MEMO TO: Mr. F. E. Johnston

REF: Dr. Kolsky's letter of 8/5/58

I would like to amplify a little upon Dr. Kolsky's letter of August 5th regarding simulation memos. It is my opinion that we should insist upon having these memos back in our hands and accounted for within thirty days. Most of the memos are now out of date, and do not reflect our latest expectations on performance. Certain statements are made in them for the worthy purpose of needling Engineering into greater activity. They have had this effect. However, taken out of context they might be interpreted as meaning that we did not at some time, or do not now, propose to fulfill our contract negotiations. I want to be very certain that nothing of this sort remains in their hands at the time we sit down to renegotiate the contract, and that these renegotiations are conducted strictly on the basis of what we know and propose to do at that time without regard to our past trials and tribulations.
