadth of each entry included in this memorial directly reflects the data given to us by the Defense Department. Only names of those veterans who, upon registering for duty, listed their hometown to be in Alameda County appear here.

### HOW TO FIND NAMES

Because we followed the formatting provided by Department of Defense, the names of the veterans of different wars can be found in different ways.

- \*In the Persian Gulf War Memorial and the World War II Memorial, veterans are listed in alphabetical order;
- \*In the Vietnam War Memorial and the Korean War Memorial, veterans are listed in reverse alphabetical order by their hometown of record;
- \*In the World War I Memorial, veterans are listed in reverse alphabetical order, first by rank and then by type of casualty suffered.

### ENSURING ACCURACY

This memorial began, was driven and completed through the efforts of a small group of volunteers who persevered to

ensure the accuracy of each name entered into this memorial. By no means, does this memorial assert to be the definitive list of Alameda County war veterans, but rather, it reflects 12 months of diligence and reverence commemorating friends, family and neighbors lost in war. In the unlikely event that an error is discovered, it can be easily corrected on the computerized memorial.

### REMEMBERING THE PEOPLE

Our intent in creating this memorial and remembering deceased Alameda County veterans, is neither to advocate nor to denounce war. Our belief is that in remembering, we can promote understanding. Whether the reader simply skims the pages of this memorial or reads every name from start to finish, the impact will be quite powerful. The reader should keep in mind that the power is not in remembering the war, but in remembering the people.

## Story of the Alameda County War Memorial Project

Most people will know me as Country Joe McDonald, the lead singer for the 60's rock band COUNTRY JOE AND THE FISH. And will remember me from the Woodstock movie singing the song I FEEL LIKE I'M FIXING TO DIE RAG about the war in Vietnam. What most people do not know is that I am a military veteran. I enlisted out of high school in the Navy in my home town of El Monte in Southern California. Upon graduation, in 1959, I enlisted in the U. S. Navy, was trained in Air Traffic Control and spent two years in Japan at Naval Air Station Atsugi. After my enlistment, I moved to Berkeley.

I have always felt that we should look to those who fight wars for the meaning of war. I was taken by the efforts of VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR and worked with them during the war years to aid their efforts. After the war, like everyone else, I tried to forget.

In 1981 three things happened to me. I discovered that my neighbors in Berkeley lost a son in Vietnam and I began to get calls again from Vietnam veterans for assistance. I also was made aware of the fact that I was a military veteran myself of the Vietnam War era. I began to be concerned with the long range effects of war and the divisions it cut through the community. I began to desire reconciliation.

For the next six years, I plunged myself back into the war and military life looking for the "big picture". What I found instead was little pictures. Little pictures of real people who had paid the "price" and their friends and family trying to get on with life. I felt we needed to cut through the politics and work for reconciliation. In an effort to find out more about my neighbors' son, I began to talk to the Department of Defense. At first, I got a list of all Californians who died in the war. In 1987, myself and some others formed the Berkeley Vietnam War Memorial Project. On Veterans Day in 1987, we met at the Berkeley Veterans Building and some twenty of us marched down University Avenue to Berkeley's Aquatic Park

and floated 21 candles in memory of the 21 Berkeleyans who lost their lives fighting in the military during that war.

I became curious about other wars and what information was available. Working with Congressman Ron Dellums' office, I acquired lists from World War I, World War II, and Korea. I got lots of information on Vietnam War memorials in the U.S. Our group began to talk of a physical memorial for the city of Berkeley. We settled for a location on the North Waterfront Park because it was neutral new ground in Berkeley not full of painful, tender memories from the war years.

I began to think of the whole East Bay and the proposed state park to span the whole shoreline of the East Bay. I began to amass names from all of Alameda County. But soon I found that physical memorials are full of problems: location, cost, design, and often can be full of controversy, in and of themselves. But at all times, the model was the Vietnam War Memorial in Washington, D.C. I knew Jan Scruggs who started the "Wall" in D.C. and began to talk with him about my ideas. He and others cautioned patience and perseverance.

It seemed to me in 1987, that every year I wished to plan something for Veterans Day but before I knew it, it was too late and it came and went mostly without anything special in Berkeley. I worked in the same building as Gary Meyer, the owner of the Landmark Theater chain; the U.C. Theater in Berkeley being one of these. I asked Gary if on November 11, 1990 we could have a special afternoon showing of war films. He agreed and I began to plan.

In doing publicity for the event one reporter suggested that I pursue my new vision of a computerized memorial with the Community Memory Project which had just recently put 10 public access computer bulletin board terminals in Berkeley.

I called and spoke with YaVette Holts. She was enthusiastic. I discovered that their office was just blocks away. At the film showing we asked for volunteers to enter the names into the system and the rest is history.

## The Volunteers

### James L. Watson

Born in Birmingham, Alabama in 1946 to working class parents. Mother was an office worker, father was a truckdriver and union activist. Family moved to California in 1955. Left Pacific High School (San Leandro) in 1964. Entered U. S. Navy in January 1965. Was Gunner's Mate aboard USS Saint Paul (CA-73) in Summer of 1966. Fired 365 pound projectiles into "enemy positions" in Vietnam. Honorably discharged in 1967. Generally supported U. S. government policies until 1968, when the massive Vietnamese military offensive - the Tet Offensive - followed by the Chicago Police Riot took place. As I watched people outside the Democratic Party Convention beaten, jailed, then framed up and convicted for protesting the huge loss of life earlier in the year, I thought of Dennis and Joseph Daughton Jr. whose funerals I had recently attended. The war had killed them both and the rest of my life was profoundly and permanently changed. I soon became a Socialist and activist working to end the war. This Memorial project is one way I have continued trying to further the interests of working people both in and out of uniform. I am now an active member of the Machinist Union Local Lodge 1781. I live in the East Bay with my wife Susan Baus, and our baby girl, Jessica.

### Gert Chiarito

Born April 14, 1914 in Waldport, Oregon, an unusual and isolated community on the coast. Postmaster at Elkton, Oregon throughout World War II, also served as a Volunteer Observer in the 4th Interceptor Command of the Sixth Army. At Elkton, met numerous people at the conscientious objector camp nearby, some of whom were instrumental in starting radio station KPFA in Berkeley, and the Interplayers theater group in San Francisco. Helped put KPFA on the air on April 15, 1949 and worked there in many capacities until August of 1966. Best known program was the Midnight Special, a live Folk Music program, and also did live music programs for and with children. Was a Pacifica Foundation Board Member and Secretary and also served as Acting Manager of KPFA. In Little Theater worked with the Company of The Golden Hind and did volunteer work at the East Bay Center for the Blind, the Suicide Prevention Center in San

Francisco, and read for Blind Students at the University of California, and in the engineering department at the East Bay Skills Center. After leaving KPFA, traveled for three years as National Organizer for a children's book company associated with the Head Start Program. Returned to area and worked with Cooperative Center Federal Credit Union, managing two branches. Managed two other credit unions, worked for three architectural firms and a construction company.

### Gregory W. Ross L.Ac.

I was born forty-four years ago in a Navy hospital on the island of Chincoteague, VA.; my first military experience. My mother said I wouldn't stop crying. Even then I was an astute judge of when I had gotten myself into a bad situation. Nineteen years later, in Great Lakes, Illinois, a Navy photographer kept trying to get me to smile for the boot camp yearbook picture, but I knew I had gotten myself into a bad situation. I had hoped to avoid Vietnam in the Navy, but they eventually got me there in the form of a tour of duty in the Seventh Fleet on what was called the gun line. We sat a quarter of a mile off the coast of Vietnam and fired two thousand pound shells up to twenty miles. I got out of the Navy in 1970. After wasting myself and a decade I decided to get it together in the 1980's. My wife, Peggy, and I were married in the spring of 1982 and our son, Nicolas, was born the winter equinox of the same year. The next year I started acupuncture college and after a long haul of part-time work, part-time school and full-time husband and Dad, I received my license in August of 1989. Now I work at a drug and alcohol recovery clinic in the Bay View-Hunters Point area of San Francisco and volunteer at Community Memory when I can.

### Richard J. Vannucci

Vietnam Veteran-US Navy. A lifelong resident of the Bay Area who works in the field of horticulture for the City of Fremont. Very involved in the Italian/American community and currently edits its newsletter "il Scintilla" (The Spark). Continues to drill in the Naval Reserve and is active in various military oriented lobby groups. Loves good food and jazz, both good and bad.

## **Persian Gulf War (Operation Desert Storm) 1991**

After World War I, England administered Iraq under a mandate from the League of Nations. This mandate ended in 1932. During this period, Britain arbitrarily imposed many borders on the region, which resulted in a long history of border disputes between Iraq and Kuwait. On August 2, 1990 Iraq invaded Kuwait.

On August 6, the United Nations Security Council passed Resolution 660, condemning the invasion and demanding Iraqi withdrawal. On August 8, Iraq annexed Kuwait and began looting Kuwaiti valuables. Money, weapons, museum pieces, hospital equipment, and even people were taken out of Kuwait into Iraq. The United Nations Security Council then voted to void the annexation. On August 10, 1990, Iraq ordered all foreign Embassies in Kuwait to close, insisting it was now another province of Iraq. On August 22, U.S. President, George Bush, called up the Military Reserves for the first time since the Vietnam War.

On the 30th of August, President Bush unveiled a plan for a multinational military force which would be financed by affluent countries. "Operation Desert Shield" as it was called, began a military build-up in Saudi Arabia and the Persian Gulf region. By October 23, U.S. forces in the region had reached 210 thousand. On November 14, the U. S. Secretary of Defense activated 72,500 reservists. Finally, after much sabre rattling on all sides and much debate in Washington D.C., the U.S. Congress, by a very close vote, authorized the declaration of war. On November 29, 1990, the United Nations Security Council set a deadline of January 15, 1991 for Iraqi withdrawal from Kuwait.

The United Nations Multinational coalition was made up of: Argentina, Australia, Bangladesh, Belgium, Britain, Canada, Czechoslovakia, Denmark, Egypt, France, Greece, Gulf Cooperation Council (Saudi Arabia, Oman, United Arab Emirates, Qatar and Kuwait), Honduras, Italy, Morocco, Netherlands, New Zealand, Niger, Norway, Pakistan, Portugal, Senegal, Spain, Syria, Soviet Union, Afghanistan, Bulgaria, Germany, Hungary, Japan and Poland. A massive, non-stop air bombardment was launched.

U.S. troop deployment reached 514 thousand, and on February 23, the Allies launched a massive land attack into Iraq and Kuwait against Iraqi troops. Five days later, after almost no Iraqi resistance, the U.S. President declared victory.

It was the U.S. Department of Defense policy during the build-up and the war to severely limit access to information. There are no figures on Allied casualties. It is estimated that 100 U.S. soldiers were killed and an unknown number wounded. It is estimated that over 100 thousand Iraqis were killed, almost all by the bombing. At the time of this writing much is still unresolved and unfinished. Oil fires still burn in Kuwait, and very little of the country is back to normal. Stolen property from Kuwait, taken to Baghdad, has not yet been returned. Iraq has yet to fully comply with the surrender conditions, and disputes continue to surface as United Nations observers seek to verify compliance, particularly with regard to Iraq's nuclear weapons capability.

## Vietnam War 1961 (?) - 1975

When WWII ended, the Allies occupied Vietnam and assigned Great Britain and China to disarm the Japanese. The country was divided at the 16th parallel with China in command of the North and Great Britain in command of the South. In the South, the British helped the French regain power, a power they had held in Indo-China for a century.

The Viet Minh, under leadership of Ho Chi Minh claimed North Vietnam. The French and the Democratic Republic of Vietnam (DRV or North Vietnam) entered into negotiations for a planned free election for national unity. The election never happened. The French and Viet Minh fought a bloody war with a terrible French defeat in the valley fortress of Dien Bien Phu. At a peace conference in 1954 the French and the DRV agreed to a temporary division of the country at the 17th parallel. The French in the South and the DRV communists in the North.

At this time, the soon to be famous DMZ or de-militarized zone was created at the dividing line of North and South, the 17th parallel. Once again, an election was planned to vote on national unity, and the election never happened. By the 1960's Americans had totally replaced the French in South Vietnam. The U.S. Central Intelligence Agency established one government and then assassinated the president they established. In 1964, acting on disinformation about an attack upon U.S. warships in the Tonkin Gulf, the U.S. formally attacked North Vietnam and America's longest war was underway.

The war incited riots in the streets of almost every large American city and a near disintegration of the U.S. military.

President Lyndon Johnson called for an international show of many flags to stop the communist threat that both he and previous President John F. Kennedy had seen in Southeast Asia. In the end, seven countries joined America's "Free World Forces": Australia, Korea, Thailand, New Zealand, The Philippines, Taiwan and Spain. Many Canadians also fought with U.S. armed forces.

Peace negotiations began in Paris on May 13, 1968. They continued for five years. A peace agreement was finally signed in January 1973. The cease-fire was repeatedly violated. It ended in the evacuation of the remaining American forces in April 1975, as the North took full control of all of Vietnam.

There were 10 million Americans under arms during the war. Three million Americans saw combat. The average age was 19, America's youngest combatants. The average tour of duty was 12 months. Over 58 thousand Americans died in combat, with 330 thousand sustaining wounds. Well over 2 million Vietnamese, North and South, were killed. The countryside was devastated, losing 20 per cent of its forests as a result of herbicidal spray.

## Korean War 1950-1953

When WWII ended in 1945, Soviet forces occupied the northern half of Korea and U.S. forces occupied the southern half, with the dividing line set at the 38th parallel. Disagreement soon arose between the U.S. and Soviet forces. In 1948, a United Nations commission supervised elections in South Korea. At the same time, a government known as the Democratic People's Republic was set up in North Korea under Soviet supervision. In 1948-49 both U.S. and Soviet troops withdrew from all of Korea.

On Sunday morning, June 25, 1950, North Korean soldiers invaded South Korea. The South Korean military was forced to retreat. The U.S. brought the matter before the United Nations Security Council, and on the same day (June 25, 1950), the Security Council ordered a cease-fire and immediate withdrawal of North Korean troops from South Korea.

On June 27, the Council recommended that all U.N. members help in driving back the invaders and restoring peace. The U.S. President, Harry S. Truman, ordered U.S. Naval and Air forces to give cover and support to the South Koreans. On the 29th of June he permitted the use of U.S. ground troops

in Korea. On July 8, 1950, U.S. General Douglas MacArthur was named Commander-in-Chief of the newly created United Nations Command. Early in October, United Nations forces entered North Korea.

Late in June 1951 the North Korean and Chinese communists, acting through the Soviet government asked for a cease-fire. Truce talks began on July 10, 1951. The war went on for two more years, as peace talks broke off and then started again. Then at 10 am on July 27, 1951 the truce documents were signed. Twelve hours later the war stopped. The conflict lasted three years, one month and two days. U.S. casualties alone totaled 142,091 including 33,629 dead, of whom 23,300 were killed in action. The division of North and South was again established at the 38th parallel. To this day families are still trying to reunite and communicate North to South, and reunification is still a dream of most Koreans.

## World War II 1939-1945

Adolf Hitler rose to power as a dictator in Germany in 1933. Hitler withdrew Germany from the League of Nations (formed as a worldwide deterrent to war, the precursor to the United Nations) in 1933. He began to build up the German Military and by 1938 had a formidable war machine. He annexed Austria, the Sudetenland, Memel and the Czechoslovak Republic. Italy attacked Albania in April 1939. Hitler invaded Poland September 1, 1939. On September 3, 1939 France and Britain declared war on Hitler's Germany. In November 1939 Russia attacked Finland. On April 9, 1940 Hitler attacked Denmark and Norway. On May 10, 1940 Germany attacked Luxembourg, the Netherlands, and Belgium. On June 10, 1940 Italy entered the war on Germany's side. Italy invaded Greece on October 28, 1940. On June 22, 1941 Hitler declared war on the Soviet Union.

It is estimated that Germany killed more than 10 million civilians and Prisoners of War during WWII including 6 million Jews. They forcibly uprooted 100 million people and made them work on Nazi labor projects.

In 1931 Japan broke the peace with China and invaded Manchuria. In July 1941 Japan established land and air bases in French Indo-China. Countering this threat, the U.S., Great Britain and the Netherlands Indies stopped all commerce with

Japan. On December 7, 1941 Japan attacked the U.S. military bases in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii and the Philippines. On December 8, 1941 the U.S. Congress declared war on Japan. On December 11, Italy and Germany declared war on the U.S. and on the same day the U.S. declared war on Italy and Germany.

By 1946 there were 54 nations in the United Nations allied against the Axis powers of Germany, Italy and Japan, who had signed a treaty in September, 1940, called the Rome-Berlin-Tokyo Pact. Eire, Portugal, Spain, Sweden and Switzerland remained neutral. On April 28, 1945 anti-fascists executed Benito Mussolini, dictator of Italy. On May 12, 1945 Hitler committed suicide. On May 7, 1945 in Reims, France, Germany formally surrendered. On May 8, 1945 the war in Europe was over after 5 1/2 years.

On August 6, 1945 the U.S. dropped a single atomic bomb on Hiroshima, Japan. On August 8, the Soviet Union declared war on Japan. On August 9, 1945 the U.S. dropped a second atomic bomb on Japan on the town of Nagasaki. On September 2, 1945 Japan surrendered and the war was over.

## World War I 1914-1918

On June 28, 1914, Francis Ferdinand, heir to the Austro-Hungarian crown, and his wife were assassinated in the streets of Sarajevo, Bosnia. Within a little more than one month's time almost all of Europe was at war. On July 28, Austria declared war on Serbia. Russia aligned itself with Serbia. On July 29, Germany moved troops into Luxembourg, and declared war against France on August 3, 1914. England followed by entering the war at midnight on August 4-5.

On February 25, the Germans sunk the British liner Laconia and two U.S. citizens were killed. On April 6, 1917 the United States Congress declared a state of war to exist. On May 18, 1917 the Selective Service Act (military draft, conscription, forced service in the military) was passed, affecting all American men between the ages of 21-30 years old.

In the end, this four year war is remembered for it's unequalled military casualties. World governments spent over eighty trillion dollars on the war. They had over 65 million military personnel under arms suffering casualties of 21 million wounded, and 8 1/2 million military deaths.

A peace conference opened in Versailles, France, on January 18, 1919. It was not until August of 1920 that all combatants finally signed the treaty known as the Treaty of Versailles.

This Memorial is dedicated on November 11, Veterans Day which initially was Armistice Day celebrating the end of The Great War (WWI). The 11th month, the 11th day, the 11th hour.
