Sue's visit here was most productive. We have been getting a lot of requests for further instruction. Some individuals who were previously somewhat hostile toward the system have mellowed considerably. Others who had previously only been introduced to it, now can perform real tasks. In general she was able to significantly increase the division's awareness of the system and its capabilities during her short stay. If we can maintain the momentum generated by her visit, we may have to face the additional slot question sooner than we had planned.

I'd like to feel that we are now "over the hump" of system acceptance. There apparently has to be a critical mass of system users and useful information in the system, before this can happen, with just a part of Mac's section actively using it, we had not reached the critical mass yet. The key (as it always has been) to real acceptance is management. If they believe it is a useful system, then moneys etc. will be forthcomming. I think Col Krutz has been very helpful in this respect. It is up to us (the more seasoned NLS users) now to make sure that division, branch and section secretaries continue (as a minimum) to log on, print messages and journal mail. The rest should follow as management starts to use it as a two way communication channel.

I think we should have a planned follow-up to the training and use started by Sue. I would like to see a couple of hours a week set aside for "continuing education". I'd like to see someone checking on the secretaries to make sure that they are logging on at least once a day. Maybe a report to management at confessions would be in order. Somehow we should let them know that we expect them to answer messages etc, that we send up. A little friendly persuasion is still in order.
