Another DSS Idea: Draft Routing

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This is an idea for a system we might integrate into the Journal Redesign. It may also be needed for the Forms System.

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Another DSS Idea: Draft Routing

John F. Heafner has suggested an interesting document or form routing scheme which looks like something we may want to incorporate into our DSS system when we are ready. He calls it "Mailbox Message Service: Draft Message Preparation" in his description, NIC 19198. Essentially it can be seen as a game, the object of which is to get the rough draft, proposal, or incomplete form (called the "draft") read and signed off by a number of people before being distributed in its final state through the normal channels.

Object:

Route the draft until properly signed off and then distribute the final document.

Players:

Original author, in charge of the operation ("coordinator"). 1b1

The people who must okay the item ("collaborators").

The recipients of the finished product ("distribution list"). 1b3

The system, whose purpose it is to keep the status straight and automatically further the state when all the votes (approvals, etc.) are in.

Game:

The coordinator submits the item (perhaps "unrecorded" at first) using a special command to specify the collaborator list and the fact that this is a route-before-distribution submittal.

The system delivers the item to each coordinator, sequentially or all at the same time (a parameter). The coordinators receive it in a special branch, or are notified in some other way that this is an urgent thing for them to handle. They presumably read the item and make a decision. They execute a system command which notes their decision. This response may take one of three forms:

unconditional approval - anything that happens is okay.
 Even if the item should get changed, it is approved.
 1c2a

2. conditional approval - okay if it stays exactly as is and is not modified during the rest of the routing process. 1c2b

3. not approved - a comment, saying why it can't be approved as is; perhaps a suggestion or modification. 1c2c

Another DSS Idea: Draft Routing

One of the things participants can do while waiting is get the system to show the status of the "project". It should be able to show for each collaborator: whether the item was ever delivered, whether he read it, and what type of response he gave (if any).

When comments (non-approvals) are made, the system will not be able to further the state of the game without assistance. The coordinator will either have to override the dissenting collaborator(s) via a command or will have to change the item and reroute it. The system could inform the coordinator when all the votes are in and it is either proceeding on to delivery or prevented from proceeding.

Implementation Ideas

The system could be driven by a system file of special low-level commands (similar to the Journal Delivery's "hcdistfile", but more readable) which specify functions which ultimately feed into the "hcdistfile" (delivery to collaborators and recipients). In addition, the file would contain a status showing the current state with respect to each of the commands. Then, a show status command would have little work to do and the person wanting the status could get it in detail.

From a practical standpoint, there should be some time limits set on how long a collaborator has to reply and how long the entire game may run. Also, a default assumption must be made if no reply is made by a collaborator who did receive notice of the item.

The dissenting collaborator response (#3 above) is actually a "comment on" command. ARC has plans to implement a DSS comments/backlinks system, and this should utilize it.

Comments on KIRK's WAC

Kirk--

I have read your draft on the Whole Arpanet Catalog more carefully. I feel it is nicely designed, but on the whole too specific for the purpose of this committee. It seems that the HELP-DOCUMENTATION committee would find your ideas more useful.

Your point of view is quite microscopic. The committee (INFORMAN) needs to come up with recommendations for information management (what is available, where, created and maintained by whom) for the entire network. Your WAC would be just one information source among many. To be more specific, let me just list a number of thoughts I had, in no relevant order:

1. It was my impresson that Craig's comments about a WAC implied a reference book of reference books--i.e. it would include a sort of Resource notebook, outlines to accessing databases at service sites, where online consulting could be obtained, who might be contracted to visit a site and give demonstrations, etc. Your WAC includes this, but tries to do so much more--i.e. it wants to includes all the other databases and allow links to bring the user to increasingly more complex and detailed level of knowledge. I think this is impractical.

You make no mention of where this WAC would be located. I think I detect an implication that it would be at the NIC or some other centrally-located information site. I agree that a site that calls itself a Network Information Center should have one of these available. But that already limits its use. A user with a question buried deep in a process on another computer is not going to log out his job to use a WAC. Then there is the reliability question: every time the NIC was unavailable the WAC would be unavailable. Duplicating the WAC on more than one site would be an exorbitant and unworthwhile expense.

3. Continuing the reliability question, if the WAC was unavailable online, why shouldn't there be hardcopy WACs for the user to drag around with him. Maybe a lightweight WAC, about the size and stock of the Whole Earth Catalog is what we really want anyway.

4. A WAC would have to be maintained (and created) by this information service site. Doing it all alone is unreasonable and will no doubt produce inaccuracies. So how should the help and cooperation of other people and sites be best employed? This is the kind of question the committee should be considering.

My point is that the WAC is but one element of a much larger

scheme. This group is trying to define that scheme; once that is done the details of a WAC will be very useful. I would like you to continue to think about the WAC for this committee, but from a macroscopic point of view. Where does it fit in with other information mechanisms? Which ones does it make obsolete; which are still essential? Who organizes such a thing; where would it be available? Should there be more than one variety of WAC? Should it be used for advertising only?

This note is being sent to the entire INFORMAN committee. If any other members have a different opinion, I would like very much to hear it, as would Kirk. This is not a one or two person job. Salut, Nancy



The following are a few comments on the preliminary version of the report and Alan's latest note.

I still feel that statement 7ale is still a little too strong. Although such a requirement is definitely desireable, I dont feel we can legislate such a policy, especially while nost large servers are getting only a small portion of their revenues from the network.

To get a little grimy for a mininute, start the statement at 7d2a with the word "Frequent". Even though it should be clear from the heading of the section, it should not be left to chance. (At my first reading, it threw me for a bit.)

With respect to a servers resposiblities toward damaged files, not only should a server not charge for the storage space but should also rebate to the user the money required to get the file from the state of the backed up version to the state before the damage was done to the file. This especially true where file system crashes are concerned. (If this seems harsh toward the server, I would like to note that UCSD has done this for us.)

Once a day for backing up disk files is usually all the load a system can bear and still perform a service to its users. However, it should be recognized that this is an absolute minimum. Twice a day is somewhat better like early evening after the peak period of the day and very late at night or early morning before the next peak begins.

We might elaborate in statement 7g3a2 just what we think a history file is. Admittedly we all know, but somehow in the context of that paragragh it seems vague to me.

Another Optional Service that might be mentioned is cooperation of the server with a user for scheduled demonstrations. There is nothing more frustrating or embarrassing to have a demo scheduled for a prospective user-funding source and find that your server is suddenly unavailable or wasnt planning on loading your data base and disk is short, etc.

I basically like Alan's suggestion of a rating system. I think that the ratings should be given in the context of particular brands of service. For example, Illiac might get a B⁺ for number crunching and E for interactive service, and a Tenex might get a B⁺ for interactive and a D for batch, etc. I think one overall grade for a system would be unfair and misleading. (Side comment to Dave: Alsberg's paper might be a good start in this direction,

especially after the class this semester. What do you think?) Also it might be best to only mention this type of rating as a project for the future. I dont think we have the time now to try to come up with any sort of data or guidelines. 2g

Nancy,

Thank you for your opinions in <21612,> concerning the WAC. It is exactly the sort of information I am looking for. As soon as some more feedback comes in, I will try to better generalize about what is needed and take a more macroscopic view. I feel my idea will differ from the hardcopy visions people have of the "Whole Earth Catalog", but I'm not sure how entrenched those visions are.

There is no intentional implication on my part that the WAC should be located on only one computer, let alone the NIC. I will try to elaborate on this later, but I think the highest levels would be duplicated on two or more computers. Not the entire catalog as that would be impossible since, as I envision it, it would extend deeply throughout all the servers on the network.

I don't understand what is impractical about including other databases and allowing links to bring you to increasingly more complex and detailed levels of knowledge if that is what you as a user wished to do.

A hard copy version would be nice for browsing when you did not have a terminal. However, if you are online, and yet online is not the media you use to locate something online, what's the use of being online?

If "book" must be the word to describe the WAC, then it is not of much interest to me. I think the concept of a Whole Arpanet Catalog can be a framework for the scheme that the Information Management Group is trying to define. I will attempt to deal more with the questions of "who", "where", and "how", but first I will need the opinions of other members about these things and at least a little positive feedback about "what". Here is a trial paragraph on the rating idea purposed by Alan, edit it at will.

Rating

A rating system should be developed so that users can know at a glance what to expect from a server. Since servers generally offer several types of service and usually can be considered to specialize in only one or two of them, we feel that a rating system that would give an individual rating for each type of service offered would be of the greatest usefulness. The definition of such a rating system should be done in coordination with the measurement of the various servers to better insure completeness and crediblity of the rating. The definition of the rating system and its application to the various servers is beyond the scope of this committee, and should be made a longer term project of USING either as a separate committee or as part of the Performance Measurement Laboratory committee, with a preliminary report to be given at the next USING meeting.

One other thought. It occurred to me that we have been considering up to this point a server as the "owner" of a computing resource. However, there are other types of servers in the offing. The ANTS group could be considered to be an example of a "server" that is not really providing any computational resources but services of another type. I believe that similar types of servers for various other network related commodities will develop in the future. Are there any peculiar requirements that apply to these servers as opposed to the more classic kind which we should address? Or should we just ignore it for the time being?
