





Art and technology



ecently, I was invited to a seminar hosted by a distributor who wanted to educate customers about some new products. Distributors hold these events all the time, but this was an unusual invitation for me because the host,

Newmarket, Ont.-based Booth Photographic Ltd., was not a computer distributor, but a photographic products distributor.

Jeff Cowdrey, president of Booth, knew of my interest in digital photography, and invited me because one of the seminar sessions was devoted to fine-art inkjet papers and archival inks. Booth had set up a small area at the back of the seminar room, with various items on display. Amid the muslin backdrops and silver reflectors and other photographic gear was a selection of inkjet papers and inks from manufacturers I didn't recognize. But that was just the beginning of an afternoon of revelations.

The topics presented and the questions from the audience made it quite clear that a discussion of inkjet printers, inks and papers amongst photography enthusiasts is quite different from a discussion amongst computer users. The priorities and concerns are worlds apart.

For example, when TCP conducts printer reviews, we often judge a printer to be excellent because you can't tell its output from the prints you get back from the local photofinisher. For a serious photographer, however, this is merely the starting point for assessing the quality of inkjet prints.

Tonal range, colour accuracy and image permanence are the characteristics that serious photographers care about. And current inkjet technology does not score well on those dimensions-or at least not well enough to lure photographers away from traditional printmaking. When the seminar leader asked how many in the audience owned an inkjet printer, I was surprised that about 30 percent did not.

Interest is growing, however, and the seminar presented products that will make inkiet printing better able to meet photographers' needs. For example, lack of image permanence has been a major and longstanding concern with inkjet prints. Whereas the photographer thinks of print lifespan in terms of multiple years, the best that inkjet manufacturers have managed with their ink formulations is longevity measured in multiple months.

Companies like British ink developer Lyson Inc. have already established a good track record for longevity with one line of permanent inks, and the recently introduced line of inks under the Fotonic brand that are optimized for photographic images. While the claim is still being tested by independent labs, the Fotonic inks promise fade resistance comparable to traditional photographic prints.

Lyson has also introduced a Quad Black ink set (only for the Epson 3000 so far) which substitutes the cyan, magenta and yellow ink cartridges with three shades of black. This product addresses another limitation of inkjets in photographic printmaking: their inability to create black and white prints without introducing tinges of colour. The Quad Black ink set has been tested independently and has an estimated fade resistance of more than 100 years.

Printer manufacturers are not blind to these needs. Epson recently addressed image permanence with papers and inks for its new 870 series of printers. These have been rated to last up to 10 years for glossy and 16 years for matte finishes. And as you might infer from this rating it's not just the inks that are important-ink and paper interact to determine how long your image will last.

TCP has tested a variety of inkjet papers, and has reported differences between the various brands. But again, a serious photographer's demands are different than a computer users.' Not only do photographers want permanence,

they want variety in stock weights and surface finishes. Epson and Hewlett-Packard offer good selections of paper, but broader solutions are coming from outside the computer industry. For example, inkjet papers are available in grades and finishes that more closely match photo papers. Some manufacturers are offering stocks that are more like the papers used by artists for painting and sketching.

This is an interesting crossover, because inkjet photographic prints themselves have become a recognized art form. Referred to generically as giclee prints (from the French verb to spray), these are photographic or other digital art works that are printed on high-resolution commercial inkjet printers.

As inkjet technology improves, and as colour accuracy and image permanence limitations are overcome, fine art printmaking will be possible even on an inexpensive desktop printer. We're not there yet, but my, we are getting close.





Third the serviceable life of a large appliance can be 30 years or more. Are these interfaces going to last that long?

This is the scenario that I think would be more likely: your spouse complains the dishwasher and washing machine don't work. It looks like a sensor in your hot water tank is sending a false signal saying there isn't enough hot water. I hope you can bypass it so you have clean dishes for breakfast the next day. Will it even let you take a shower? You call a repairman to get it fixed. It turns out something is creating a lot of interference. At this point the repairman could pack up and leave, since his



Even so, this new technology does have some handy possibilities, like not having to reset every clock in the house every spring and fall, or (for those in the country) having your water pump stop before it sucks air, (when your well is low) and at the same time stopping the appliances that are drawing all the water.

People don't change their habits easily, and if taking advantage of a new technology means adding another step in putting the groceries away, it probably won't get used. If it means more money for trivial benefit, don't count on me buying it.

Video editing, take two

Your video editing lab report in the April edition of TCP was largely accurate, although I don't think it's relevant to rate FireWire cards by their throughput. FireWire video cards, by default, must transfer 3.6 Mbps for full DV video and audio.

The DV specification of 3.6 Mbps is easily handled by any modern computer system, even those that are several years old. It's not about your RAID array or how fast your hard drives are any more, the real bottleneck in DV editing is the speed of your system processor and how long you're willing to wait for your edited sequence to render.

The iMac comes with a 10 GB drive, as you mentioned, which is more than enough for basic iMovie editing. Nobody sits through a 30minute birthday video anyway. By having somewhat limited drive space, the movie maker is also forced to put the best footage into the computer, which is what editing should be. Even professionals review their tape and log the scenes they want to use before importing them into the computer. To do any long-form editing in iMovie is almost like shooting yourself in the foot. That's what Final Cut Pro is for, and of course, with a price tag that matches!

Waterlogged reporting

In the April issue of TCP, a "What's New" item discusses Xybernaut Corp's wearable computer powered by fuel cells that run on water. This is impossible. Fuel cells produce water, they do not run on it.

In order to run a fuel cell with water, an electric current would have to be used to split the water into hydrogen and oxygen, which would be reacted in a fuel cell to once again produce water and electricity. This is inefficient, and begs the question "If you had enough electricity to degrade the water, why didn't you just use it to power the computer directly?"

I don't doubt all the benefits claimed by using fuel cells. Hydrocarbon fuels do store a large amount of energy in a small space. Using a fuel cell to efficiently convert this energy to electricity will definitely run a portable/wearable computer for long periods of time.

(http://www.ofdm-forum.com), an alliance of highspeed wireless companies.

multiplexed together for high-speed wireless communications.

The companies behind the forum—which include CalTrans, Ericsson, Nokia, Philips Semiconductors, Samsung, Sony and Calgary-based Wi-LAN—have enlisted the support of Microsoft in their quest for a common set of standards for high-speed wireless communications.

The move towards a common global standard for high-speed wireless communications will, the companies say, make for economies of scale, as well as the ability to source suitable OFDM systems worldwide. The origins of the forum go back to December, 1999, when, at the invitation of Wi-LAN and Philips Semiconductor, 104 representatives from 60 firms from around the world met to discuss the idea of the alliance.

The reason for the need for a forum, Wi-LAN says, is that OFDM has become the foundation of the IEEE 802.11 and other wireless standards, meaning that the wireless world is now ready for products based on OFDM technology. Plans call for the OFDM Forum steering committee to act as the executive body of the organization.

Dr. Hatim Zaghloul, Wi-LAN's chairman, said that the interest in the creation of the forum was beyond both Wi-LAN's and Philips' expectations. "There is no doubt, with the representation of the companies shown here, the success in driving the market and technology focus of an OFDM technology standard is imminent," he said.

At Philips Semiconductors, meanwhile, Phil Pollok, the company's general manager of business line networking, said that forum will be an industry driving force for a multi-standard, high data rate physical layer technology. "The advantages of interoperability, co-existence and lower cost will be a major market enabler for wireless data systems of the future," he said.

Gates says anti-trust battle far from over

fter months of legal wrangling, the United States Department of Justice (http://www.usdoj.gov/) finally handed down its ruling in the Microsoft Corp. (http://www.microsoft.com) anti-trust trial: the software giant runs an unlawful monopoly.

"The court concludes that Microsoft maintained its monopoly power by anti-competitive means and attempted to monopolize the Web browser market," wrote U.S. District Court Judge

Thomas Penfield Jackson in his April 3 conclusion of law. "Microsoft also... unlawfully [tied] its Web browser to its operating system.'

For its part, Microsoft says the battle is far from over.

"Today's ruling was not unexpected, given

the court's earlier findings," said Bill Gates, Microsoft's chairman, in a statement. "But there are several steps in this case. While we did everything that we could to settle this case, and will continue to look for new opportunities to resolve it, we believe that we have a strong case on appeal."

Jackson's decision came only days after talks between Microsoft and its court adversaries, including the State of New York, broke down. The arbitrator in those discussions, Judge Richard A. Posner, said the warring parties could not come to an agreement, nor could he make them do so

"After more than four months, it is apparent that the disagreements among the parties concerning the likely course, outcome and consequences of continued litigation, as well as the implications and ramifications of alternative terms of settlement, are too deep-seated to be bridged," Posner wrote in an April 1 statement."

In his own statement from April 1, Gates seemed unhappy that the arbitration had ended.

"There were divisions and extreme views on the other side that brought us to the point where mediation wasn't going to be successful," he wrote. "And that's unfortunate, because it would have been in the best interest of consumers, the government and Microsoft if we'd been able to come up with something."

The question now is, what will the Justice Department do to Microsoft? Reports suggest the company will be divided three ways: one part software, one part Internet and one part operating systems. Some, however, say Microsoft would be even more powerful as three companies than it was as one

In a recent brief, Forrester Research, an industry analysis firm from Cambridge, Mass., said the Justice Department should create a "Windows Corporation" for Microsoft's operating systems. This will ensure that the company's most popular products-its consumer and business operating systems-do not subsidize its other, less popular products.

Forrester also recommends that the Justice Department creates legal standards for writing software.

"Today's Microsoft shareholders would, at minimum, receive shares in both a monopoly operating system company and a competitive applications company," the brief read. "Meanwhile, users would get stable platforms, standards, and competition, and the U.S. government wouldn't get into the software babysitting business."

Microsoft can take some consolation from these recent events. For example, in his statement, Posner said he wanted "to emphasize that the collapse of the mediation is not due to any lack of skill, flexibility, energy, determination, or professionalism on the part of the Department of Justice and Microsoft Corporation." Posner did not mention, however, the professionalism of Microsoft's other court adversaries, the 19 states siding with the Justice Department.

The arguments started late in 1998 after Microsoft's competitors complained the company wasn't playing fair by including its Internet Explorer browsing program with its operating systems, instead of selling it on the open market where it would face competition from other browsers like Netscape.

It is interesting the way shareware and commercial utility vendors are getting harder to differentiate. Most of the commercial utility vendors now offer 30- to 60-day free trial versions of their utility software on their Web sites. Inevitably we get asked if we could choose only one, which utility would we absolutely, positively have to have with for PC pump up work. For, Franz/Jack it's easy: he'd have List nestled away on every one of his emergency boot disks. For, Hans/Nathan, the choice is Partition Magic with List (as its only 26KB) snuck onto the same diskette.

t is frequently the utilities that attract new users to Unix in the first place. The tools are so rich in potential that entire books, such as Unix Power Tools (O'Reilly & Associates, ISBN: 1-56592-260-3, \$85.95), have been written about them.

Many of the key utilities that come with Linux were developed by the GNU Software Project, headed by Richard M. Stallman. Linux is so heavily dependent on and interwoven with GNU utilities that one Linux distribution, Debian, calls itself Debian GNU/Linux. The GNU utilities include everything from a directory lister to a C++ compiler. GNU utilities, most of which are based on older Unix utilities but rewritten from scratch, tend to be feature rich. They frequently improve on the originals.

Linux utilities come in two basic flavours: open source and commercial. Some commercial products, such as RealPlayer, are available for free, while others, such as the BRU tape backup software, are available for a fee. The majority of Linux utilities are free, opensource packages.

Traditional Unix utilities evolved in the command-line environment. Because of that, they can be joined together to form powerful shell scripts and cron jobs. Some of the newer, graphical utilities are designed to be clicked and pointed at in the X Window System. In this article we'll take a brief look at some of the more popular Linux utilities.

The toolkit mindset

When the entire OS is largely a collection of tools, it's difficult to find a starting place. Just about everything you do on a Linux system, from listing files (Is) to changing your password (passwd) is a utility. The results of one utility can be piped into the next in a chain to create a new, customized utility. For a simple example of this, let's assume you'd like to know how many files are in your /bin directory. To find out, you can simply pipe the output of is to the word count utility, we, using the "lines" flag (-1):

\$ Is -1 /bin I wc -I

Utilities the heart and soul of Linux

It's a piece of cake to take something like this and create a new utility shell script. Here's one I created to monitor the activity of a Linux mailhub. It checks the sendmail processing queue to see how many email messages have been deferred due to delivery problems. I called the script "mqueue" and placed it in /usr/local/bin for system-wide access. It's a one-liner:

\$ Is -1 /var/spool/mqueue/qf* | wc -I

At any time you can type mqueue on this system to find out how many potential "problem" messages are in the queue.

Taking the concept one step further, I created a shell script called "mailalert.sh" that checks the number of messages in the queue against a threshold number and sends the system administrator(s) an email saying that there might be something amiss. If the number crosses a certain threshold, it could be the result of a dropped link to the Internet or, worse, a spam-relay attempt by an outside party. Although the queued messages could also be the result of normal, heavy processing with a high incidence of undeliverable messages, it's something you, as system administrator, should know about:

(As an aside, you should always alias postmaster to a real user account or two on a production system so that a sysadmin will regularly receive mail about anything out of the ordinary with the system's mail agents.) The preceding shell script combines four basic utilities-ls, wc, date, mail-into one logical sequence. The next step is to put this into a scheduler to be run at specified times during the day.

This brings us to "cron," the traditional Unix scheduling daemon. Once you've created and tested a new utility script, you can schedule it to run at various times of day or night by scheduling it with the crontab utility. You invoke crontab as crontab -e for editing. A typical crontab entry looks like:

0 */4 * * * /usr/local/bin/mailalert.sh

This "cron job" entry can be translated as "run the mailalert shell script located in /usr/local/bin every four hours, on the hour, every day of the week, every day of the month, every month." For a full explanation of crontab entries, type man 5 crontab.

Nearly every Linux utility is accompanied by a man (manual) page for quick reference. To see all the possible options you can use with any given utility, consult the man pages (man ls or man wc for example). Your progress with Linux will bear a direct correlation to the amount of time you spend reading man pages.

This simple example—having the system monitor the status of the sendmail processing queue for deferred messages and sending alerts when appropriate-gives you a glimpse of the Unix toolkit mindset. When the tools and all the glue needed to join them together are at hand, you have unlimited, open-ended opportunities to create anything you need. Linux is the ultimate tinkerer's dream.

Finding things in files

Not everything has to be scripted, of course. You run many utilities from the command line to do one-off tasks and queries. Examples of such utilities would include the members of the grep family-grep, fgrep, and egrepwhich are used to find pattern matches in files.

For example, you may know that some of the HTML pages on your Web site contain references to Linus Torvalds but you can't remember all the relevant pages. If the pages are in a single directory, you can type:

\$ grep -il linus /home/httpd/html/opensource/*.html

This one-liner does a case-insensitive (-i)

search on "linus" through all the .html files in the directory /home/httpd/html/opensource. The -I flag asks grep to print a list of all the filenames that contain matches. Without the 4 flag, grep would display every matching line in every matching file, which can also be highly

Want to email this list to your Web master? You can do it all at one time from the command line:

\$ grep -il linus /home/httpd/html/opensource/*.html | \ > mail -s "The Linus Torvalds files" webmaster

Grep is frequently used to search for patterns in log files. It provides a quick way to find that needle in the haystack. For example, one of your users may complain that a message he or she sent to a colleague in Arizona was never sent (implying, of course, that your server is at fault). You can grep the system mail logs under the recipient's email address to see if the outside system accepted the mail or not. If the reply "User unknown" is in the logs as part of the status of the message, it's a sure bet that your user has mistyped the address. Convincing the user that this might be the case is a little easier when you can provide the evi-

Although the grep default is to display the line that contains the match, it is often useful to have some context for that line, such as the line preceding and the line following the matching line. GNU grep, which Linux systems offer, provides contextual grep by either using the -C context flag, which provides two lines before and after, or by specifying the number of context lines you want. Here's an example of looking through the mail log on a Debian GNU/Linux system with one line of context before and after the matching line:

\$ grep -1 gwilburn /var/log/mail.log Mar 12 11:43:34 debian sendmail[513]: LAA00513: from=root_size=50

class=0, pri=30050, nrcpts=1,

msgid=<200003121643.LAA00513@debian.wilburn.all

relay=root@localhost

Mar 12 11:43:34 debian sendmail[513]: LAA00513: to=gwilburn@home.com.

delay=00:00:00, mailer=local, stat=queued Mar 12 12:29:14 debian sendmail[545]: alias database /etc/aliases.db out of date

Contextual grep is particularly useful when inspecting documents or source files.

Quite often it's desirable to grep right down through an entire directory tree. The traditional way to do this is by combining grep with another utility called find. Find is a powerful, complex tool that can traverse directory trees.

Out of curiosity, I used find and grep to query the number of references to Linus Torvalds in the /usr/doc directory of a Red Hat 5.2 system:

find /usr/doc -type f | xargs grep -i torvalds | wc -l

The state of your system

Two Linux utilities you will find invaluable are df and du. The df utility summarizes free disk space. By default it lists sizes in blocks, which can vary from system to system (see Example 1 in table).

This display is the default on most Unix systems. GNU df, however, offers the excellent -h flag, meaning "human-readable", that produces a more graspable result (see Example 2 in table).

The du (disk usage) utility offers more granularity. It can traverse a directory tree or subtree to determine how much space is being used. It can take the measure of an individual user or the extent of your corporate Web site.

The du default provides a directory by directory summary, with a grand total summary at the end. It, too, can be invoked by using the -h flag for improved readability. On my Debian GNU/Linux portable, for instance (an elderly IBM ThinkPad), the /usr/doc directory occupies about 20 MB of disk space. Using another useful utility, tail, here are the last 10 lines of its readout, including the summary:

\$ du -h /usr/doc | tail

20K /usr/doc/sgml-tools/html

202K /usr/doc/sgml-tools

137K /usr/doc/psqml

9.3K /usr/doc/netscape-base-407

1.0K /usr/doc/netscape-base-4/doc

10K /usr/doc/netscape-base-4

9.3K /usr/doc/netscape-base-45

1.8K /usr/doc/plugger

2.5K /usr/doc/motifnls

20M /usr/doc

With the summary flag, -s, I can get a snapshot of my personal disk usage:

\$ du -hs /home/genew 867K /home/genew

It's easy to see that with less than 1 MB, this is a new setup. It'll begin to fill up in no time.

Another good state-of-the-system utility is free. Free gives you a snapshot of memory usage, including virtual memory, or swap space (see Example 3 in table).

Another essential system utility is top. Top shows you the top processes running on your system. It can be highly useful for identifying memory hogs or a runaway process. When you type top you see a display similar to Example 4 (see table).

Backup and compression utilities

One of the most ubiquitous Unix utilities is tar, short for tape archiving. Tar is used to create tar files and tar backup tapes. On a file level, tar works in a manner somewhat similar to the Windows ZIP programs, except that, by default, tar does not compress files. The most widely used compression utility is gzip (GNU zip), which is unrelated to DOS ZIP.

By default tar recurses subdirectories, making it a good utility to use when moving large sets of directory structures with subdirectories and files from one place to another. If you have a SCSI tape drive attached to your Linux system, you can tar your whole system to tape with the following command:

tar cvf /dev/st0 /

Restoring everything from the same tape would require:

cd / # tar xvf /dev/st0

There is usually a bit more to backup than this, however. There are certain directories you should exclude (/dev and /proc, for instance). The tar man pages will help you with the finer details.

Tar is also used extensively as a way to transfer Unix and Linux programs. When you go to a site to get source files, you generally get a compressed tar file, which you reconstitute to a directory on your local system. These files are frequently referred to as tarballs.

A tar file is often compressed with GNU zip and ends in the extension .tgz or .tar.gz. You can uncompress the file, then extract the tar files, or do it all in one:

gunzip myarchive.tar.gz # tar cvf myarchive.tar

or simply

tar cvfz myarchive.tar.gz

If you obtain a file with the extension .Z, as in myarchive.tar.Z, it has usually been compressed with an older Unix utility called compress. To uncompress it, you type:

uncompress myarchive.tar.Z

Other compressors include the more aggres-

sive bzip2, which makes smaller files, and zip/unzip, utilities that can create or open DOS ZIP files.

Tar is by no means the only way to backup your Linux system. Most veteran system administrators prefer dump and restore over tar for whole system backups. Others use a more complex program called cpio, which includes better error detection. Dump, restore and cpio are usually installed by default on Linux systems.

For backing up several servers across your network to a single tape device, many administrators turn to amanda, an open-source product from MIT that is available for all Linux distributions

Backup is one area where commercial utilities have made some headway into the Linux world. Two of the popular backup programs are BRU (Backup and Restore Utility) from Enhanced Software Technologies (http://www.bru.com) and Knox Software's Arkeia backup software (http://www.arkeia.com). Specially licensed home versions of these are sometimes included in Linux distributions or are can be downloaded for personal use. Both products offer robust error checking, tape management, GUI interface, and multi-server backup across the network.

Other noteworthy utilities

Unfortunately there are so many excellent utilities available for Linux that this survey barely scratches the surface. Is Perl a utility or a programming language? Perl scripts are easy to incorporate inside shell scripts. Two of the classic and powerful Unix utilities, awk and sed, are studies unto themselves. Awk can parse fields out of text files and sed, the Unix stream editor, can be used in search and replace scripts on text files such as HTML pages.

There are several programs available for synchronizing your system's time with public time standards. Of these, rdate is the simplest

Want to see a file in hexadecimal? Use hexdump or the octal dump utility od with the -h hex flag. Need version control over a set of files? Visit rcs, revision control system, for a very sophisticated utility that is free on Linux (and costs upwards of \$500 for Windows sys-

Need to compare the differences between two files? Meet diff. Want to filter your incoming email into various mailboxes and filter out email from certain parties? Just study procmail. Need to set up an email vacation notice while you're holidaying in Fiji? Use vacation.

Everyone needs security. Replace telnet with ssh. Need to download files from the Net but don't like all the banner ads? Lynx, the champion character-based Web browser to the res-

If you're exchanging floppies with the DOS world, you'll love the mtools. Programs like mcopy, mdir, mdel make exchanging data on floppies very easy.

And then there's probably my personal favourite utility: screen. It allows me to have several virtual terminal sessions on a single connect. Perfect for the command-line junkie.

We haven't even touched on sound utilities, CD rippers, and graphical wonders such as The GIMP. It's all there. You can spend the better part of a lifetime just discovering all the useful utilities for Unix/Linux. One way to

keep up with new offerings is to subscribe to the comp.os.linux.announce newsgroup.

And don't forget more and less, the essential Linux page viewers. Well, that's more or less all the space we have for grok'ing Linux utilities (to the best of my knowledge, Linux does not have a utility named grok). Happy greping.

espite frequent updates and advances to operating system software, somebody always manages to figure out a way to extend, enhance or generally make your computing experience more enjoyable. These additions or enhancements are known as utilities. According to the Oxford Dictionary, a utility is defined as "a useful thing." On the Mac, a utility can be as rudimentary as a software control panel or extension, all the way up to full-blown specialized applications.

Pricing varies as widely as the choice of utilities. The programs reviewed here are either freeware, shareware, or commercial, and can therefore range from free to a few hundred

Maintenance utilities

Like any machine, computers aren't failsafe. Under certain conditions the data stored on your drive can become corrupted, robbing you of your information and sometimes rendering your machine unusable.

Disk maintenance utilities are not intended as a substitute for regular backup procedures. Their primary purpose should be to perform preventative maintenance of your storage mediums, and they should only be used to recover data as a last resort.

The more sophisticated Volume Recover module is intended to be used in dire situations in which Disk Doctor fails to repair damage, and you need to attempt to salvage your data. Although some of its functions are automated, it has some powerful custom controls that are better left to experts who better understand them. Some of the other modules include Speed Disk for disk optimization, and UnErase for recovering files after emptying the trash.

Long considered the preeminent disk repair

tool, Symantec has recently been slow to offer updates that address changes in Apple system software. This has left the door open for smaller, more aggressive and nimble competitors like MicroMat and Alsoft



Waking up to denial of service attacks

The reason behind the recent denial of service attacks on some of the Web's most popular sites still remains a mystery.

In February, Yahoo!, Buy.com, eBay, E*Trade, Amazon.com, ZDNet and CNN.com were hit by a distributed denial of service (DDoS) attack, a coordinated effort involving several computers around the U.S. and possibly within Canada that flooded the sites with bogus information requests. Anyone wanting to get to these sites was effectively shut out as they stalled due to the information overload.

While there has been much speculation around possible motives, law enforcement officials both in the U.S. and Canada have been tight lipped about the direction of their investigations.

Sifting clues

Steve Berry, supervisory special agent with the FBI in Washington, D.C., would only say the investigation into the recent attacks was ongoing. He was also reluctant to talk about the work the FBI has been doing with the RCMP in order to investigate a possible Canadian link to the attacks.

"The only thing we are confirming with regard to the RCMP is that we had discussions with them,"

Berry adds. "We are not giving details of what the discussion entails or what the outcome of the discussion was."

The RCMP's Technological Security Branch in Ottawa—which investigates computer-based crimes—would not comment on its joint efforts with the FBI.

While denial of service (DoS) attacks are nothing new, what surprised many about the February attack was its scale and coordination. Most DoS attacks involve a single computer or server sending bogus information requests to another in an effort to overload it. What made these attacks different is that several Web sites were attacked at once and a number of computers in

different locations were recruited to launch it.

John Alsop, president and chief executive officer of
BorderWare Technologies Inc. in Mississauga, Ont., says the

attack was so effective because of the general lack of security around the many networks and individual computers hooked up to the Internet. This made it easy for someone to get to an unsecured machine and install the necessary programs that would later seize the machine and

DoS vulnerability hits home

When someone decides to launch a denial of service (DoS) attack, they rarely do it directly for a very simple reason: a direct attack is too easy for network managers and law enforcement officials to detect and track back to the person who launched it.

"One of the reasons the FBI is having problems tracking down the DoS hackers is that they did not go to one system and tell that system to attack Yahoo," says Greg Gilliom, chief executive officer of Network Ice Corp. (http://www.networkice.com) in San Mateo, Calif. "They bounced through three or four systems and used the fourth to tell the machines to attack Yahoo. If you are a good hacker, you would never start an attack from your own system. You would be caught."

Gilliom suspects that on average a home system that is regularly connected to the Internet is scanned by hackers at least once a week.

Instead, what hackers look for are unsecured, vulnerable systems that can be used to reach other systems. For the longest time, university computer systems were a favourite target because they were largely open to all computer users. In the distributed denial of service (DDoS) attacks that made news headlines in February, several university systems were found to have been hacked into, then used to coordinate the attacks.

Because of this, universities are now beginning to shut down the security holes hackers have used to get into their systems. But as universities begin making their systems more secure, hackers are shifting their focus to home systems as a platform from which to launch their attacks. The home systems most attractive to hackers are those using cable modems or DSL connections to the Internet.

Framingham, Mass.-based International Data Corp. (IDC) predicts there will be some 327 million users worldwide hooking onto the Internet by 2003. Forrester Research Inc., which is based in Cambridge, Mass., expects to see nearly 15 million cable modem or DSL connections in the U.S. by 2002.

Gilliom says home systems using cable or DSL modems are appealing to hackers because they are always connected to the Internet.

While there are no firm statistics on how

Internet sharing in Windows 98 SE



indows 98 SE (Second Edition) is a minor upgrade from Windows 98. It contains bug fixes, some new drivers and minor new features, Internet Explorer 5.0, and one major feature that isn't available as a free download: Internet

Connection Sharing (ICS).

ICS is a very easy way of sharing a single Internet connection and account with your network of users. However, judging from conversations I have had, and newsgroup postings I have read, implementing ICS is not without challenges. Following are some details about how to get through some of the trickier parts of installation and configuration.

ICS requires Windows 98 SE be installed on one computer only—the one you use to connect to your Internet service provider (ISP). The client computers can be running different versions of Windows. If you are using Sympatico HSE (High Speed Edition), don't bother since it isn't compatible. A regular Sympatico account—and any other dial-up account—will work. I used a Netcom Canada account and a 56Kbps modem for my testing. I should point out that ICS is also part of Windows 2000 Professional, but my description is based on Windows 98 SE.

The ICS feature is not part of a default installation of Windows 98 SE. If it isn't installed on your computer, you will need to install it before you can begin. Go to the Control Panel, Add/Remove Programs, click on Windows Setup, then pick Internet Tools. Select Internet Connection Sharing and, if prompted, supply the Windows 98 SE CD-ROM. The ICS files are on the disc, but so many computers have the entire contents of the Windows CD-ROM in a subdirectory that it's often not needed.

Once you reboot, as prompted, a Wizard starts. There is a very good chance that the

Wizard will succeed in setting up your computer if your LAN and dial-up networking connection are in good order. You should also have TCP/IP installed and bound to your Ethernet card. The Wizard only needs to run on the computer that connects to your ISP. It is often called a gateway (even if it's an HP or Company)

You should have a blank diskette handy. The Wizard will prompt you for it, and will write two files to it. You will use this diskette to configure the other computers on your LAN to use ICS. The two files are very small, so the disk is ready in a few seconds. Remove the diskette and restart the computer. When you log in again you won't see the Wizard—and unless you've read a manual or a readme file, you won't know what to do next. One of the files on the diskette is the readme file you need (it would be helpful if the Wizard did a better job of guiding the user).

If you go to Network in the Control Panel, you will see that the Wizard did more than just Continued on page 40



many home systems have been hacked, Gilliom suspects that on average a home system that is regularly connected to the Internet is scanned by hackers at least once a week. Hackers are looking for vulnerabilities that they can exploit.

Using such programs as Back Orifice or Sub7, hackers look for weaknesses that they can use to download Trojan programs onto a system. The program will then take over the system and make it a platform to reach another vulnerable system or to launch an attack against a Web site. Many times, people don't even know their system has been taken over until the police show up with a

warrant to confiscate the computer.

To combat home system hacking, Network Ice released Blackice Defender, a program that acts as a personal firewall. It continually monitors a computer's connection to the Internet to detect whether someone is trying to gain access. If it detects someone trying to get to the computer, it will automatically block access and try to track where the hacker is.

Chris Monnette, Canadian general manager for Symantec Corp. (http://www.symantec.ca) in Toronto, says even users with standard dial-up Internet connections are vulnerable to hackers. Recently, Symantec released Norton Internet Security 2000, a software suite that filters a computer's inbound and outbound information.

"I don't have broadband at home and I was downloading a fairly sizable file," Monnette says. "I have Norton Internet Security [on my home system) and when I came back from doing something else I noticed that there were at least two attempts of someone trying to hack into my computer and [they] were blocked."

Gregor Fruend, president of the San Francisco, Calif.-based Zone Labs Inc. (http://www.zonelabs.com) suspects that in the next little while more home systems will be hacked into and used as platforms to launch attacks, especially as many hacking programs are now being ported to Windows.

"We think this will become a huge concern as institutions and universities begin shutting down the vulnerabilities of their computers," adds Fruend. "The next logical venue for a DDoS attack would be from home computers. If you sit on a cable modern, you have a 10 Mbps pipeline that can be used in these kinds of attacks."

Like Network Ice and Symantec, Zone Labs also offers computer users a personal security utility. ZoneAlarm 2.0 monitors a user's connection and system and issues a warning when an application or program tries to access the Internet. A user can specify which programs and applications they want connecting to the Internet and blocking others. ZoneAlarm also works by making the system invisible to the network thereby making it harder to be scanned or hacked into.

use it as a platform to attack a Web site.

"What happened is that a lot of smaller companies have their computers on the Internet thinking no one will target them," Alsop adds. "But the reality is that hackers have automated tools which can scan large blocks of Internet addresses and will find unprotected and vulnerable systems, and break in without you knowing about it. That system will then be used as a platform for an attack."

One puzzling aspect of this DDoS attack is the lack of bragging from those responsible after the fact. Most attacks or hacking incidents are often followed by a floods of people in hacking chat rooms and sites claiming credit.

For a short time, it was suggested that someone going by the moniker Mafiaboy was a suspect. Now speculation has shifted to someone called Coolio. Recent media reports in the U.S. have law enforcement officials investigating a New Hampshire teen, who they suspect may be Coolio. However, there is some suspicion that this teen may not be the Coolio associated with the February DDoS attack, but may indeed be another Coolio who has been linked to earlier, less damaging attacks on other Web sites. There are also questions as to whether more than one individual was involved in the attacks.

"Our investigation is continuing and we have made some progress with a number of leads that have taken us in several directions," added a spokesman for the FBI in Washington, D.C. when contacted by *The Computer Paper*. "But until someone has been charged with anything we would not comment further."

Was it political?

The silence from law enforcement officials has not stopped people from speculating on motives for the attacks. There has been suggestion that the attacks were a form of protest against the rapidly growing commercialization of the Internet—a coordinated form of culture jamming or hacktivism aimed squarely at those most interested in commercializing the Internet for their own gain.

It was only a few years ago that the Internet was being heralded as a tool for creating a more egalitarian and democratic society. It would liberate people by giving them instant access to information and break down such pesky barriers as national borders and government controls. Now, some say, the Internet is nothing but a place to buy left-handed bottle-cap openers, and the only liberating thing about it is how quickly you can file an IPO for an Internet startup company.

The culture-jamming scenario has been given greater credence in some quarters because it followed on the heels of the protests against the World Trade Organization in Seattle, Wash. in late November. A distinguishing feature of the WTO protests was how effectively many groups involved used the Internet not only to organize the protests but to focus

discussion on how big business is exerting more control over the world's economies and the Internet.

"After the WTO, I had the feeling that there are a lot of culture jammers out there who don't like the way the Net is evolving, which is [into] just another marketing tool for corporations," says Kalle Lasn, editor of the Vancouverbased Adbusters magazine. "It was only a short while ago that when the first ad appeared in cyberspace, the argument was whether there should be ads at all in cyberspace. Now, you go just about anywhere on the Net and it's flashing with ads."

Naomi Klein, author of No Logo and a critic of the commercialization of the Internet, says if the February DDoS attack was a kind of culture jamming, there was a certain elegance about it. The attack turned the tables on the sites by flooding them with the kinds of information requests the companies ask people to send to them all the time.

"It is sort of like jujitsuing them," Klein adds, "They are bombarding us with messages every day and we are now bombarding them with messages."

Others, however, don't see the attacks as either elegant or as a form of protest. They say the attacks were poorly conceived and too plainly obvious. Among older hackers, the attacks smack of someone young and inexperienced, looking to make a name for themselves. They don't believe any larger social statement was being made.

"I don't think the person or persons are following any kind of ideology," says Ken Chase, vice-president of operations at Velocet Communications Inc. in Toronto. "If someone was culture jamming, they would be more mature and they would take up a much more subtle, insidious and effective anonymous attack. We would still not know what happened."

Klein disagrees and argues that what bothers older hackers is the possibility of there being a larger social message behind the attacks. For older hackers, what mattered was the elegance of the code and how swiftly they could get into a system. There was no social message behind what they were doing, except to show off their programming and hacking prowess.

"These are not high-tech hacks because the point is not to show off your technical ability, but to make a political point," Klein says. "That confounds the old school hackers whose point is to show off how skilled they are and to later market that skill. Hacking is like an extreme job application."

Still others wonder what all the fuss is about. David Jones, a professor of computer science at McMaster University and president of Electronic Frontier Canada in Hamilton, Ont., says the attacks were not as disruptive as many in the news and government organizations have suggested. There are days when a Web site gets so overloaded with regular requests that people are shut out until things die down, he says. It may cause a few to grumble in despair, but life goes on nonetheless.

"It is also important to recognize that the denial of service attacks were detected and put to an end within a few hours," Jones adds. "So rather than thinking of this as a catastrophic problem, the site reacted very quickly. Last year, there was a fire in a downtown Toronto Bell building and a lot of the Internet in Canada was offline for much of the day. That was a greater catastrophe than what hit eBay."

And Jones is skeptical of the claims being made by some that the stock values of these companies were harmed because of the attack. On any given day, any one of those company's stock can go up and down on the exchange and for reasons that have nothing to do with the attacks.

"The prices continue to be where they were before and there was no stock crash," Jones adds. "It seems people who hold these stocks believe these attacks don't really matter. There is nothing true today that was not true last month for both the Internet and e-commerce."

Liability issues

One of the interesting questions raised by these recent attacks against some of the Web's major e-commerce sites is what legal remedies a company has to protect itself.

Michael Geist, a law professor at the University of Ottawa, and a specialist in the Internet and e-commerce, says Canadian federal law has provisions built into it that would most likely apply to the kinds of attacks launched against Yahoo!, eBay and the others.

Currently, the Criminal Code has antihacking laws that deal with the fraudulent use of computer services, in some cases imposing maximum terms of up to 10 years imprisonment for perpetrators. These laws could be applied to hackers who broke into systems in order to launch attacks against another site which is the first step in a DoS attack.

The more interesting question for Geist is whether the owner of the system that was taken over and used in the attack is liable for the attack.

"The emerging consensus on that issue is that there would be the potential for such an action, provided that the party that facilitated the attack was negligent in allowing the attack to occur," Geist adds. "The standard is much the same that we see in any tort action where the question is has someone not provided sufficient duty of care to anyone they have a contract with or otherwise."

Currently, Geist is unaware of any Canadian companies that have been taken to court because their systems were hacked into and used to attack another Web site.

"We are really at the cusp of this sort of activity and I don't know of anyone who's been sued for conducting denial of service attacks or facilitating them," he continues. "My own view would be that there are not sufficiently accepted standards or precautions that ought to be taken that a court could cite as a reasonable set of protections."

Geist suggests that online sites also look into hacking insurance as a way of giving themselves another level of protection.

David Griffiths, senior vice-president and head of the financial services group with Toronto-based Aon Reed Stenhouse Inc. says hacking insurance has been around for some time. Lloyds of London has offered hacking insurance since the mid-1980s and there are some nine companies around the world offering hacking coverage of various kinds.

Griffiths says such hacking insurance covers a wide range of liability, privacy, intellectual property and exposure issues along with thirdparty coverage for attacks from the outside.

He also believes it would be very hard for someone to sue for possible losses suffered because a site was hit by a DoS attack because many sites offer other traditional means of doing business that exist alongside their Web initiatives. An investor, for example, could still use a phone to buy or sell stocks if their broker's Web site goes down. Many Web sites offer businesses and their clients more convenience, but they have not replaced more traditional means of conducting business.

Sites that only offer a Web-based means of doing business may be more vulnerable to lawsuits as they do not offer alternatives if problems occur.



write two files to a diskette. You'll see that ICS, along with several other components, have been added.

The gateway computer does more than just share its connection: it acts as a DHCP host, providing an automatic, private IP address as well as name resolution service to client computers on the LAN.

Take the diskette over to the first computer you want to configure. The only file other than the readme.txt file is called icsclset.exe (I would guess that the name is derived from ICS Client Setup). This is a tiny 84KB application, which you double-click after first checking that the gateway computer is connected to the network and also to the Internet. In a few seconds, you can select the option to connect to the Internet through your gateway over the LAN.

Then the browser-in my case Internet Explorer 5.0-will appear. Microsoft says Internet Explorer 3.x/ Netscape Navigator 3.x or later will also work. I think most other browsers, such as Opera, will work too, but I wasn't able to test this.

I groaned when the browser came up with the MSN home page by default, since I don't like that kind of intrusiveness. However, my groans were quickly quieted by the speed of my connection. I know from experience what to expect from a 56Kbps modem, and this was much faster. When I saw download speeds in excess of 100Kbps, which is about 15 times faster than I would expect, I realized that I was connecting to the Internet via my proxy server (running on a Linux computer connected to the Internet with a cable modem).

The reason why this happened is simple and instructive. As Microsoft points out in the readme file, this version of the ICS Wizard configures the browser, but doesn't install or configure the TCP/IP protocol for Ethernet adapters. I had TCP/IP installed, but with a fixed IP address and other choices that aren't what ICS needs. I selected Obtain An IP Address Automatically, and Use DHCP For WINS Resolution, I also disabled DNS and removed the IP address of my proxy server from the installed gateways

Once I had made these changes and rebooted, everything went smoothly, with one small exception. The client computer receives bandwidth on demand. Simply loading the Web browser is enough. If the gateway computer is connected, there is instant bandwidth. If it isn't, a dial-up networking session is initiated. Unfortunately, the connection doesn't occur fast enough to avoid an error message on the browser. The best solution I found is to choose a blank page as the default

Setting up connection sharing with ICS is as easy as with any competing product I have tried. If your needs are straightforward, there will be no further issues. However, there are programs, such as online games, that need to connect to particular ports. That's where it can become messy. Microsoft addresses this issue in a Knowledgebase article, which shows how to build an INF file to solve this problem. Microsoft carefully points out, though, that it doesn't support this technique.

With the release of Mac OS 8.1, Apple began to give users the option of formatting their disks as either Mac OS Standard (HFS) or Mac OS Extended (HFS+). The extended format increases disk storage capacity efficiency by making disk allocation block sizes smaller. Normally, one would have to backup data to another device, reformat and reinitialize the hard drive, then move data back to the extended format drive. PlusMaker lets you do this conversion quickly and painlessly while leaving your data stored on your drive. To see whether your disk is formatted as standard or extended format, select the drive and use the Get Info command.

Anti-virus utilities

Viruses in the Macintosh world are rare occurrences. However, if you frequently share files through discs and the Web, you may want to consider one of the following utilities.

It's important to remember keep this software up to date so it can recognize the latest viruses. Next to disk maintenance tools, antivirus tools are probably the most popular type of utilities.

Extensions patch themselves onto the system software's core to add functionality. Many devices and software you install on a Mac use this extension mechanism in order to offer specific features.

Unfortunately, extensions can be both a blessing and a curse. The more devices and software you install, the greater the chance that a conflict between extensions will occur. The Mac OS's bundled Extension Manager allows you to enable or disable extensions to avoid conflicts, but it is up to you to figure out through trial and error which one is the cul-

Conflict Catcher extends the Extension Manager's capabilities by offering features like automatic extension conflict detection, merging of your old system folder with a clean installation, and many other useful tools.

In Mac OS X, extensions will no longer patch themselves directly onto the OS, so it will be interesting to see whether extension managers will have a role in the future or not.







Familiar with an application called Napster in the Windows world? Macster is the equivalent utility that searches the Web for your favourite MP3 files. The latest release allows you to save downloaded MP3 files with the QuickTime creator and type codes, so you can open them up directly in QuickTime Player.

Bottom line

We've barely managed to scratch the surface of the utilities available for the Macintosh. There are literally dozens of other commercial, shareware or freeware packages that can be hunted down on the Web. I've just covered some of the more popular ones and others that I use on a regular basis.

It's worth noting that anti-virus software and many of the software extras in Norton Utilities (such as Filesaver, Disklight etc.) will add considerable complexity to your system, and may compromise stability of your system. You'll have to weigh these stability issues against the benefit of the feature offered to decide if they're really worth using.

Fixes for five common PC problems

IT troubleshooter offers time-tested solutions

By Al Buchanan

ow many times a week does your system lock up or produce an error message? Do you find yourself waiting for your system to load applications or open Web sites? You are not alone. These are the most common problems—among a few others—I have dealt with over the past five or six years.

With all of the technological advances in the last decade, you would expect the personal computer to be more refined and a whole lot more stable. Not so. In this same period, operating systems have become infinitely more complex, and PC processor speeds have started to push the 1 GHz (gigahertz) envelope.

Think about it this way: Imagine you're walking along at a leisurely pace down a forest path and you trip over a tree root. You skin your palms or bump your knee when you fall, but you get right back up and carry on down the path. You are a 33 MHz 486 DX system running DOS 6.22 and Windows 3.1. Now imagine you are sprinting down the same path wearing a 90 kg backpack, juggling five raw eggs and trying to keep an eye on the path 25 m ahead. Suddenly, you trip over another tree root. This time you can't get up so quickly, the eggs are done for, and you might even have broken a bone or two. You are a 700 MHz Pentium III running Windows 98 SE.

People are demanding faster and faster PCs, but operating system developers are falling further and further behind. Consequently, companies are releasing new and revised products before they are ready, and the consumer is left to sort out the bugs.

Here are some tips to help make your PC more productive and your time computing less of a headache.

Unstable OS

To keep your operating system stable, I always suggest people keep abreast of product updates. This is a very simple exercise. Microsoft maintains a Web site where all of the latest patches for its currently supported products can be found.

Point your Web browser to http://windowsup date.microsoft.com (clicking on the Windows Update icon in your Start menu will also take you to this site.). On the left of the update page, you will find a link to Product Updates. Click on this and a small Java applet will run, checking your system for the latest revisions of particular files. The site then builds a list of

available updates specific to your system.

Pay close attention to the Critical Updates section. Check off any of the updates and follow the instructions. The patches in the Critical and Recommended sections will help stabilize and secure your platform.

There is also a link on this page that leads to the Office 2000 update page. If Word or Excel are acting up on your PC, try the patches available at http://officeupdate.microsoft.com. If you are having trouble with graphics files or frame rates, download the Microsoft upgrade to DirectX 7a.

Data corruption

Excel won't open a spreadsheet? Word complains about invalid end of file? Your data is scrambled? Most of these problems are caused by General Protection Faults (errors) or system freezes because the files were not closed properly by the application. This can result in the loss of hours of work.

A product called Office Recovery may be able to help. Point your Web browser to http://www.officerecovery.com and select the type of file you need to recover. Office Recovery offers free trial versions of this software (which offer limited recovery capability). Currently, they can perform recovery on Excel Spreadsheets, Word documents and PowerPoint presentations. Recovery capabilities for Access databases, Outlook files and Exchange files are under development. Office Recovery software has been a ZD Editor's Pick in the past.

Viruses and Trojan infection

By far the most prevalent and intrusive problem that has evolved from the use of the Internet is the spread of virus code and trojan applications. Re-mailer viruses like Happy99, remote-control Trojan viruses like Back Orifice, or system killer viruses like Chernobyl can all infiltrate your system and do anything from sending themselves to everyone on your email address list to overwriting your system

Athletic Athlons hit 300 on benchmark

By Sean Carruthers

MD recently made headlines when it announced the first desktop processor to break the 1 GHz (gigahertz) barrier. While it's certainly a noteworthy milestone, it left people puzzled for a couple of reasons. First, wasn't the 800 MHz Athlon just released? Second, will the typical desktop user need anywhere near this much processor power?

In fact, the 800 MHz Athlon chips are only now starting to appear in desktop systems—systems that are definitely being aimed at power users. Anyone involved with high-end multimedia work will find the power boost extremely useful, as will dedicated gamers. Because they are still so new, however, you have to be willing to open up the wallet to play with these speed demons.

We had a chance to look at three new machines using the 800 MHz Athlon processor. Overall, these are among the fastest systems we've tested, with two of the three either touching or exceeding 300 on our Sysmark98 test—the first machines to do so.

Monsoon sound anything but flat

In 1965, Intel co-founder Gordon Moore predicted processor capacity would double every 18 to 24 months. In the 35 years to follow, his observation, Moore's Law, has been bent and tweaked to describe the shrinking size, increasing capacity, plunging prices, and skyrocketing power of just about every element of computing. The dynamic, first applied to PC components, then the PC itself, has extended to peripherals such as monitors, printers, scanners, and speakers. In recent years PC speakers have become increasingly compact and powerful, and with the Monsoon speakers, flatter than ever before.

Helio: middle ground or leading edge?

Tech's Helio handheld combines software that is about as compact and efficient as the Palm OS with hardware that has the form factor of a Windows CE palm-size device. The VTech unit uses the same Philips chip set that Philips uses in its own Nino 510 colour Windows CE handhelds. But by incorporating the best characteristics of two established platforms—Palm and Windows CE—is Helio a leader or a follower? Considering the price of this unit, the quality of hardware and software, and the early indications of VTech's good attitude towards customers and developers, I'd put them closer to the lead. Although testing of the Helio was not completed, it is certainly the most promising newcomer in the pocket computer market.



The Helio is currently the smallest handheld computer using standard AAA batteries. Though the device is compact, VTech has chosen a soft padded case over a hard plastic flip-lid, which adds some bulk.

Think back to the last time you upgraded your hard drive. Try to remember how happy you felt buying it, how large it seemed, and how much room you thought you'd have for all your stuff. Now think about that same hard drive and about how much room you have left. Still happy?

A lot of users have gone through this storage boom and bust: what seems exceptionally spacious now will seem paltry in no time. Software manufacturers haven't been much help when it comes to hard drive space, either. Every time you turn around, they

release newer versions of programs that are much larger, containing improved graphics, sound, and more features. Most of the time we welcome the added functionality, but silently curse our disappearing hard drive space.

The options

When you run out of space, there isn't a single easy solution. If you're a heavy user, and plan to install more software and create a lot of big data files, a new hard drive is probably the answer. You can either replace your existing one for a larger, faster new device, or run two drives, using one for data and program files and the other for the operating system and drivers. (We'll get into the criteria for figuring out your best configuration below.)

If you need more data storage space—as opposed to space to install new programs or operating systems, for example—a high-capacity removable storage solution will be a better answer. With a removable solution, you can add extra storage space in smaller chunks, and swap media in and out as necessary. The removable media can be used to offload files from the hard drive that you don't want to completely eliminate, but which you won't use very often—old records you might refer to once or twice a year, for example. For this analysis we've divided removable storage into floppy-like devices and CD-RW drives, and we treat them separately. But first, a look at hard drives.

Hard drives

If you need a larger hard drive, this is a great time to buy. Over the last year, capacities have shot up and prices have fallen. Last year, 20 GB drives cost around \$1,000. This year, drives near the same capacity mark can be purchased for under \$300. Users who want to push the envelope can get IDE hard drives that hold 40 GB of data (additionally, IBM has just announced 75 GB models), but it's an expensive solution for all but the most space-hungry user. For this month's roundup, we focused on the

20 GB range, which seems to offer one of the best cost-tocapacity ratios.

It's important to get your terms straight before you go shopping, because there are a few varieties of drives available, and you want to make sure the one you buy will work with your system.

- IDE (Integrated Drive Electronics): This type of hard drive is installed on most systems because most motherboards have IDE as a standard socket. Each IDE chain can hold two devices: one set to master, the other to slave. Because each motherboard typically has two IDE sockets, users can configure up to four hard drives per system. But remember that a CD-ROM generally uses the IDE chain as well. Some systems can handle up to four drives per interface, but this is uncommon.
- UDMA/66 (Ultra Direct Memory Access): This is the newest generation interface for hard drives, offering twice the transfer speed-up to 66 Mbps-of older drives. UDMA/66 drives can be used with older systems, but to meet the full potential of the drive, the motherboard should be equipped with the UDMA/66 interface, which can be identified by the bright blue socket, and the thinner 80-lead IDE cable. This specification is also known as Ultra ATA-66. Those without UDMA/66-compatible motherboards have two choices: upgrade the whole board, or look for a UDMA/66 upgrade card (usually PCI) to add the functionality into an older system.
- SCSI (Small Computer Systems Interface): The fastest SCSI drives beat IDE drives even those with UDMA/66—in speed com-

parisons. For this reason, SCSI drives tend to be favoured by those who need high throughput between the computer and the hard drive (notably multimedia professionals). One advantage of SCSI drives is that they can be chained in greater numbersgenerally up to seven per interface-inside a system. The bad news is that they tend to be pricier than their IDE counterparts, and require a special controller for systems that don't have SCSI on the motherboard (most don't). Because of the limited appeal of SCSI, we have chosen not to look at any for this review. But for users who have the money and a need for speed, SCSI is certainly worth a look.

• 5,400 rpm/7,200 rpm: The number of revolutions per minute—commonly known as the spindle speed—indicates how fast a drive spins. Most currently available are 5,400 rpm drives. Those looking for a performance boost without having to upgrade their system's motherboard to the UDMA/66 spec can add a 7,200 rpm drive. A word of caution, though: 7,200 rpm drives have a tendency to run very hot, so you'll also have to consider an extra cooling fan, especially if the components are packed tightly inside the case.

The testing

This month we asked for 5,400 rpm hard drives using the UDMA/66 specification, at or close to 20 GB. Each drive was formatted as a single large FAT32 partition, and a typical installation of Windows 98 was put onto each drive. Ziff-Davis' WinBench99 1.0 benchmarking suite was used to test their performance. (To publish these results we are obliged to state that WinBench is a trademark of ZD Inc. in the U.S. and other countries. These tests were performed without independent verification from Ziff-Davis, and Ziff-Davis makes no representations or warranties as to their results.)

Data transfer speeds were measured in Kbps (kilobytes per second), with higher numbers representing better performance. The rest of the test system consisted of an Asus P3C2000 motherboard with a 600 MHz Pentium III, 133 MHz system bus, an 8 MB ATI Rage Provideo card, and 128 MB of PC100 RAM.

NOTE: both IBM and Western Digital were invited to participate in this roundup, but drives were not available in time for testing.





At 17.2 GB, this drive falls a bit short of our capacity target this month, but it was also Seagate's highest-capacity 5,400 rpm drive at the time of writing (its 7,200 rpm drives are more spacious). The drive may be worth considering, though, because it has a lower street price than a full 20 GB drive, and offers reasonably good performance, too.

Removable storage

Removable storage offers a lot of benefits. Because it's a bolt-on solution, it generally doesn't involve the kind of extensive system rebuilding and reconfiguration that can be required when you install a new hard drive. Because the media is removable, you can add more media as required. The only limitation is the maximum capacity per disc or cartridge that your new solution uses. And because it's removable, the information on the media can be easily shared with anyone who has the same type of drive.

Connector connection

It's important to know what kind of interface would be the best match for your system when considering a removable storage solution. The three main types of external interfaces for removable storage peripherals are parallel, SCSI and USB, though FireWire devices are expected to become more common.

Parallel devices are a mixed bag. Though the parallel port appears on pretty much every PC, it's one of the slower interfaces available, and it can be difficult to configure the system so it works with other parallel devices installed. Users with older systems may find that a parallel port connection is their only option, but those whose systems have USB ports should really look for versions of the drives that use this faster connection.

SCSI devices are a much nicer option for some users. The interface is very fast, with some users reporting that they can run games off SCSI-based removable media. Additionally, SCSI devices can be chained, allowing several devices to use the same controller. The controller, however, is the issue for many users.

Those whose systems don't have a SCSI card already installed will have to make sure that there is room for one (both on the motherboard and in the system resources!), and should be prepared to pay for a good-quality

A happy medium for anyone with a relatively new computer system is a USB. The interface is fairly fast, devices are hot-pluggable and generally require a minimum of user intervention to make them play well with other devices on the system.

The tests

For the removable storage portion of our tests, we used the same 600 MHz Pentium III-based system, with the addition of a 13.6 GB Quantum hard drive. A 100 MB directory consisting of 971 files of varying types and sizes was created.

The files were first copied as a whole directory (by dragging the folder from C: drive to the removable media drive).

In the second part of our tests, the files were copied loose (by highlighting all files and dragging them over as a batch). This is an important consideration with removable media, because of the way Windows handles such tasks. When copied as a directory, the files leave the hard disk in the order they were written to the original source. When files are copied loose, Windows tries to alphabetize them on the fly, and can end up tripping over its own feet trying to get them into order.

On our test system, all of the removable media failed this second test rather quickly. It's worth noting that users with slower processors will be able to handle the task better, but could still run into errors when they attempt to copy large numbers of smaller files at one time.

The SuperDisk's compatibility with standard 1.44 MB floppy diskettes is both its beauty and its big drawback. Drawback first: by



compacting the media down to the same size as the floppy, it has longer write times-the SuperDisk took twice as long as the next-slowest device. The upside, however, is that it is an excellent option for machines that don't come with a floppy drive... like the iMac!



Jaz now offers a 2 GB version for handling even bigger files. The biggest drawback to the Jaz is the media cost: at nearly \$200 a crack, it's not cheap. The ability to flip 2 GB of data in and out of the drive with the press of the eject button, however, is a definite boon for those who need to back up or offload large amounts of data. Its fast transfer speed and compatibility with a large number of OSes are big pluses, too.

Recordable CDs

One of the biggest limitations of removable storage is the proprietary nature of their storage media. In other words, if you need to access the removable disk or cartridge at home and at work, you need to have the same drive on both systems. And if you send out data on those disks or cartridges to a service bureau or another company, you have to make sure they have compatible drives. Although Zip is fairly popular, it's not universal. As most PCs do now have a built-in CD-ROM drive, CD-based storage goes a long way towards solving compatibility problem.

CD-R (CD-recordable) drives were introduced a few years ago, and have became a success despite a few initial obstacles: expensive media, and slow, unreliable performance. Since then, prices for write-once media have plunged to about \$2 per blank, and improvements in CD writing software have made it easier than ever to custom configure a disc

with both data and audio components.

With the introduction of CD-RW (CDrewritable) drives, it became possible to use a single disc repeatedly, as you would use a floppy diskette. CD-RW media was also initially very expensive but prices have now dropped to about \$15 per blank. Because the difference in cost between the two technologies is narrowing, manufacturers are starting to eliminate the CD-R drives in their lines, in favor of producing more CD-RW drives.

Those looking at a CD-RW drive should keep a few things in mind, the first of which is interface options. Most common CD-RW models at the consumer level have an ATAPI/IDE interface, which resides on the same chain as the standard hard drive. More expensive but more powerful are SCSI models, which have faster throughput and come in both internal and external models. Those looking for external CD-RW solutions have the option of drives with parallel, USB or FireWire connectivity. At this point, FireWire models are still uncommon and expensive, and parallel models may conflict with other parallel devices. USB models are becoming more common, but throughput may be problematic, especially for systems with other devices already on the bus.

A second consideration you need to address when considering CD-RW technology is software. If you're replacing an older drive and want to use the same CD writing software, you may have to update it before it will recognize your new drive. New users shouldn't have to worry, as CD-RW drives are usually bundled with a CD writing program.







frustrating. Crank it down a notch, however, and it makes a good tool for multi-platform environments where USB is a standard.

Mitsumi's drives aren't flashy, but the performance is good, with 4x rewrite and write speeds. A good software bundle adds even more value, especially since Adaptec burning software is included. The lower price of the package is also very attractive.

Of the CD-RW models looked at this month, the Yamaha stands out for a few reasons: it has the highest write speed, we had very few discs go bad during writing, and it is bundled with excellent CD writing software. It is more expensive than other internal models, but the performance boost is certainly well worth the extra investment.

Editor's Choices

Hard drives: **Maxtor Diamond** Max 40 92049U4

The performance is top-notch, largely

owing to excellent buffer specifications. With the addition of a competitive price, this drive is very attractive.

Removable storage: Iomega Zip 250 USB

Zip is pretty much the standard for removable storage, and the Zip 250 USB shows why. It's high capacity, backwards compatible with older Zip media, and can be used with both desktop and notebook systems. It has a very appealing design, too!

Recordable CD: Yamaha CRW8424EZ

Though it's more expensive, the Yamaha drive had excellent speed, an excellent software bundle, and it produced the fewest coasters of any of the CD-RW drives we looked at. What more can you ask for?

Burning CDs on the road

Ithough working at a desktop PC is a comfort most of us take for granted, there are those intrepid among us who have no fixed corporate address, heading from branch office to branch office, from city to city. These so-called road warriors may also need to burn their own CDs from time to time, and a new generation of portable CD-RW devices has emerged to handle these demands.

The first portable drive we had a chance to look at was the Hewlett-Packard CD-Writer M820e (http://www.hpcdwriter.com). It is SCSI-based and comes with its own PC Card SCSI controller. Installation of the drive is quick and easy on a Windows 98 machine, and with 4x write, 4x rewrite, and 20x read speeds, the M820e burned CDs quickly and reliably. Because the drive detaches from the controller cable, it can also be used with a desktop system, connecting to a standard 25-pin SCSI cable.

The one drawback to this unit is that the drive requires external power. If it drew power through the PC Card, it could be used even when an AC outlet wasn't available. But this is a minor drawback in an otherwise nifty little device that comes bundled with Adaptec EasyCD Creator and DirectCD, and has a one-year warranty.

Mechanically, the Panasonic KXL-RW10A (http://www.panasonic.ca) is pretty much identical to the above-mentioned HP drive, but aesthetically it's quite a different ballgame, with a silver case and window for viewing the spinning disc. Otherwise, this device shares the HP's excellent performance and minor drawbacks. It also sports a one-year warranty and ships with Adaptec's EasyCD Creator and DirectCD.

Moving away from SCSI, Micro-Solutions' Backpack Bantam (http://www.micro-solutions .com) offers slimline CD-RW performance for the parallel port. Installation is easy, and Micro-Solutions' special parallel technology offers increased reliability and a pass-through for other parallel devices. The drive connects to a standard parallel port, but also ships with a PC Card parallel port (which installs as LPT2), which is just as easy to use. While bulkier than the HP or Panasonic units, the Bantam has the advantage of being compatible with most computers-portable or not-because it connects via the parallel port. Like the other drives, it comes bundled with Adaptec EasyCD Creator and DirectCD software.

Performance-wise, the machine did quite well, scoring an even 300. Considering what's inside the box, IBM's pricing for the model is also very competitive.

good, but with one pervasive irritating problem. Sometimes the screen shows white letters on a dark grey background and black letters on a light grey background at the same time. As well, both black and white letters are shown simultaneously on a middle grey background in some situations. In this case, adjusting the contrast to see both the white and black letters is difficult.

Smart Machine's Viper F-800 system is a more expensive affair, but it's also topped up with more goodies. This system turned in the fastest Sysmark98 benchmarking score we've seen (for now), which means it should satisfy the needs of most of the power users out there. a

I found the stenciled labels confusing at first. The Edit selector, for example, didn't always bring up choices I expected. For clarity, I'd suggest changing Edit to Menu, then switching Main Menu to System or Desktop.

The Helio includes a version of Communication Intelligence Corp.'s Jot software, which is used on most Windows CE palm-size devices. While the character shapes are a bit closer to true Roman characters, the

modal nature of the input (dependent on what area of the screen is used for entry) leaves it roughly as good or bad as Palm's Graffiti.

Sound recording is not adjustable for quality. The quality is similar to cheap digital voice recorders-roughly the same as the lowest quality voice setting on Windows CE and Psion devices. Testing found a digitization rate of about 2.3Kbps, which confirms VTech's claim that about 55 minutes of sound can be stored on the unit's 8 MB RAM. No voice recognition software is included.

System functions

Data reusability and integration is minimal. Cut, Copy, and Paste functions are supported between applications for text but not graphics. There is no provision for linking items and no global find. In fact, the only application that has a Find function is the Phone Book. The Memo application can only be sorted alphabetically or by creation date.

The Helio has two external connectors, both of which are essentially serial ports. A small connector has six signal lines, four of which are used. This port supports up data transfer rates

of up to 56Kbps. The other fast serial input/output port supports data rates of up to 3.5 Mbps. The Helio does not have an infrared port.

Connectivity software

The unit's connectivity is currently a weak point. VTech claims data connectivity with Microsoft Outlook, Scheduler+, Lotus Organizer, Act!, GoldMine and Palm Desktop. Unfortunately, when I tried importing my main phone file from Palm Desktop, the conversion to Helio Desktop worked without problems, but when I tried to sync the Helio it crashed completely requiring a cold boot, and restoring of my old data.

Applications

The Helio is weaker than Windows CE Palm or Psion devices in primary personal information management (PIM) software, but includes more application software.

The Phone Book supports 22 fields, a user definable category and free-form text notes. Also, Text Memos can have Sketch attachments, but the sketch must be drawn specifically for each memo.

The calculator has four modes: Simple, Metric-to-Imperial conversions, Money Exchange and Mortgage Payments.

The Expense application would probably be unacceptable for most business people, as

expense types are not user definable, and there is no text annotation field, which is mandatory for most business records.

The Sketch application includes line, circle, rectangle and text functions but does not support grey shades and Cut and Paste is limited to moving a single clip from point to point.

Expansion

Memory for the Helio comes on a removable card. To add to the 8 MB RAM, this card has to be completely replaced.

VTech is also planning an intriguing keyboard/modem (for an estimated US\$100) for the Helio. A photo of the prototype with the Helio indicates that the combination is about the size of the Hewlett-Packard Jornada 680, a highly portable clamshell Windows CE device. Attached to the add-on, the Helio is held sideways with the system software rotating the screen 90 degrees for viewing.

Conclusions

For Canadians, the biggest drawback of the VTech Helio is that it can only be purchased through VTech's U.S. Web site.

Except for the problem importing my Palm data, the Helio has proven to be a reliable product with overall adequate performance and great long-term potential. With a little more work it could be a serious challenger for the Palm.

Monsoon sound anything but flat

Included in the box are two satellite speakers, a subwoofer and all the necessary cables to connect to your computer. Also included is a brief but well-written user manual. The satellite speakers include wire stands, which, sadly, cannot be adjusted. Set up is no more complex than that of any other PC speaker system. However, positioning is critical for optimal sound quality. The manual features a section on positioning, but some fine-tuning to suit your specific environment is still required.

Features

The features that distinguish the MM-700 from competing desktop systems are the flat panel technology and the control wheel. The

wheel-which has a mute button and volume control-is located on the cable that connects the subwoofer to the PC. This control wheel is the only way to set the volume, which could be a problem if you wanted to connect other audio devices that required a different cable. A master volume control on the base unit would have been a nice feature.

The flat-panel technology employed here is nothing short of stunning. Not only do these speakers require less space, they are also more stylish and sound better than traditional conebased speakers.

One disappointing omission is the lack of a second audio input (to hook up a Discman or game console, for example), which is common in speaker systems in this price range.

Sound quality

The MM-700 speakers were tested by playing a

mix of audio CDs and computer entertainment titles. The audio CDs included albums from Diana Krall and Fiona Apple, as well as Koyaniskatsi by Philip Glass. For music performance, the output from these speakers matched many other home stereo systems they were compared to.

Clarity of sound was excellent on the high end, and in general all sound ranges were represented well without distortion. At certain levels there was too much bass for the subwoofer to handle. In most cases, this could be solved by turning down the bass level of the subwoofer, or turning down the system volume slightly. However it would be nice if the subwoofer had slightly more power. If you are going to listen primarily to music, and sound quality is of the utmost importance, the higher powered MM-1000 series (US\$199) would be a better bet. In general, however, the MM-700 system will exceed the sound quality many people are used to from PCs or home stereos.

For entertainment purposes, the results were equally positive. While playing games such as Quake3 and Unreal, a very convincing 3D sound field was created. The speaker system made it easier to pinpoint the location of sounds in the games, creating a more immersive 3D experience. Sound effects were crystal clear, and audio never seemed muddy, even with plenty of bass. Again, however, with the system volume set too high, the subwoofer was prone to distortion under heavy load.

Conclusions

Overall, these speakers are highly recommended for anyone who is looking for the very best sound output for playing games or music CDs. This set is a little pricier than conventional speakers, but the added clarity makes a huge difference. Anyone who has money to spare and wants to put together the ultimate system is probably better off looking into the MM-1000 series, which features more power and two audio inputs. The MM-700 series, however, is perfect for most home users.

Neugents bring us a step closer to AI


Stop Dave. Stop. I'm afraid, Dave... just a moment..." These words immediately remind Stanley Kubr-ophiles of HAL's mistaken prediction of an AE-35 unit failure and Dave and Frank's subsequent worries about the computer controlling their mission in 2001: A Space Odyssey.

Ironically enough, Computer Associates (CA) introduced failure prediction software only a couple of years before 2001. This software constitutes a significant step toward the artificial intelligence (AI) science fiction buffs can still only see in the movies.

Called Neugents, such products predict the behaviour of a given system based on analysis of that system's past behaviour. "A Neugent is an intelligent software agent that allows predictive management," says Brandon Musler, CA's business manager for performance and Neugents. "It doesn't just react to events, but tells you that a problem may be developing so that you don't have to spend a lot of resources fixing the outcome of that problem. You avoid it instead."

Musler draws a comparison to anti-lock brakes in cars that do not—contrary to popular belief—make you brake better, but instead allow you to steer around any problem encountered on the road.

When discussing Neugents with anyone at CA, it is impossible to avoid the phrase "neural network technology"—the algorithmic



people had been implementing one-off neural engines in various applications for a long time. But Computer Associates has been able to take this customized [application] and pragmatize it so that it will work as a product right out of a box."

Where the implications of this development are far reaching indeed, the current practical application is in large corporate and governmental networks where component failure can have potentially disastrous results. The first

functions that mimic the decision-making process of the human brain. Combined with other AI (artificial intelligence) and statistical functions, the collective impact is Neugent software that can "learn and think for itself."

"Neural network research has been going on for 20 or 30 years," says Musler. "In fact, Neugent was developed specifically for Microsoft Windows NT and, staying with that business networking orientation, the current product is specific to CA's Unicenter TNG network manager. Versions for UNIX and mainframes are currently being developed, but CA

Palm explores wireless, service partners

while many people have been excited by the recent introduction of a colour display to Palm Computing's lineup, analysts suggest the real story is the company's continuing push to move the Palm OS and Palm devices firmly into the convergence market.

At the Toronto launch of the colour Palm IIIc and Palm IIIxe handhelds, the company highlighted its many strategic partnerships with companies such as Qualcomm. Nokia, Oracle, Sony and Handspring. These partnerships indicate that Palm is moving away from being simply a device manufacturer, and is expanding its role as an information management platform developer.

"From our perspective, we can't be everything to everyone," says Michael Moskowitz, general manager of Palm Canada Inc. in Mississauga, Ont. "Two years ago, we were a device company. But we knew long-term that while the market growth was very strong for handhelds, it was out of our control."

Moskowitz says he began to see early on that handheld devices would begin to converge with wireless technology so people could get at information anywhere and at any time, which is why Palm is looking to integrate its OS into cellular phones.

"We knew these new kinds of phones need

ed to do more than just [handle] voice [calls]," Moskowitz adds. "They had to tap into the enterprise, have some kind of Web browsing ability, and deliver content. They have to do more than what they can do today."

A Palm OS-enabled cellular phone could let someone browse the Internet, get email or synchronize data between the phone and the office.

Recently, Santa Clara, Calif.-based Siebel System Inc. announced plans to integrate its eBusiness solutions with Palm's Address Book, Calendar and To-Do applications to allow for data synchronization between the enterprise and Palm devices.

Microsoft bulks up apps, colour for Pocket PC

REDMOND, Wash.—Microsoft has announced that a new Windows CE implementation, called Pocket PC, set for launch by mid-June, will have a better Microsoft Outlook inbox plus revised versions of Word and Excel.

Phil Holden, a Microsoft group product manager, said the Pocket PC versions of the leading office applications will have a far greater reach than organizers and personal digital assistants (PDAs) can deliver. He said the software will power handheld devices to be announced by Casio, Compaq, and Hewlett-Packard.

Acknowledging that, in its effort to win a significant share of the handheld computing market, Microsoft is facing an uphill battle against the market-leading Palm Computing platform, Holden said the Pocket PC will outperform the just-released colour Palm IIIc. He said the Palm IIIc draws 1.2 watts of power, much more than Pocket PC prototypes he has seen. Casio, for example, claims 25-hour battery operation for its color Pocket PC-based device and 80 hours for the monochrome version, Holden said. Also, some of the color handhelds will have reflective screens that are easy to read in direct sunlight-a challenge for the Palm IIIc.

Pocket PCs will also do a better job of importing data from Microsoft Outlook than the Palm conduits now available, Holden said. Among the most frequent downloads of third-party software for the Palm platform are apps for viewing Word and Excel documents. By including their functions in the Pocket PC, Microsoft hopes to extend the enterprise reach of its Office suite.

The more robust Outlook Inbox in the new platform will support a range of file attachments including BMP, DOC, GIF, HTML, INK, JPG, RTF, TXT, WAV and XLS. The inbox will work with IMAP 4, LDAP, and POP 3 for compatibility with Microsoft Exchange and Lotus Notes messages.

Holden demonstrated a version of Internet Explorer for Web browsing with full, interactive graphics. The Palm OS' Web clipping function is text-only.


Pocket PCs will have built-in password security. Holden said several U.S. federal agencies have shown active interest in the Pocket PC-based devices, but he declined to name them.





plans to extend this "thinking ability" beyond the business IT environment and, eventually, into our homes.

Musler says that some day we might see Neugents not only in our home PCs but in personal digital assistants (PDAs) as well. "We are looking for this technology to become ubiquitous," he says. "This is a way for consumer devices to signal each other over a network that they exist so your camera knows that there's a printer that it can output a photograph to, for example... to diagnose the dependencies between devices, what things can talk to what things, and what it makes sense to alert the user to."

Predicting further, it would be possible to develop personalized Neugents to review the past daily schedules of a very busy person, in order to analyze the current day's schedule for problems or conflicts. Applied in such a way, a Neugent could recognize which events typically make you late, how you like to organize your day and the events you have planned for a current day, then either alert you to problems or suggest a schedule so that you get the best results based on your habits.

And way way further on, AI at the Neugent level might be built into a VCR so that it learns your favourite programs and records them, even when you have forgotten or neglected to set things up beforehand.

It is important to remember, however, that AI on even that rudimentary level is still quite some time away and that Neugents constitute only a first step toward that outcome in at least being able to "learn." Musler is quite adamant that Neugents recognize patterns, so the technology would not be applicable to completely random situations like predicting the stock market or the weather.

Musler says that we're already surrounded by AI at the consumer level but that we're just not aware of it. He cites the example of regular household vacuum cleaners whose engines no longer burn out when they suck up inappropriate objects because they monitor the patterns of what usually gets sucked in then register the bad object and shut the engine down.

"But nobody cares about that," he says.
"They want to know the price of the vacuum cleaner, the attachments it comes with, that sort of thing. They don't want a lecture from the salesman about artificial intelligence."
Which is a sign of a successful technology in Musler's estimation; where people don't see that type of sophistication as exotic or futuristic but simply take it for granted.

And there are plenty of situations in which that type of intelligence, expanded by Neugents, can be applied right now to the benefit of business and ultimately to consumers.

"You might have a large e-commerce site," Musler speculates, "where you want to track patterns of customer utilization—how they move through your site, where they enter from, where they exit from, that sort of thing. Neugents might help you set it up better by detecting things like, if a particular page takes too long to download and a large number of people are dropping out at that point. But before you actually start losing people at that page, it will predict and tell you to expect, say, an 82 percent loss rate at that point and suggest that you change the

graphic... At the rate hardware technology is developing, I see it as a short step away.

"E-commerce is really driving the need for this. You have more and more people operating over the Internet, and networks in general, which means more and more independent programs and automatic processes are taking place. Business quite simply needs something to monitor this activity because human beings can't simply just sit and stare at a screen all day. The scale and scope of today's IT infrastructures is such that they now require these self-learning and self-modifying agents. And that's, in fact, what Neugents are."

So what Neugents aren't, yet, is HAL. But if Musler is on the right track with his prognostications, we might soon be hearing, "Daisy, Daisy, give me your answer do" from our vacuum cleaners as we switch them off and pull the plug.

While business integration is a growing market for Palm, with some 40 percent of developers writing Palm-based business applications, the company also sees itself moving into the entertainment arena.

Jordan Worth, telecommunications analyst for International Data Corp. (Canada) Ltd. in Toronto says Palm's recent alliance with Sony means consumer electronics devices with the Palm OS integrated into them are likely to start appearing.

Worth expects consumers in Asia will be the first to see Palm OS-enabled consumer devices that will have increased functionality and interoperability. In North America, similar devices will become available later, when improvements in wireless technology allow for the delivery of multimedia content.

"With the inception of the 3G wireless service, that is where you are going to see the real services take off," Worth says. "What you are seeing now is cheap wireless devices giving good voice access. The limitation of the current wireless standard is that the maximum throughput speed you can get is about 14.4Kbps. 3G wireless is expected to offer a minimum of 364Kbps throughput speeds. So you are talking about very fast speeds, which could offer things like video."

In the future, Palm users will see customized information and content delivered to their devices. Currently, AOL Canada and Excite.ca are offering users customizable content for their desktop and laptop PCs. With improved wireless throughput, that kind of content could be delivered to a variety of wireless handheld devices.

In the U.S., AOL and Yahoo have already partnered with Palm to let their members send and receive email through their Palm devices. There are also plans to let AOL members use their Palm devices to access AOL's Instant Messenger and Buddy List services.

Yahoo, meanwhile, has announced that its Yahoo Instant Messenger and Yahoo Mail will be bundled with various models of the Palm, later this year.

Palm Canada's Moskowitz expects that, in the future, his company will get more of its revenue from its OS than it will from its line of handheld devices.

"We are very reliant on the device side today where in the future we will be more reliant on the platform side as we will become a much stronger software company rather than a device company," he adds.

CMOS configuration

Every PC has a section of memory called CMOS, which is used to store the configuration of the system hardware. Your system's CMOS uses a battery to retain settings for

hardware, time and date, system speed and memory handling. If any of these settings are incorrect, your system will underperform or not work at all. (If you want an in depth explanation of CMOS and how it functions, link to http://www.officewizard.com/books/CMOS/ 02775 Mysteries CMOS.htm by Neil Randall.)

If you suspect your CMOS is not set correctly, and you feel confident enough to try changing settings in an area you suspect is afflicted, by all means make the changes. But before you do, write them down. That way you can reverse the setting if it doesn't have the desired effect.

Not sure about altering the CMOS yourself? Don't take the chance. Call a qualified technician or engineer to help. Q

Freeware is having an important effect on software development. First, as long as these programs remain free, these categories of software will be off limits to all but the hardiest of commercial software vendors

Also consider the many ways freeware vendors contrive to make money charging for

deluxe or pro versions of the program; charging for support and other services: offering the freebie as a lead-in to other products or hardware; and displaying banner ads within the free software (called adware) to pay the way. Traditional commercial software vendors will have to try some of these tactics in order to more rapidly develop their market position and ward off potential competitors.

Independent artists, many having never signed a record deal, are actively using the Net to distribute and promote their music

ccording to statistics released during New York-based Jupiter Communications Inc.'s Plug-In conference last July, more than 70 percent of 12- to 18-yearolds have visited Web sites looking for music to download. Cambridge, Mass.-based Forrester Research Inc. predicts that companies able to tap into this digital flow from musicians to consumers could share in an estimated US\$1 billion in revenue by 2003.

With such obvious consumer

interest and potential for profit, you'd expect the major record labels and artists to be among the first to jump on the bandwagon. But while mainstream musicians like David Bowie and Chuck D push for online music distribution, the gulf between reality and hype is pretty

The biggest promoters of music distribution over the Web are not the major record labels. Instead, it's independent artists-many having never signed a record deal-who are actively using the Internet to distribute and promote their music.

"A lot of [major] labels want super groups," says Robert Garbowski, drummer for the San Diego, Calif.-based pop-punk band Lucky 7.



Jane Siberry, Lucky 7, and Fisher are all artists without major label record deals who are successfully using the Internet and MP3 technology to sell their music and promote their careers.

IE5 for Mac ready for download

Microsoft's new browser features Tasman page-drawing engine, Internet scrapbook

icrosoft Internet Explorer 5.0 Macintosh Edition (IE 5 for Mac), is now available for download from either Microsoft's Mactopia Web site (http://www.microsoft.com/mac/), or CNet (http://www.cnet.com).

The Mac version of the popular browsek has a new page-drawing engine, code named Tasman. Tasman is claimed to be more reliable, and significantly faster than the engine in the previous version of Internet Explorer. Early testers also report that causes some interesting new interactions between browser and HTML pages, which may result in different page views, font sizes, compatibility issues and performance compared to earlier versions of IE for Mac.

At launch, the new browser was available in nine different language versions, including French, English, Japanese and German, with additional languages promised "soon."

Microsoft has also made the IE 5 for Mac more like the Windows version. It is now more easily configurable, allowing users to modify the appearance and layout of the browser. An Internet Scrapbook feature integrates the ability to manage Web page elements within the browser. An unusual but interesting new feature is an online auction management option.

Microsoft decided to avoid issuing a "legacy" 40-bit version of the new browser in favour of distributing only a 128-bit version, which means it will always have the highestpowered security and encryption capability.

Along with IE 5 for Mac, Microsoft has released the new Outlook Express 5.02 for Mac email client, featuring improved security. It is also available for free download, either alone or bundled with the new Web browser. Outlook Express 5.02 for Mac also has Authenticated SMTP security.

Very early adopters of the new browser and email client have already reported some bugs, including difficulties in installation, memory problems, and other glitches. It's likely that, as with most new software products, there'll be a period of teething troubles resulting in bug fixing patches and workaround advice being released by Microsoft, eventually followed by a service pack release. Microsoft has also announced that it will release a version of IE 5 for Mac at the upcoming release of the new Mac OS X.

One anticipated but unavailable feature of IE 5 for Mac is a media toolbar, which would have given users direct access to a variety of digital media playback formats, such as MPEG. Some observers have speculated that

Weaving your own Web site: Part 56

XHTML (aka HTML 5.0): Part I

By Keith Schengili-Roberts

n January, the World Wide Web Consortium (W3C) released a new official specification charting the direction of HTML. This new specification is the successor to the official HTML 4.01, which has gained wide acceptance in the Web authoring community and among browser manufacturers, who have implemented most of its fea-

Everyone was expecting the successor specification to be called HTML 5.0, but instead it is called XHTML 1.0, and it signals a fundamental change in the way Web pages will be written and the purposes for which they can be used. Amongst other things, the new spec-

ification will mean Web authors will have to change their coding habits: forcing sloppy programmers to get things right, and expanding the possibilities of what users can do with the resulting Web pages.

XML, HTML and XHTML

The "X" in XHTML points to another coding standard called XML (extensible markup language). XML is a way to embody and describe data elements, and at the moment is being used most in the construction of many Webbased databases. The XHTML specification essentially merges aspects of XML into HTML. To get a real understanding of what's going on, you need to know some fundamentals behind HTML and XML.

One of the ongoing complaints about HTML is that while it is a good coding standard for describing how Web pages should look, it does not do a good job of describing the relationships between elements on a page. So, for example, you could create a menu listing that looks good on the Web page, but there is no simple way for a computer program to understand its contents. Take a look at this code listing as an example:

Anyone who is proficient in HTML can easily make out what is going on here. This menu has the two headings Food and Price, Food relates to the contents in its column, namely Soup and Hamburger, and Price relates to the contents in its column, namely \$1.00 and \$2.50. When seen through a Web browser, it will look something like this:

Food Price Soup \$1.00 Hamburger

The relationships between the items on the menu are easy for us to distinguish, but this is not the case for a program trying to read the contents of this page. While HTML is good at describing how all of these items should be arranged on the page, it does not implicitly describe the relationships between the items. Without an explicit description of the relationships between the elements in the table, a computer program could mistakenly think that \$1.00 is related directly to \$2.50, and not to Soup. This is where XML comes into play.

Whereas HTML was created to tell a Web browser where things should be placed on a Web page, XML was devised to describe the data contained on a page and the relationships between various data elements. One of the fundamental differences between XML and HTML is that XML allows Web authors to define their own tags-this is where the "extensible" part of the language comes into play. So for example you could create tags called <food> and <price>, and enclose the items on the previous menu page so that it looked like this instead:

<heading>Food</heading><heading>Price</heading>

<menuitem><food>Soup</food><price>\$1.00</price ></menuitem>

<menuitem><food>Hamburger</food><price>\$2.50

</price></menuitem>

While this sample code adequately describes the relationships between the items on the page, a typical browser would not know how to display this code. While it is possible to tell a browser how these XML tags should be displayed, on the whole HTML provides a simpler way of displaying the same data. The new XHTML 1.0 specification is a way of taking the descriptive data features of XML and combining them with HTML's ease of data display.

No more lazy Web code

The XHTML 1.0 specification requires Web authors write code in a very rigid style in order for an XHTML-compliant browser to fully understand it. In essence, here are the main elements required in writing XHTML code:

· Certain XHTML elements must always appear on a page.

- · Web pages have to conform to XML rules.
- Tags and attributes must be in lowercase.
- · All XHTML elements have to be "closed."
- Any attribute values must be in quotes.
- Minimization of code is no longer allowed.
- The "id" attribute replaces the old "name"
- Extended characters need to be explicitly defined prior to use.

Let's go through each of these one-by-one. Under XHTML, there are a number of mandatory elements to distinguish an XHTML page as an XHTML page. XML requires that all documents have what is called a "root" tag, and that all of the tags that follow must be considered sub-elements (or what is commonly referred to as "children"). As a result, the following tags are mandatory in an XHTML page: <!doctype>, <html>, <head>, <title> and <body> (plus all of their appropriate elosing

All of the tags on a Web page must also confirm to the proper XML rules, which means that the tags must be properly nested (i.e. <i>this is correctly nested</i> and <i>this is not</i>). They also must follow the correct order, so that the <body> and <head> tags are contained within the <html> tags. In addition, under XHTML, the <title> tag and its contents must be first tag to appear after the opening <head> tag.

As you may have noticed from the earlier XML sample code, XML is written in lowercase. This is because XML is case-sensitive, meaning that tags like <1> and <1> or
,
,
 could be interpreted as different tags. As a result, XHTML code must also be written in lowercase letters to be properly understood by the browser.

All XHTML tags have to be "closed." This means that there must always be either a closing tag (i.e.), or if the tag is a standalone, it has to have a "/" at the end of it (i.e. <hr />).

XHTML also requires that if you are using a tag that has an attribute value, it must be enclosed in quotes (i.e.). If this is not done, the attribute will not be recognized and the tag as a whole may not be displayed properly.

The XHTML specification also says that the id attribute is now the name attribute, so all of the tags that used name (<a>, <applet>, <frame>, <iframe>, and <map>) must now use id instead

You also cannot use minimized attribute forms with tags anymore. So, if you used to write code that allowed a contracted form, such as <dl compact> or <option selected>, it must now be written in its full form instead, such as compact="compact"> and selected="selected">

Under XHTML scripting and style elements (which also includes such entity characters such as &It; and &) have to be explicitly set so that the browser doesn't simply see them as text content. This is done by declaring these elements as being special #PCDATA content, which should be interpreted rather than displayed. You would do this for some sample JavaScript code in the following fashion:



album. However, it didn't have a record deal and band members began to investigate ways to promote themselves and distribute their music until a deal came along. What they

found was the Internet and a fledgling company called MP3.com.

MP3.com, which is also based in San Diego, was started to give artists like Lucky 7 a way to distribute and promote their music over the Internet. It uses a technology, MP3 (MPEG-1. Audio Layer-3), which can compress audio files

to about 10 percent of their original size, making them small enough to download quickly while maintaining CD-quality sound. The MP3.com site debuted in late 1998 with only a handful of bands. In less than 18 months since the launch, some 40,000 artists have an MP3.com presence, and the site is host to more than 250,000 samples of their work that can be downloaded for free.

John Lenihan, director of public relations for MP3.com, says his company has empowered both the artist and the audience.

"What is great about the Internet and MP3.com is you are able to access the music you like," Lenihan adds. "If you really like

Celtic music, you can go into the Celtic section on our Web site and listen to or purchase a CD which was really unavailable in the past. And it is a great tool for artists to market their music to a global audience."

When artists sign onto MP3.com, they agree to make at least one cut available for free,


allowing Web surfers to sample their sound. If they like what they hear, listeners can purchase a CD directly from MP3.com's Digital Automatic Music (DAM) DAM presses a single CD, complete with artwork and jewel case, and ships it to -Robert Garbowski, Lucky 7 drummer the consumer in about 48 hours.

> You the group or solo artist are in control of your music Garbowski says. "You are in control of the artwork and the price to charge. You don't have to manufacture any CD and [MP3.com] will make them as needed." The only up-front cost for the band is studio time.

> Another advantage for artists using DAM is they receive 50 percent of the net revenues from the sales of their CDs-a deal no major record company would offer, especially to a band that is just starting out.

> Lucky 7 says it has sold some 700 CDs through DAM and that MP3.com has logged about 100,000 downloads of the group's free





songs. MP3.com also links listeners to Lucky 7's own site (http://www.feelingluckypunk.com), where they can get more information on the band, find out about tour dates, new releases, and purchase band merchandise.

But what bands like Lucky 7 find most useful about online music distribution is the relationships they begin to build with their fans. People looking for music on the Internet tend to be pickier and more loyal to the music genres and artists they like. One would have to be, as tracking down a song or album online can be time consuming, especially if the artist has a lower profile than, say, the Backstreet Boys. But once they find something they like, Internet-savvy fans tend to stick with an artist and even help promote them.

Underground goes online

Thomas Ryan, the former chief music officer and co-founder of New York-based Cductive.com (which was recently acquired by EMusic.com), says he started his online music distribution company as a way of promoting underground, electronic, and dance music to a wider audience.

"It [underground music] was not distributed well, so if you knew what you wanted chances are you might not have been able to find it," Ryan says. "And it was difficult to learn more about it unless you had a friend in the know. We started Cductive.com to combat those two deficiencies and grow the market for high-quality underground music."

Cductive.com posts selections from a wide variety of artists, many of whom are signed to small, independent labels. The site is not only a place to buy music, it is a venue where a community of like-minded musicians and listeners can come together.

The Los Angeles-based band Fisher credits the Internet with helping it find its audience and fans. Fisher was started about six years ago by lead singer Kathy Fisher and producer, arranger, keyboard player Ron Wasserman. About two years ago, Fisher's song *Breakable* was featured on the soundtrack for the film *Great Expectations*. This was a big break for an unsigned band.

The movie did not do well at the box office and *Breakable* was never released as a single. However, the soundtrack also featured music by Tori Amos, whose fans are extremely loyal. They liked Breakable so much they started calling Atlantic Records, which put out the

Vancouver developer's PC game teaches lesson in online safety

A software company from Vancouver has created a computer game designed to teach kids and parents about the perils of Internet surfing.

LiveWWWires Design Ltd.
(http://www.LiveWWWires.com/) based the game,
Missing, on a real-life Internet abduction
experience. Just like Zack in the smallscreen version, the teen, who's tale Missing
is based on, was lured to the U.S. by an
online predator who promised the world.

According to LiveWWWires president,
Drew Ann Wake, the game is meant to send
a very strong message to kids and parents.
"You have to be extremely wary of people
who promise California on a platter," she
said during a telephone interview. "They
have underlying motives."

Missing comes with a video documentary—which recounts another abduction attempt—and a workbook. The company is distributing 20,000 copies of the package through Industry Canada and provincial education ministries. Wake said it should eventually be available in every school and public library in the country, at no charge to the recipients,

"Not every province is on board yet," Wake said. "But, since the game is free, there's no downside to receiving it."

Thanks to benefactors like the Mounted Police Foundation, which paid for the 20,000 packages, individuals can buy Missing from the company's Web site for \$35, Wake said. "We wanted to offer it at the price of a book."

Missing draws a frightening scenario for its target audience (10- to 14-year olds and their parents). In game one, the player is a member of the RCMP's Missing Children's Registry wrestling with a father's pleas. It

seems that the man's son, Zack, has been spending a lot of time on the Internet. A brief look at Zack's email suggests he has been in contact with an online predator. Then Zack goes missing. In game two, it's up to the player to find Zack in California before his abductor whisks him off to Mexico.

In designing Missing, Wake said
LiveWWWires went through 30 stories of
Internet prey before settling on Zack's tale.
"It was difficult," she said. "Very different
tactics are used for girls and boys. Predators
usually offer girls support for how they
look... Predators send boys pornography or
pictures their parents don't allow."

LiveWWWires got on board when the RCMP's Computer Crime Branch came calling. The police were researching software companies, looking for a game that could help teach kids about safe-surfing habits.

"Every once in a while, a project comes along that just suits the company," Wake said. The company's expertise with realistic video and audio came in handy. "We knew we would produce the perfect game to teach kids about the dangers of the Internet."

While the game might appeal to teens and pre-teens, the developers felt that the parents could use some schooling, too. So LiveWWWires included the documentary about a teenager who almost makes it out the door, en-route to meet a predator living in New York.

"There's a tremendous amount of denial and disbelief among parents," Wake said. "We wanted to break through that disbelief."

It seems to be working. LiveWWWires put Missing through a number of tests with the target audience, and was pleased by the response

"We know the game is hitting home," she said.

Fisher's CD. The problem was Fisher was not signed with Atlantic, nor did it have a commercially available CD. The fans then began searching the Internet for information on Fisher, which prompted the band's move online.

"So the position we were in, it would have been crazy not to have our own Web site and that pushed us to do a CD because we were getting requests for one," Kathy Fisher says.

Wasserman says he applies the same philosophy to the Internet that Honda does to letters of complaint. If Honda receives a written missive about one of its cars, it assumes there are roughly 25,000 other people with the same complaint.

"So if we are getting email, possibly each one represents about 500 people," Wasserman says. "And I thought maybe we have an audience out there that we don't know about."

Unlike the Web sites for multi-million CD selling artists, Fisher's Web site (http://www.digitalsound.net) keeps fans up-to-date on what the band is doing. The site features photos taken on the road, and performing and backstage at a recent L.A. awards ceremony. Wasserman also takes the time to respond to each email the band receives.

"One of the things we really tried to create is interaction," he adds. "When we had a show at the House of Blues and had to cancel because Kathy was sick, the next day I had to answer 300 emails telling people what her health was like. When someone picks up a CD in a store, there is not a snowball's chance in hell they are going to talk to anyone who works with the band."

Another artist who is using the Web to do more than distribute music is Toronto-based singer/songwriter Jane Siberry. Following her departure from a major label, Warner/Reprise, in 1996, Siberry started Sheeba Records and launched a Web site for her label. Sheeba.ca (http://www.sheeba.ca) not only distributes Siberry's music, but acts as a resource for fans wanting to find out about new releases and tour dates. The site is currently being

redesigned, but she hopes fans will continue to give her feedback about its direction. In the past, she has encouraged fans to use the site as a kind of watering hole; a forum in which Siberry could ask questions and receive suggestions and ideas from visitors.

"I put up a 'Jane Asks' area and people would write in with what they knew and I would post it," Siberry said. "I get a lot more out of it personally. People see me struggling and come forward with their expertise in different areas."

MP3.ca arrives

Even more Canadian musicians and independent bands will likely take to using the Internet and MP3 technology to promote themselves with the recent launch of MP3.ca. While not affiliated with MP3.com, MP3.ca intends to follow the same formula of distributing and promoting artists as its American counterpart. MP3.ca will link up with individual artists and bands, and their Web sites, and allow them to post information on tour dates. Promoters will also be able to use MP3.ca to book bands.

"We want to act as a Canadian source for music," says Jeff Baryshnik, president of Toronto-based MP3.ca, "The Canadian music scene is pretty strong and significantly different from the U.S. music scene, especially in the independent area. And there are some big bands in Canada that are not really in the States."

Labels will not go gently

Though musicians now have more control over marketing and selling their music independently, even many of the artists who use MP3 and the Internet extensively will admit that these technologies will never replace the

major labels, and many would jump at the chance to sign a deal if they believed the terms were right.

"When people ask us whether MP3 will replace record labels, we say an emphatic no," says Kathy Fisher. "What it has replaced is artists putting flyers up and down Sunset Strip and doing shows where they have to buy the tickets and do their own advertising. It is a cost effective way to get your music out to your audience and to a worldwide audience."

While the major labels will certainly not

disappear any time soon, they have also not shown any great enthusiasm about the MP3.com technology itself. The main reason being that the format makes it easy to illegally distribute copyright-protected music. An enterprising and persistent Miles Davis fan, for example, can probably find most of the jazz legend's recordings online in MP3. Great for the fan, but certainly not for the record company or artist (or in Davis's case, his estate) who are losing revenue.

The Recording Industry Association of

America (RIAA), which represents many of the major labels, has gone as far as "educating" administrators at U.S. universities about the illegality of Web sites containing pirated MP3 collections residing on campus servers. In August, a University of Oregon student who posted MP3 files on the university's network was the first person in the U.S. convicted under the No Electronic Theft (NET) Act. It was the campus network administrators who tipped off the authorities. In November, 71 Carnegie Mellon University students were

disciplined by school administrators for posting illegal MP3 files on the campus network. Their Internet privileges were revoked and they were required to attend a class on copyright issues and to write an essay about what they learned.

While the major record labels, through the RIAA, are making sure MP3 pirates are prosecuted, they are not ignoring the Internet and its potential for digital music distribution. Recently, many signed onto the Secure Digital Music Initiative (SDMI) in an effort to research methods of distributing music online while maintaining copyright protection.

Several major labels have also signed onto Listen.com (http://www.listen.com), which produces a directory of downloadable music. Listen.com's principals include BMG, EMI, Universal Music Group and Warner Music Group. In October, Sony Music also invested in the company. There is some suggestion that Listen.com will be used as a platform for the major labels to distribute their music online, while still allowing them to retain a great deal of control over it.

But no matter how the major labels react, the music landscape has already begun to change because of MP3 and the Internet.

"I'm not saying that music that you buy at a record store is bad, but that you are being fed the stuff a record company believes you will buy a lot of," says Tal Klein, a member of the New York-based duo Trancenden (http://www.trancenden.com). "On the Internet you have a lot more variety. Everyone has a specific kind of music that they like, from country music to hardcore techno. And on the Internet you will probably find someone who combines both."

Two firms test PC support via the Net

Internet service provider (ISP) ParaLynx Internet (http://www.paralynx.com) will soon begin a three-month trial offering PC support services to subscribers in an agreement it has entered with PC support.com (http://www.pcsupport.com).

Heidi Lynn, operations manager for ParaLynx in Vancouver says the computer support services will help differentiate ParaLynx from other ISPs, particularly among those novice PC users making their first forays onto the Internet.

"I've noticed over the last few years an increase in the number of new computer users signing up for Internet services," Lynn says. "The first time they need technical support for their computer is when they are going online. So our technical support guys here come to be seen as their first point of contact if they have technical problems."

Lynn says many of the support calls they get have nothing to do Internet connection problems. Instead, people may call up asking why they can't print a page from a Web site or why their modem cuts off when they are online.

Now, when ParaLynx's subscribers have a problem with their PC, they will get help from a PC Support Centre portal customized by Burnaby, B.C.-based PCsupport.com.

Cliff Rowlands, vice-president of sales and marketing for PCsupport.com says anyone using Microsoft's Internet Explorer 5.0 Web browser can access a variety of online services that will help troubleshoot and maintain their home systems. Services will include regular virus alerts, maintenance utilities, backup services and software upgrades for applications when they become available.

By offering these services on the Net, PC users will avoid the frustration of calling a service centre and waiting in a phone queue until someone takes their call.

"All of those call centres practice call avoidance techniques with people punching in numbers in order to route calls," says Rowlands.

PCsupport.com's Support Centre will even lets someone log on and speak to a support staff person either through chat or email. Another feature is the ability for the support staff to directly go into a person's system and fix problems that may have occurred, such as broken links, disk errors and damaged files and programs. All of this is done through the browser and with the permission of the user, who approves changes before they are made by the technician.

"We want the customer present when we do


the work and they can watch us do everything on the screen as we do it," Rowlands says. "At every level, they have to give us permission, and at any time, all they have to do is touch the mouse and control reverts back to the subscriber."

All of PCsupport.com's technicians are trained by the company and have four to five years of technical experience, including certification. Currently, PCsupport.com does not charge for its services as it is building its sub-



scriber base, but Rowlands did not rule out the possibility of charging a minimum fee at some point in the future. He says he is also considering the possibility of bundling PCsupport.com into service packages that PC vendors would offer to customers.

ParaLynx's Lynn says her company will offer the service for free to start, but they will charge a fee eventually. She would not say what those charges would be, or whether they would be part of a basic ISP subscription.

PCsupport.com plans to offer round-theclock technical support when more staff comes online in the next while. Currently, the support is limited from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. PT. After hours, people can email in their questions and they will be contacted within 24 hours.

Velocity OSP trials

Another company, Velocity Computer Solutions Ltd. (http://www.velocitylT.com) has started beta trials of its own online troubleshooting and repair service.

Unlike Paralynx, the nearly two-year-old company, which has offices in Vancouver, Calgary and Toronto and plans to cross into the northwestern U.S. by the end of the year, is not an ISP. Velocity provides a range of "solutions," from helping clients plan hardware, software and connectivity purchases, to repairing and servicing their systems. The company already offers round-the-clock voice support and on-site repair and servicing through its call centre and team of more than 45 mobile engineers.

For the new service, Velocity is targeting its client base of about 2,100 businesses, which range in size from single computer operations to medium-sized enterprises. What they have in common, according to Velocity, is the desire to avoid the high cost of "down time."

In researching the new Online Service Products (OSP) solution, the company said it found that even though the price of hardware and software continues to drop, the total cost of ownership (TCO) has risen. This is credited to the climbing costs of servicing, and the cost of having employees sitting idle.

According to Velocity chief executive officer, Shawn Chute, "Over 90 percent of customer calls into our support centre originate from software problems instead of a hardware failure." And many of the software problems can be fixed remotely.

The company felt that if they could diagnose and fix problems that could be addressed via a broadband connection prior to dispatching an engineer, it would not only save money, but their clients' systems would be up and running more quickly with the elimination of travel time.

"Our new [services] will allow us to access and remotely control a customer's computer or network over a high-speed Internet connection," said Chute.

Like the PCSupport.com service, this is done only with the client's permission. Clients initiate the online service by clicking on the Velocity Supportal icon on their PC

"Within seconds, a Velocity support specialist will be available by videoconference to discuss the problem, and the best way to provide a solution," says Chute.

By using videoconferencing technology instead of chat or email, Velocity technicians literally talk clients through online service sessions. During a demonstration of the OSP service to TCP and a group of investors in early February, a Velocity representative said that a 56Kbps modem is the minimum connectivity requirement to use the service, which is platform independent.

"Velocity's support team can work on a customer's computer or network just as easily through a broadband Internet connection, using our remote control software, as an engineer could if sitting in the customer's

Velocity does not have pricing for the OSP service yet. It says it eventually plans to extend its OSP offerings to include maintenance, upgrading and training services.



Think utility, not just utilities

Utilities used to be restricted to small, single purpose helper programs, but no more. Fully functional trialware versions of expensive commercial software now compete for the same customers with better-than-ever shareware. The Web has provided a common distribution channel, and we users are demanding more and more from our PCs.

n researching the topic of top 10 PC utilities, the issue of whether or not to include shareware along with commercial PC utility software arose. If you ask "why not?" you have probably already observed a notable trend-shareware and regular software are rapidly merging. Many popular programs (for example, four of the top five Web authoring programs I reviewed for an upcoming issue of TCP) are available in 15- to 60-day free trial versions. These demo programs are full versions with the ability to save files, and no limits on size of workspace or other functionality. Increasingly, these programs can be found at popular download Web sites, like TUCOWS (http://www.tucows.com) or Download.com (http:// www.download.com).

It is remarkable that computers—those logical whizzes—are primarily being used not to enhance calculation or logic but communication and the arts.

Sound like shareware? Indeed. And for its part, shareware offerings are becoming more like trial versions of commercial software, but from a different starting point. Instead of unlimited trial periods, most shareware programs have switched to the time-limited model. Also, most shareware is now fully enabled, instead of offering the limited functionality of "light" versions of programs. Shareware also sports all the pro features like tooltips, wizards, rich help files, tips of the day, online tutorials and electronic documentation.

At many download sites you will see oldfashioned shareware mixed in with software from such big names as Adobe, Allaire, Macromedia, McAfee, NetObjects, and Sybase.

Of course the great equalizer is the Internet. Both regular software and shareware vendors realize that because trial software can easily be downloaded from numerous shareware Web sites or found on popular, free best-of CD-ROMs, customers are becoming less concerned about brand name and more about the effectiveness of the programs. And since all vendors are moving to all-electronic documentation and Web-based product support, there is little to distinguish brand name programs from shareware other than the quality of the code.

With this in mind we went to three major software download sites and listed their most popular downloads as of early March 2000. From this list, augmented by input from *The Computer Paper* staff, we choose our top 10 PC

utilities. As you will see, many of the programs on the list stretch the definition of a utility. (Every program is a utility from the operating system's point of view; and every utility program is a candidate to become a part of the operating system from Microsoft's point of view.) However, we limited ourselves to PC software, but with this same broad definition of a utility. By inspecting the most popular downloads from the freeware/trialware/shareware sites, one gets a feel for the range of "utility" software available today.

Most popular

When examining the most popular downloads —ICQ, NetZip, WinZip, CuteFTP, Go!zilla, iSpeed, WebFerret, Netscape, Internet Explorer, GetRight-it is clear that Web utilities top the list. All of these are Internet-based or Web assist programs.

The second most popular group include multimedia titles. WinAmp, Sonique, ACDSee, Webshots and PaintShop Pro-audio players, and image cataloguing utilities are all about multimedia. It is remarkable that computersthose logical whizzes-are primarily being used not to enhance calculation or logic but communication and the arts.

In compiling this list, we also chose some OS add-ons-WinZip and PCAnywhere-which are more traditional utilities. But in keeping

with the evolution of the PC as the intelligence and networking/messaging hub in home and SOHO (small office/home office) environments, some non-traditional categories have been included. We are really trying to identify software, and especially trialware, that adds a lot of value and utility in diverse settings.



think compression utilities would get the short stick. Not so. Backups, Web downloads, and general file management can always benefit from compressed files.

But as WinZip reaches version 8, it is seeing increasingly tough competition. WinRAR, for example, matches nearly all WinZip's features while delivering files that are five to 20 percent more compressed, handling more compression formats (including ZIP), and running on more platforms (including Linux, most popular versions of Unix and OS/2). Another competing free program, FreeZip, is very compact (attaching itself to Windows Explorer) and minimal.






GoBack

Wildfile's GoBack is for road warriors and power users who are constantly making changes to their systems-by adding and removing software, presentations, notes, etc .but who encounter that dreaded moment when suddenly things go wrong, badly wrong. Can't reboot or find a critical file?

For the price of about 10 percent of your disk space, GoBack will let you restore your system (or just one or two inadvertently deleted files). It is not like undelete software, which is at the whim of whether the PC filesystem overwrote a file. GoBack logs all disk changes. It has some limits, though: depending on the size of log files, GoBack will only go back four to five days; it only supports Windows 95 and 98 (a Windows 2000 version is due soon); it offers no support for compressed disk drives; and there are some limitations on removable drive support. But overall, the benefits of efficient version logs have come to the PC with GoBack.

Like PCAnywhere and Laplink, these programs are engaged in a knock-down drag-out fight. In this case it is for the computerizedmapping market. The latest battle point is over ActiveX controls: MapX in the case of Mapinfo and MapObjects in the case of ESRI.

For a lot of organizations, mapping the location of customers and constituents can help an organization decide where it wants/needs to go next. More importantly, dynamic Web maps in the fashion of MapQuest (http://www.mapquest.com) are possible with map servers or downloaded ActiveX controls. In sum, having maps, and all the insights they offer, is easier than ever before.

PaintShop Pro

PaintShop Pro is a step or two behind top-ofthe-line paint programs like Adobe Photoshop and Corel Photo-Paint in masking and layering options, but it nearly matches the big boys in its effects, colour manipulation, and imageediting functions. What sets PaintShop Pro apart are its extra utilities, such as a built-in album display, vector-based text and graphics, plus interfaces to scanners and digital cameras along with the very adept Animation Pro tool.

In the hot digital-imaging marketplace, PaintShop Pro is a very compelling bundle of features for home, Web and SOHO use. SmartDraw (http://www.smartdraw.com), which approximates the flowcharting virtues of Visio, is a close runner up.

Why download a calculator when you can get a math whiz as an assistant (check for the free trial CD-ROM on the Maplesoft Web site). In addition to calculations, this whiz does full mathematical formula manipulations like simplification of complex equations, derivatives, integration, power series, and more, while offering graphic visualization and optimization capabilities.

Rivals Mathsoft and Mathematica may have included whiteboarding features, 3D graphics capabilities, top-notch matrix and simulation operations (in the case of Mathworks), but the underlying Maple Math Engine is hard to beat for versatility. Boy if I had only had this for physics class.

These two programs get the last word on utility software. These suites, which have a street price of less than \$90, bundle together for a complete Swiss army knife of utilities. Norton SystemWorks includes Norton Utilities (a suite in itself), Norton Anti-Virus, Remove-IT, Mobile Essentials, and Norton Crash Guard. McAfee Office includes Uninstaller, Nuts and

Bolts, First Aid, OilChange, and McAfee VirusScan. So if you are looking for two or more utilities, go here first, but check the details at the respective Web sites.

Conclusion

What is the common denominator among our top 10 utility picks? First and foremost, the ability to download and try out all of the software with few or no restrictions on functionality. This is real value when comfort and ease of use are as important as features in deciding whether software will meet your needs.

Second, the developers of most of these products have taken the comprehensive approach to delivering functions and services. You definitely will not find yourself shortchanged with Notes/Domino, Canvas 7, or Norton System Works, for example. Despite powerful features, all of the programs thrive because they allow users to get at the functions quickly and easily, often offering the helping hand of built-in wizards and hints.

The third common denominator is their versatility. Beyond their own feature sets, many of the utilities provide for batch operation or macro/scripting capabilities. In addition, all provide extensive customization and personalization, allowing users to configure them to match their personal preferences.

Finally, software developers have been the first of the brick-and-mortar companies to face the challenge of the Internet.

But who wins in these ultra-competitive showdowns? In the OS utilities market, for example, developers have taken a big financial hit with utilities that used to sell for \$30 to \$75 each and now fetch \$60 to \$100 for five- or 10-user packs. The end user may be smiling now, but in the longer term-as we have seen in the case of Web browsers-bad things can happen as continued innovation

slacks off and/or broad product support becomes problematic.

But inevitably innovation persists. In fact, here is a prediction: in three years time one of the top 10 utilities will be for voice activation, handheld and home device synchronization, or agent beeper spam suppression.

Ahhh, utility! It is all in the eye of the beholder.


Help for sad Mac users

Major applications are now available in versions for both Macintosh and Windows machines, and when the

computers are humming along, the differences between the two platforms aren't blatant. If you've used Adobe Photoshop, Netscape Navigator, Microsoft Office, or Quark XPress for Mac, you can probably use Windows versions of those programs with only minor adjustments to the way you work.

But when a computer experiences problems, the differences between PCs and Macs reveal themselves. When I was dropped into a Mac kingdom in the early '90s, for example, I found that I could function productively on a Mac. I suspected that I was being set up for an office joke, however, when a co-worker suggested that I "rebuild the desktop" as a solution to my Mac problems.

As it turned out, and as Mac users know,

rebuilding the desktop is a legitimate and common maintenance procedure for Macs. Sad Macs, Bombs, and Other Disasters covers the whys and hows of this, along with dozens of other procedures for keeping your Mac healthy or diagnosing problems when it gets sick.

Peachpit rates the book as suitable for beginners, and that's a fair assessment, although the information is concentrated, so getting the most from this book requires more than a casual browse. For beginners, *The Little Mac Book*, also from Peachpit, would be an excellent companion resource.

Sad Macs organizes the material into three major units. Part I includes a short introduction to the Macintosh system, and general problem-solving strategies.

Part II gets into the nuts and bolts of fixing a range of problems. The information follows a practical layout, naming the problem, then listing symptoms, causes, and what to do to fix it. The symptoms are also referenced in a Symptom Index at the back of the book, which is very helpful for zeroing in on the solution to a specific problem.

Part III, called Disaster Relief, describes 17 Fix-its to cover just about everything that could trouble your Mac. Oh, and there's an 18th Fix-it if you are still stumped: seek outside help.

The book is also sprinkled with useful tidbits of information under the headings, By the Way, Technically Speaking and Take Note. Unfortunately, coming across one of these nuggets just when you need it would be a serendipitous event. If the publisher included indices of these, in the same vein as the Symptom Index, these tips would be far more accessible. But that's a minor criticism of an otherwise excellent reference.

Note: This review covers the third edition. A fourth edition of Sad Macs has been announced, which adds coverage of G4s and Mac OS 9. It was supposed to be released in February, but at press time, the Canadian representative of Peachpit Press said the book was not yet available in Canada.





Browser incompatibility

Examples of freeware gone bad

mong the most popular software downloads freeware outnumbers trialware or shareware. And it makes sense as good freeware should attract a number of users. But freeware has its limits. Support offered for such products is minimal unless there is a "step-up" product or service. Updates are episodic, often triggered by a competitor rather than by some rational schedule of development. But even more telling is the old homily that "you get what you pay for." A perfect example of this is the world of Web browsers.

Both Microsoft and AOL/Netscape are creaking under the load of developing complex browsers for free. While AOL's chief executive, Steve Case (who owns Netscape), spends billions on the acquisition of Time-Warner and has updated his own AOL browser to versions 4.0 and now 5.0, Netscape 5.0 has been consigned to the open source community.

Now I have no problem with true open source development. I believe GNU, OpenBSD and Linux bear testament to what it can accomplish. However, Netscape's Mozilla.org seems to be tottering under the load of being servant to two masters: AOL/Netscape and the open source community of developers. With Windows 2000 finally chugging out the door, only Oracle's Internet File System (IFS) can rival Netscape 5.0 on the list of very, very late software.

Web developers still have to spend anywhere from 15 to 40 percent of their time making sure their Web pages will work properly in the top two browsers.

With that in mind I went to the Net and downloaded Opera 3.6 (free for 30 days or US\$35 per individual licence) and NeoPlanet 5.1 (free) in the hopes that I would finally find a browser that would run both Internet Explorer 4.0 and later and Netscape Communicator 4.0 and later HTML/JavaScript-/XML/CSS/DOM. Alas, it was not to be. So, three years after both Microsoft and Netscape promised to implement W3C (World Wide Web Consortium) and other Internet standards completely, Web developers still have to spend anywhere from 15 to 40 percent of their time making sure their Web pages will work properly in the top two browsers. (HTML, XML, DOM, and CSS are W3C-recommended standards. JavaScript, in the form of ECMAScript, is the European ECMA recommended standard.)

I am one person who would pay up to \$100 for a browser that could execute all of the latest Internet standards. In sum, free software does not always bring the best out in developers.



ing programs. CrashGuard often doesn't perform any better than Windows (which results in having to close down your misbehaving program), but sometimes using the Revive Program button will let you quickly save your work before another freeze up.

- Zip Rescue: Automates core system backup. You can manually save your Windows' settings to a Zip or Jaz drive, but it's easier with Zip Rescue.
- System Doctor: Runs in the background and notifies you if it sees a way to improve performance.
- Disk Doctor: The oldest and most useful product in this package allows those unafraid of a DOS box to get right down to it.
- WinDoctor: Automates analysis, cleaning, and backing up of the registry. Some people go into the registry manually without a safety net, I'm not one of them.
- Wipe Info: Some people refer to this type of utility as a shredder, which makes it impossible to reconstruct a deleted file.
- Norton UnErase: For recovering a deleted file (which you can do so long as you haven't shredded it, or waited too long).

The package includes many other functions and features, too: the CD-ROM is bootable, the recycling bin can be further protected, you can update the program from the Web once you register, and system information can be displayed in various ways, most of which are customizable. The long and the short of it, is that Norton Utilities likely has the utility you need for most standard PC problems.

Tread carefully

Which brings me to the rather hard lesson I relearn each time Symantec sends me a new version of its utility collection. Although I am quite aware of the dangers of making wholesale changes to my Windows machine, it doesn't take long before I have clicked here and there and found myself in trouble.

As you progress through later chapters, solutions become more exotic-and more complicated to implement. However, the instructions are clear.

How about paring down Windows 95 to occupy less than 20 MB, or yanking Internet Explorer out of Windows 9x? Optimizing Windows tells you how.

One of the most intriguing chapters for me is devoted to running Windows from a RAM disk. Farquhar notes: "I put 256 MB of RAM in an old 266 MHz computer, coaxed Windows into running entirely from the RAM disk, and the computer blew away any and all expectations I would have of a 700 MHz screamer."

A RAM disk is a logical drive that is created in RAM, and because there are no mechanical components to slow access, data on a RAM disk is available much more quickly than from a hard drive. This won't improve activities that depend primarily on processor power, but where a process involves a lot of requests for data on the hard drive, RAM disks can perform much faster than even the speediest mechanical drive. RAM disks were a common solution in the pre-Windows days, but as programs became larger and RAM prices remained high, the solution became impractical. Now, as RAM prices once again begin to fall, this may be the biggest bang you'll achieve from 400 bucks.

It usually starts innocently enough with some small problem—maybe even just a tiny annoyance-that I try to fix. I start tinkering with the "safe" changes (marked in green by Norton). If things don't get better, I get annoyed and start changing things marked in cautionary yellow. Finally, I am getting rid of DLLs, ActiveX files, folders, all sorts of things, completely ignoring the program's reminder that I should be backing up every deletion.

Eventually, I give up and turn off the


machine, only to return the next day to find that my computer won't work. Then the pain starts-the denial, the remonstrations, and slow process of rebuilding my entire system.

I admit that this isn't the fault of the product. It explained what was going to happen. Still, I mention it to stress the fact that a powerful program for managing core functions of the operating system, among other things, is capable of disabling your system and destroying your work, when placed in the wrong hands.

Recommendation

If you are not planning to upgrade to Windows 2000 anytime soon, and do not have an earlier version of Norton Utilities, this new release is a good choice for an all-round, jack-of-all-trades utility program. (Despite the common "2000" in the name of both products, this version is for Windows 95/98 only.) With Norton Utilities you can fix or at least better understand many of the problems that regularly come up in the wonderful world of Windows.

Speech next user interface, says IBM

n coming years, the computer's familiar graphical user interface (GUI) will give way to a conversational computing interface more in tune with the multidimensional character of human communication, according to IBM's voice technology

"We as human beings use our hands and our mouths [to communicate]," said Ossie Osborne, general manager of IBM's Voice Systems group at a briefing in Toronto in March. "That's what this interface is about."

What IBM calls the conversational computing paradigm is a multi-modal interface. This means we would be able to talk to the computer, point to a spot on a touch-sensitive screen or use a keyboard, mouse or keypad (and perhaps eventually even gesture) to interact with it, depending on what was most appropriate or convenient. Likewise the computer could respond in a contextappropriate way.

Thus, in a street map scenario, if we were looking at a computer screen, we might type in our present location and our destination-or point to them on a touch screenand see the route mapped out visually. However, if we were in our car, we would find it more convenient (and safer) to be able to merely say to the onboard computer or our organizer "How do I get to my next appointment?" and have the computer respond with auditory instructions: "Turn left on Main, three blocks ahead," etc.

Voice technology research is one of IBM's longest ongoing projects, and Osborne said much of IBM's work to this point has been devoted to "getting the plane to fly-getting it to work."

David Nahamou, director of human language technology at IBM's Watson Research Center in Westchester County, N.Y., said "we took the '70s to prove to ourselves that a new way of speech processing was possible. The '90s was the product phase."

It was primarily during the last decade that IBM and other companies transformed the technology into retail products that allowed people to dictate to their computers. But, said Osborne, creating retail voicedictation products is not the principal focus of voice technology research and development-making it a building block for a digitally connected world is. Among the underlying technologies that will play a role are machine language translation, voice over IP, and a recently introduced VoiceXML specification. These may show up in multilingual text-to-speech systems like speech-enabled call centres that people would be able to access over the Internet.

Osborne demonstrated a sample application-interacting with an Interactive Voice Response (IVR) system for movie listings over a telephone line to find out where and at what times a particular movie was playing in a particular community. He suggested that voice-enabled "conversational" set-top boxes might be another consumer application. And with wireless access to the Internet approaching, voice will be the most practical interface on smartphones and electronic organizers that are too small to accommodate a usable keyboard.


IBM has released a Personal Speech Assistant that brings the conversational computing interface to Palm devices, Nahamou said, although he stressed that it is a technology demonstration at this stage, not a commercial product. The Personal Speech Assistant provides speech recognition, a text-to-speech capability, command and control (of menus and applications), and a memo-recorder function.

Fewer, bigger voices for speech tech

Meanwhile, the other two major speech technology developers have decided to join forces. Lernout & Hauspie says it will acquire competitor Dragon Systems of Newton, Mass. Belgium-based L&H, whose North American headquarters are in Burlington, Mass., said the talents of the two companies would create a "brain trust" that would advance speech and language technology. L&H also recently acquired

Dragon is the better known company in Canada, and its Dragon NaturallySpeaking product was the first continuous speech processor intended for use by the general public. (Continuous speech means you no longer need to put a distinct pause between each word, an annoying requirement of previous generations of speech processors). Dragon holds 35 patents related to speech and language processing. L&H has a competing product, called Voice Xpress. The company says both products will continue to be marketed and supported, although the technologies from each will eventually be combined into a single product line.

L&H has also been working in the areas of language translation and voice-enabled computer control. At last Fall's Comdex event in Las Vegas, L&H showed TCP voiceenabled Web browsing, and a multilingual utility that translated email into a variety of different languages.

Taming your toolbars



n the early days of computers in the workplace, office applications required cumbersome key combinations to perform common tasks like indenting and setting margins. Over time these were replaced by applications with

menus and toolbars that allowed you to see your options and didn't require you to memorize keystrokes.

If you're like most users, however, you'll find that the tools aren't always positioned to suit your needs. So, this month we'll look at some ways to customize your toolbars and menus.

We have a unique collection of tips, tricks and tools for modifying toolbars and menus that you won't find in most manuals. But be warned, when everyone in the office sees what you've got at your fingertips, they'll want to know how you did it!

In this column we've used Microsoft Excel 97 and Word 97 to illustrate some of the things you can do with menus and toolbars. Most of these tips are applicable to the programs that make up Microsoft's Office 97 suite and to corresponding programs in Office 2000.

Quick toolbar tips

You can customize toolbars by moving the

buttons around from one visible toolbar to another. Do this by holding the Alt key as you drag a button from one toolbar to the other. To remove a button, hold the Alt key while you drag the button off the toolbar and drop it into the editing area where it will dis-

You can see what toolbars are available by selecting View, then Toolbars. If a toolbar is currently displayed, there will be a checkmark to the left of its name on the toolbar menu. If it has no checkmark, select its name to display it.

Add some handy buttons

One handy button that doesn't appear on the Standard toolbar in Word or Excel is the File Close button. To add it, right-click the Standard toolbar and choose Customize. Choose the Commands tab, then from the Categories list, choose File, and from the Commands list choose Close, Using the left mouse button, drag the Close button out of the dialogue box and into position on the Standard toolbar. Choose Close in the dialogue box to finish. You can now test the button by clicking it. If your file hasn't been saved you'll be prompted to save it before it is closed.

You can follow this same process to add other Word and Excel commands to the toolbars. To see the range of commands available in Word, right-click any toolbar choose Customize. Choose the

Commands tab, from the Categories list, choose All Commands, and you will see what's available in the Commands list. In Excel, there is no such master list. The various commands are simply organized into functional groups in this program.

handy commands are the ToolsAutoCorrectSmartQuotes, which automates replacement of double quote marks with smart quotes; and ToolsWordCount, which calculates the number of words in your document. Once you start exploring, you'll be sure to discover plenty more that are useful to you. If you are unsure what a command does, select it and click Description to get an explanation.

You'll also see that some commands have their own custom buttons and others don't, This doesn't affect your ability to place the command on a toolbar, it just affects what you see when you put it there-text or a button graphic.

When you choose a command that doesn't have an icon, such as ToolsAutoCorrect-SmartQuotes, you can create one yourself. To do this, place the command on a toolbar, right-click it, and choose Edit Button Image. In the Button Editor dialogue box you can choose colours with the mouse and use them to create an image for your button. When vou're done, choose OK to finish.

When an icon on the toolbar displays both text and an image, you can set it to display the

The Visual Basic Tutorials: Part 10

Review and consolidation

n this, our 10th Visual Basic Tutorial, we shall take a look back, then go forward. .The look back will underline the most important points to remember about the VB interface while doing another database component exercise. The reason we are "repeating" database and components is because this is what programming in the new millennium is really like.

You, as programmer will be expected to quickly interconnect databases, Visual Basic (VB) and third-party components, into a working package. In fact, this is so important, our next three or four tutorials will uncover how to do this with VB for Applications (VBA), which is available in every copy of Microsoft Word 97 (or later), Corel WordPerfect 2000 (and on), Visio 5 (or later), and dozens of other popular Windows programs. For better or worse (with the good there comes distinct shortcomings), VBA is rapidly becoming the macro language for Windows.

But first, let us review the VB graphical user interface (GUI) and some usage guidelines as shown in Figure 1. As you become more proficient in VB you will spend more time in the Source Code editor and the many designers (especially the database designer) than in the visual forms editor. So often, for example, you close down the ToolBox or the Properties Sheet to make space to really motor in the Source Code Editor.

On returning to visual edit your form, you discover that the Property Sheet or Toolbox does not automatically pop up when the form is displayed. Figure 1 is a reminder of the toolbar icons that you can click on to restore these important reference windows (these settings are also available in the View menu). Finally, we shall see the identical icons when using VBA's macro editor in Word, Excel, PhotoPaint, etc.

Figure 1 also helps to answer the question from Visual Basic Tutorial 8: how do you make a form non-resizable. Notice that on the Property Sheet the form's MinButton and MaxButton properties have been set to False. In addition, the BorderStyle property is set such that Sizable is not enabled. With these settings your form cannot be resized.


Dynamic database components

A lot of VB projects involve displaying data either as reports or cross-tabulations so users can get a feel for their data. The database grid and flex grid components included with VB 5 and 6 are adequate. However, I would encourage readers to download free demos of ActiveReports and/or DynamiCube components from http://www.datadynamics.com. Linux for Newbies: Part 10

Finding things on a Linux system

tarballs. Where did the RPM put that executable or library file? Where are those sample Java programs I was experimenting with? Where did that PNG graphic I created with the GIMP get stored?

Finding things is somewhat easier on Linux than on some operating systems because Linux has a logical file structure. You can usually find binary files, for instance, by simply looking in logical places, such as /bin, /sbin, /usr/bin, /usr/sbin, and /usr/local/bin. Nonetheless some executables can end up elsewhere, such as /opt/wp/bin or some other directory such as /usr/X11R6/bin.

Most of your own files end up somewhere in your /home directory. If you're running an Apache Web server, your HTML docs can be under either Apache itself (/home/httpd/html on Red Hat systems), or in your home directory-/home/yourname/public_html, for example.

Even though the logic of the file system helps, when you are looking for something among the thousands of files that typically populate any Linux setup, it's nice to know that there are aids for finding things.

Quick finders

Quite often you need a quick way to know where a binary file resides. Different Unix systems have slightly differing philosophies about where certain things are stored, and the slight variations sometimes need to be taken into account. If, for example, you download a Perl script, it may have the bangpath statement #I/usr/local/bin/perl as the first line. If the script doesn't run on your Linux system, there's a good chance your Perl is not in /usr/local/bin. To find out where it is, use the which command:

\$ which perl /usr/bin/perl

This displays the full path of a program. With this information you can then change the bangpath at the top of the program to #!/usr/bin/perl in the script, or add a symbolic link from /usr/local/bin/perl to /usr/bin/perl.

Locate, which is similar to which, provides a command-line front end to a database of all the files stored on your computer. It often displays a considerable amount of output, so you may need to pipe the results through less or

You can use locate to find the related files for a program. For instance, the default vi editor in Red Hat Linux is Vim. You know that Vim has help files you can invoke from with-Continued on page 110

image only to save room. To do this, right-click the toolbar, choose Customize, right-click the button, choose Default style, then choose Close to return to the editing screen.

Word's Work menu

One of Word's best-kept secrets is its built-in Work menu, which, unfortunately, isn't available in other Office applications. It's handy for storing a list of frequently used documents. This menu is different from the list of recently opened files that appears under the File menu. In contrast, the Work menu contains only those files you choose, and they remain there regardless of when you last accessed them.

To add the Work menu to your Word menu bar, choose Tools, Customize, then select the Commands tab. From the Categories list choose Built-in Menus, then, from the Commands list, choose Work. Using your left mouse button, drag the Work menu option from the dialogue box onto the menu bar, dropping it into position to the left of the Help icon. Choose Close from the Customize dialogue box to return to Word.


Add a file to your new Work menu by opening it, and, when the document is visible on the screen, choose Work, then Add To Work Menu. Once a file is added to the menu, you can open it anytime by selecting Work and choosing the file from the list.

You can remove a file from the Work menu by pressing the following combination of keys: Ctrl + Alt + - (minus key), (Make sure to use the minus key situated to the left of the Backspace key and not the one on the numeric keypad.) When your mouse pointer changes to a thick black horizontal bar select Work, then select the name of the file you want removed from the Work menu. This only removes the file from the menu and doesn't remove it from your hard disk.


More toolbar options

You'll find you have more room on your screen if you remove toolbars when you're finished using them. To do this, right-click any toolbar and choose the toolbar to remove from the list. All visible toolbars have a checkmark to the left of their name, so you can identify which are open and choose the one to hide.

When you're experimenting with toolbars you may remove a button by mistake or arrange buttons in a way you don't like. To reset the toolbar to its original state, choose View, Toolbars, Customize, Toolbars tab, and select the toolbar that you want to reset from the list-you can do this regardless of whether a toolbar is visible or not. Choose Reset and, when prompted with the Reset Toolbar dialogue box, click OK to confirm that you want to reset it. Keep in mind that resetting restores toolbars to their "original' state-you'll lose any

changes or additions you've made to the settings since you first installed Excel and Word.

Sometimes, instead of just adding buttons, you'll want to create a new toolbar. To do this, choose View, Toolbars, Customize, then select the Toolbars tab. Click New and, in the New

Toolbar dialogue box, type a name for the toolbar and click OK. The toolbar will now behave like any Word toolbar and you can add buttons to it, remove buttons from it and display or hide it using the same processes you would for existing toolbars.

The commands attached to many of the toolbar icons can also be selected from the keyboard using shortcut keys. You can display the keystroke equivalents in a button's ToolTip if you choose Tools, Customize, Options tab, choose the Show Shortcut Keys In ScreenTips checkbox, then click Close. In time, you can use this information to learn the shortcuts for some frequently used commands.

Icon ideas

An icon is simply a 16x16 pixel then choose Paste Button Image.


You can also use any standard paint software to make your own custom button images. If you use this process, you have access to a larger range of colours than the range offered in Office's built-in Button Image editor. To create a button in a program like Paint, load it,

choose Image, Attributes, set the Width and Height to 16 pixels and create your icon using the tools available. When you're done, choose Edit, Select All, Edit, then Copy. Switch to the application in which you want to paste the

image that you create yourself or copy from another program. Within the Office suite you can copy an icon from one program and paste it into another program by right-clicking the button to copy. Choose Customize, right-click the button again, then choose Copy Button Image. Switch to the location you want to paste the image, right-click the toolbar, choose Customize, right-click the button to change,

gram. DynamiCube will be used in the tutorial to show how easy it is to supercharge a component with some simple GUI elements. In this case two combo boxes will allow us to control what fields are displayed in the DynamiCube.

Figure 2 shows the running DataCube application. DataCube is displaying marketing data from the CATS database (which is an Access table, but could as easily be IBM DB2 or Oracle 8i database tables). The Unit Price field is about to be removed from the DynamiCube. The field name will be transferred from the In Cube combo box to the Out of Cube combo box. As the Unit Price field is transferred between comboboxes it is also removed from the DynamiCube. Users appreciate this capability because it allows them to simplify or drill down into the data in the exact manner that they want.

The programming trick is to load up the combo box with the field names that are being used in the DynamiCube, then to know how to do the transfers.

Private Sub Form_activate() Dim i As Integer For i = 0 To Data1.Database.TableDefs("CATS").Fields.Count - 1 Combo1 Additem Data1.Database.TableDefs("CATS").Fields(i).Name




Figure 1: VB graphical user interface

First there is the (above) Form_activate() code to load Combo1 (In Cube combo box) with the field names from the CATS database. If you plan to do any amount of VBA and VB programming you will have to get used to the naming conventions of VB collection classes. It is all explained in the VB Help topics on collections, and in particular the TableDef collection. Basically, the For loop is through the collection or list of fields used in the CATS table. The Combo1.AddItem adds each name into Combo1. The next piece of code transfers a field out of the DynaCube.

Private Sub Combo1_Click() If Combo1 ListIndex >= 0 Then Combo2.Additem Combo1.Text DCube1.Fields.Delete (Combo1.Text) DCube1 RefreshData Combo1.RemoveItem Combo1.Listindex End Sub

First, the Click event on the combo box indicates a field name has been clicked or selected. This triggers the transfer. Notice the order of events. First, we add the field to the Out of Cube combo box (Combo2); then we delete it from the DynaCube (DCube1) and refresh/repaint the DynaCube; finally we remove the item from In Cube combo box (Combo1). The reverse code, Private Sub Combo2_Click(), follows the same pattern. For a little coding, one certainly gets very robust display of data.

As final convenience some simple resize code provides an alternate to the VS/OCX and other "smart" resizers we covered in our previous tutorial. When, as in this case, most of the dialogue box is taken up with the DynaCube





Figure 2: Dynamic DataCube application

(think also of database grids, large text/memo boxes or picture boxes) then it is simple to code the Form_Resize() routine:

Private Sub Form Resize() Dim i As Integer On Error Resume Next DCube1.Move 0, 400, ScaleWidth, ScaleHeight - 400

All we have to do is move the DynaCube to the same start position while resizing it to the new form dimensions, ScaleWidth and ScaleHeight. Note if those dimensions would cause an error then the resize On Error just leaves the old set-Continued on page 109

icon image, right-click the toolbar, choose Customize, right-click the button you want to change, and choose Paste Button Image.

Even if you can't copy an icon from a program, you can still use it. To do this, make sure the icon is visible on the screen and press the Print Screen key on your keyboard. Open Paint, choose Edit, then Paste. Use the Select tool to choose a 16x16 pixel area on the image (you can read the dimensions from the foot of the screen). Choose Edit, Copy, then discard the image. Switch to the application in which you want to paste the image, right-click the toolbar, choose Customize, right-click the button you want to change, then choose Paste Button Image.

The way we were

If you've upgraded to Microsoft Office 2000, you may be yearning for the old Office 97 interface. Office 2000's new personalized menus hide the less frequently used options and the Standard and Formatting toolbars share one row on the screen. If you're used to seeing all the options available, you may find Office 2000's habit of changing the visibility of menu options and the order of toolbar buttons frustrating. To return to a setup similar to Office 97, choose Tools, Customize, and select the Options tab. Deselect the Standard And Formatting Toolbars Share One Row checkbox and/or the Menus Show Recently Used Commands First checkbox, and click Close.

In Word 97 and 2000 the Frame option no longer appears on the Insert menu as it did in earlier versions. If you'd like it to appear, you can add it to your menus by choosing Tools, Customize, then select the Commands tab. From the Categories list choose All Commands, then select InsertFrame from the Commands list. Click the Insert menu to open it, drag the InsertFrame option from the Commands list and drop it in the desired location on the Insert menu. Click Close to finish. You can repeat this step and add the

FormatFrame option to the Format menu so it is similar to earlier versions of the program.

Did you know?

Some Excel toolbar buttons do double duty. If you hold the Shift key when choosing such buttons, they do something different. These are the double-duty button combinations:

Open/Save Print/Print Preview Underline/Double Underline Alian Left/Alian Right Sort Descending/ Sort Ascending Center/Merge and Center Increase Decimal/Decrease Decimal Increase Indent/Decrease Indent

More advanced buttons and menus

If you regularly use accented characters, you can create a toolbar buttons for each one. For example, to create a button for an e acute, choose View, Toolbars, Customize, then select the Commands tab. From the Categories list choose All Commands and from the Commands list choose Symbol and drag it onto the toolbar. When Symbol dialogue box appears, from the top of the Font list choose normal text, then choose the letter e acute from the grid, and click OK.

Right-click the new button and, in the Name area, replace the current entry with the character itself. Do this by holding the Alt key as you type out the number 0 plus the code for the character. In the case of e acute, you would type 0233 on the numeric keypad. Hold the Alt key as you type all four numbers. (Note: It's very important to hold the Alt key down while you type in the full code and that you use numbers on the numeric keypad.) You can now click the button every time you need this character.

tings intact. Note also, we leave a strip along the top 400 twips in size for the combo boxes (or any other controls). VB uses a device-independent unit of measurement, a twip, for calculating size and position. Two properties of the Screen object, TwipsPerPixelX and TwipsPerPixelY, can be used to determine the

exact size of a display(converting twips to pixels or inches) at run time.

VB6 Black Book, published by Coriolis, discusses combo boxes on page 252-272, and resizing plus twips on page 608-609. Beginning Visual Basic 6 covers these topics on pages 206-227 and 636-637.

The locate command shows that there are a large number of help files in /usr/share/vim/doc.

Locate uses the locatedb database, which must be updated periodically to keep up with changes and additions to your system. Most Linux systems have a cron job set to update the database. However, if you don't run your system 24 hours per day, you may need to update your locatedb manually. You do this by logging in as root and typing the following:

updatedb

Whereis is a command similar to locate, but somewhat simpler:

\$ whereis vim vim: /usr/share/vim /usr/man/man1/vim.1

Whereis only displays a program's binary executable, its source and its man page locations. This is preferable to locate when you don't want all the extra related file locations.

There are times when you can remember the name of a command but can't remember what it does. What is mformat for instance? To find out, just type the following:

\$ whatis mformat mformat (1) - add an MSDOS filesystem to a lowlevel formatted floppy disk

Whatis is complementary to whereis. Because whatis is also a database, it too needs to be rebuilt occasionally. To rebuild the whatis database, log in as root and type:

makewhatis

Sometimes a different kind of search is necessary. You know there's a utility that does such and such, but you can't quite remember its name. What is the name of the command that can format a DOS disk? Apropos to the rescue. Apropos searches the whatis database for matching strings. You can find the program you're looking for by typing:

\$ apropos format

These handy finding aids are quick and easy. Once you start using them, finding most files becomes a simple task. But sometimes you're after a needle in the haystack. For those occasions, you turn to find, arguably, one of the most useful and powerful tools on a Unix/Linux system.

- nfs fstab format and options

Find—a Unix/Linux power tool

Find does just what the name suggests-it finds things. It's a brute-force seeker, recursing down through every directory in its path looking for patterns (including wildcards and regular expressions). Because it has no pre-existing database, it's much slower than locate or whereis, but it is thorough and dependable. If find doesn't find it, it most likely doesn't exist.

Linux uses GNU Find, a swiss-army-knife utility with options galore. Find has a somewhat unusual syntax that requires a little study. The most common use of find is to find a single file or a set of files related by name. The following example shows a way to look for any filenames or directory names called "perl," starting at the root directory (/):

find / -name perl

/usr/bin/perl

/usr/local/src/htdig-3.1.2/db/docs/ref/perl

It should be noted that the syntax in the preceding example is considered very modern and won't work with all versions of find on all Unix systems. Because of this, I prefer the classic, slightly more verbose, syntax of find (using the same example):

find / -name "perl" -print

This more universal version of the command includes the -print qualifier (meaning print to screen) and surrounds the search term

The search expression can include wildcards. If you're pretty sure, for instance, that there's a file on the system that ends in "perl" the search can be rephrased as:

find / -name "*perl" -print

/usr/bin/find2perl

/usr/bin/perl

/usr/bin/suidperl

/usr/doc/mod_perl-1_19/eg/makepl_args.mod_perl /usr/doc/samba-1.9.18p10/examples/misc/wall.perl

/usr/lib/perl5/site_perl

/usr/lib/pert5/site_perl/i386-linux/auto/mod_perl /usr/local/src/libwww-perl-5.18/blib/lib/auto/libwww-

/usr/local/src/libwww-perl-5.18/blib/arch/auto/libwww-

/usr/local/src/htdig-3.1.9/db/docs/ref/perl

Likewise you can surround the entire search term with wildcards (e.g. "'perl'"), to fish out any instance of a file or directory that has "perl" anywhere in its name.

Advanced uses of find

Find has an armada of optional qualifiers, including file types, date qualifiers and boolean logic ("and", "or", and "not"). One of the most common uses of find is looking for

files of a certain age. For example, you can search down your home directories looking. for files that were modified exactly 10 days ago using the -mtime qualifier (date last modified):

find /home -mtime 10 -print

Likewise you can look for files that have not been accessed for more than 90 days by typing:

find /home -type f -atime +90 -print

The -type qualifier, in this example, tells find to search only for regular files (f), as opposed to block files or other binary files. The -atime qualifier inspects the "last access" time stamp on any files found. This can be very useful for cleaning up systems. If you have a rule, for instance, that user files that have not been accessed in more than a year should be automatically deleted, you add the exec qualifier to find:

find /home -type f -atime +365 -exec rm {} \;

The syntax following the -exec operator may look a little odd. The "()" is a placeholder or variable for each instance of a filename that find finds. The "\" tells find that it is at the end of any additional commands and prevents odd things from happening during shell-script expansions. Anything that uses the remove command (rm) is potentially dangerous. Use the -print qualifier in place of -exec during testing until you're sure you've got it right.

Now, let's think about what we've got here. A utility (find) that can traverse an entire file system, or selected parts of the file tree hierarchy. Once it finds things, it can execute commands on the things it finds. We now have the makings of some very powerful scripts, such as a global search and replace on a Web site. You could combine find with a command-line Perl statement to change all instances of "Copyright 1999" to "Copyright 2000" on all the HTML pages of your site, making a backup copy of all the changed files, just to be safe:

find /home/httpd/html -name "*.html" -print I xargs \

> perl -p -i.bak -e "s/Copyright 1999/Copyright 2000/g:"

To get rid of all the * bak files this command created, you can type the following (after you've verified that everything was changed

find /home/httpd/html -name "*.bak" -exec rm {} \;

This is the inner beauty of Unix-providing logical building blocks that allow you to string together existing utilities to create your own custom utilities.

Another use for find is searching for programs on your system that have special permissions set. Some executables, such as lpr or sendmail, need to execute with root privilege and are "set user ID" to root (SUID). Knowing where these are on your system can help you watch for security vulnerabilities. You can find all such files on your system by typing:

find / -user 0 -perm 4000 -print

If you see a file in this listing that doesn't

make sense, you may have detected the work of an intruder.

Find has so many qualifiers and so many potential uses, that this column only begins to convey a sense of its full power. You can find out more about using find from advanced Unix books, such as Unix Power Tools (published by O'Reilly & Associates, ISBN: 1-56592-260-3, \$85.95).

O'Reilly compiles User Friendly antics into book

t used to be that the only comic strips were those carried in your local newspapers (and out of those, whichever ones your parents subscribed to). Now with the advent of the Web, it is possible to keep up with the latest antics happening in comic strips published in newspapers around the world. Thanks to the Web, some comic strip artists can now reach a wider audience. One of those artists is Illiad, who draws the User Friendly strip published in the Linux Journal. Now, thanks to the people at O'Reilly, everyone can get a healthy dose of techno-humour from this compilation of strips.

The events in the strip are set in the offices of Columbia Internet, a feisty little Internet service provider (ISP) comprised of an assortment of techies, administrative staff, a pointy-haired boss (shades of Dilbert here), a talking computer and a mischievous little dust bunny. The style of cartooning looks a little like a cruder version of the work of Berkley Breathed (best known for Outland and Bloom County),

and shares some of its humour too.

There are basically two styles of humour in this comic strip: one which derives its laughs from the personality quirks seemingly typical of people who work in the technology sector, and pointed barbs at the technology industry itself (Microsoft and its products regularly get

Arguably some of the best moments in this book are those that cover extended storylines, such as when Erwin the Artificial Intelligence gets progressively demoted from his original home in a PC, going in quick succession to an iMac, a Palm Pilot, then the computer (possibly a Coleco Adam) aboard the Mir space-station. There's also the Star Wars spoof that pits the dust bunny and the Linux penguin who use the power of Open Source against the forces of Microsoft, and blow up the Death Star by rebooting it. If you recognize the in-jokes, you will get a kick out of this collection.

This is another book that proves O'Reilly doesn't just print books with pictures of animals on the covers (its Nutshell series, for which it is probably best known). While User Friendly is not in the same league as Dilbert in its humour or inventiveness, anybody who works regularly with computers, or with computer users, will definitely have a few chuckles while reading this book.





MCSEs feel Microsoft ending Windows NT exams prematurely

icrosoft and the engineers trained to administer its Windows operating systems in the field are at odds over the company's decision to change its certification qualifications.

The software giant has decided to stop testing for its older business-related OS, Windows NT, in favour of certification for Windows 2000.

As far as Microsoft Certified Systems Engineers (MCSEs) are concerned, Microsoft is pulling the exams too quickly. As well, according to a letter from the Coriolis Group LLC's chief executive officer, Keith Weiskamp, Microsoft is unfairly forcing MCSEs to upgrade their skills.

What's at issue here is the qualifying standard. If MCSEs don't upgrade to Windows 2000, they run the risk of losing their "certified" standing. Plus, Microsoft will give the engineers only one free chance to pass the exam. If an MCSE fails, he or she will have to pay for their second attempt.

"Changing and restricting the MCSE Windows 2000 program is counterproductive, because you are alienating a dedicated community of professionals," Weiskamp wrote in his open letter to Microsoft and its chairman Bill Gates. "This is particularly true because the Windows NT 4.0 certifications will expire before many companies have replaced that software with Windows 2000 alternatives."

The Windows NT 4.0 exams are scheduled to end this year. Microsoft says this still gives MCSEs plenty of time-until the end of 2001to upgrade their skills.

"We expect any individuals who choose to certify in the MCSE track to assume a leadership role in helping their employers or clients stay competitive," wrote Donna Senko, Microsoft's director, certification and skills assessment, in a response to Weiskamp's letter. "And maintaining current certification shows that those individuals are fully equipped with the needed skills to meet that challenge. MCSEs are leaders in their fieldnot followers."

In a telephone interview, the director of the Canadian Business College in Toronto. Mazher Jaffery, agreed with Senko: "In introducing the new program, I don't think they're going too fast at all ... Things change. and we have to keep up with it."

But Michael Lane, director of communications for Toronto's Canada College of Business and Computers (CCBC), isn't pleased with Microsoft's decision to demote engineers who choose not to upgrade.

"It's like telling a teacher 'If you don't get more training, you can't teach anymore," he

According to CCBC's admissions counsellor.

Kyle Phillips, only a handful of schools are currently qualified to teach the Windows 2000 skill set. In what he called a "great marketing" scheme, Microsoft has its engineers hooked on this training investment.

"I agree in setting a standard," Phillips said. "But... from their [Microsoft's] perspective, they've been quite successful."

As far as Weiskamp is concerned, Microsoft owes the engineers more time.

"MCSEs gave your software a second chance," he wrote. "You should give them a second chance, too. Please reconsider your limitations on the... Windows exam, and stretch out the timetable for upgrading MCSEs to Windows 2000 by at least one

For its part, Microsoft says its current exam path is more than fair.

"MCSEs who have planned for and made the transition to Windows 2000 will have a significant advantage over uncertified individuals,"

"MCSEs will need to invest time and effort in Windows 2000 as well, but we are confident that the ultimate payoff will be significant."

ince its launch in 1998, the iMac has been turning heads. Its radical new look and features easily made it stand out from the crowd. 

This guide pretty much lives up to its name, as author Todd Stauffer takes the reader on a tour of the iMac and what you can do with it, How



to Do Everything with Your iMac is designed as both a reference and a tutorial for the new iMac owner. It has four sections: Get Started, Get Your Work Done, Get Online and Customize Your iMac.

Get Started provides a basic tour of the iMac, covering lots of Macintosh

basics, such as describing icons, and how to launch programs. If you are a complete computing neophyte, you'll find this section useful, though more experienced Mac users will likely skip it.

Get Your Work Done is largely devoted to using the iMac as a business system. It covers such topics as how to make charts, presentations, create and organize databases, and keep track of appointments and finances. It also has a fun side, looking at QuickTime for editing movies, playing popular Mac games, and using other software tools.

Get Online deals with the major Internetbased applications-email, surfing the Web using Internet Explorer and Netscape Navigator, transferring files, and creating Web pages-central to the iMac's popularity.

The final section, Customizing Your iMac, tells you how to personalize and upgrade an iMac. Readers learn how to modify the look of the desktop, change sound settings, set the iMac up for multiple users, add peripherals and memory, link to a network, and troubleshoot.

This updated guide looks at technologies that have been released since the first edition was printed including: Mac OS 9, Outlook Express 5.0, Sherlock 2, Quicken 2000, and QuickTime upgrades. It also has information on Apple's AirPort wireless network and the latest DV series of iMacs.

This book contains tons of tips offering very practical advice on everything from cleaning your iMac, to adding rolling credits to movies you are editing. There is a lot of good info here, though some sections could easily have been

expanded. The relatively paltry section on writing Web pages, for example, barely takes the reader through the basics. On the whole though, this book contains a lot of useful information about the iMac and how to use it.



Better brochures

f you have a need for a small print run of brochures, you can create them in-house using Microsoft Word or Publisher. For a larger volume printing job, a local print shop might be a better choice, but you can still design it yourself. Here are some ideas for creating better business brochures.

Who are you? • Always prepare your brochures so they contain enough information to stand alone as a document. Even if you routinely post your brochures with a covering letter, chances are they'll part company, so don't rely on details in the letter to cover for details you've omitted from your brochure. Always include your organization's name, telephone number, and postal and email addresses prominently on your brochures so people interested in your services or products can easily contact you.

Small print runs • Your brochures don't have to be printed in full colour. They can be just as effective if neatly output on a monochrome laser printer. If you're making small print runs, consider using quality preprinted paper stock from a company like Idea Art or Paper Direct. For larger runs, a cost-effective solution is to have your print shop pre-print paper with your logo and other fixed details in colour. You can then overprint the brochures with a monochrome laser printer as you need them.

Team players • Every document you produce should look like it is part of a team and not a solo performer. When you place your business cards, letterhead and brochures side by side, they should display common elements, such as the company logo (with a common placement), type faces, colours, line styles, etc. When you're designing brochures, stick to a basic theme that reflects the style of your other business documents. This way, you'll have fewer choices, but the design tasks will be easier and the results will look more professional.

Repetition • A basic rule of design is repetition. Repeating elements throughout a brochure gives it strength and style. A quick way to use repetition to bring order to an unruly brochure is to reduce the number of type faces to one or two, and to line everything up against the left margin. Format every heading the same way, add some additional space before each heading and close up the space between the heading and the following paragraph. This makes a visual connection between the heading and the paragraph it relates to.

Follow the flow • In general, people read left to right and top to bottom, so make sure the information in your brochure follows this flow. On a typical trifold brochure the reader expects to view the cover first, then the three inside panels. Finally they'll turn the brochure over

and read the fifth and sixth panels. Include the basic information you want to get across to your reader on the first three panels inside the cover. Relegate contact information and the mailing area to the two back panels.

Common sense coupons • Ensure that any clipable coupon in your a brochure backs onto less important information. You wouldn't want to put your phone number or address on the back side of a coupon, for example, because once the coupon is used, readers no longer have that information. Place the coupon on one edge or corner of the brochure so it's easy to remove. Mark the coupon with a dashed line so it's clear what the reader should do with it. Include your mailing information inside the coupon, so it can be clipped and mailed without reference to the original brochure.

Post it • If you design brochures that are self mailing, you'll save on the cost of envelopes

and the time it takes to fill and seal them. If you do this, make sure your design allows for quality content opposite the postal information, providing your recipient with an incentive to open the brochure.

Date it • If you include time-sensitive data (prices, for example), make sure you put the date somewhere on the brochure. Recipients can then determine if prices are current when they read the brochure. You can also identify the realistic lifespan of the information. If you publish monthly, include the month and year. If you publish quarterly, indicate a season: spring, fall, etc., and the year. If your brochure can be expected to remain in circulation for a year, then including the year will do.

NB—California-based iNetNow Inc. has launched what it calls a "human-powered" Websearch service users can access from a telephone. It is human powered because users call iNetNow's toll-free number, tell an operator what they're looking for, and iNetNow's staff does the actual work. INetNow "surfers" can do anything the Internet is traditionally used for, including looking up an address, booking a flight, making reservations, online shopping, or obtaining stock quotes. The service costs US\$0.45 per minute, but the company is offering three months of free service to the first 5,000 people who sign up.

mous service.

PrivacyX.com (https://www.privacyx.com/) claims its PE-mail is the only offering of its kind to let Net surfers send and receive fully secure email messages without letting anyone know who they are—not even the company.

Douglas Whorrall puts it succinctly: "We don't know who our customers are," said the president and chief executive, during a recent press briefing in Toronto. "We issue digital certificates anonymously."

The updated service—PE-mail 2.0, which was released March 23—will eventually carry advertising within the email messages to support the free service, but "without compromising the security of the encryption," according to Whorrall.

Interested users can visit the PrivacyX Web site to register for the service. A questionnaire for new subscribers will let the company target its ads according to specific interests, such as music or clothing.

According to the company, users are issued a PrivacyX email address (which they can choose) and a corresponding digital certificate that meets "industry-standard X.509 protocols." The user's identity is protected by the company through anonymous registration and filtering systems. The result is that routing information is removed from each message header, according to PrivacyX.

"We have no way of decrypting your email," said William Boucher, vice-president of technology and development. As for the prospect of government or police agencies trying to block or regulate PE-mail and similar anonymous services, company representatives said they foresaw no problems. "Email should be just as private as Canada Post mail," Whorrall said.

While he may not know who its customers are, Whorrall does know there are currently about 50,000 PE-mail users. The advertising won't likely begin until that number at least triples, he said.

For those users who don't want any advertising, PrivacyX plans to offer PremiumX accounts, for a fee, Boucher said. Of course, there are problems with charging for an anonymous service that aims to keep its subscribers nameless. "We have to work out a way for people to pay anonymously," he said.

Intel matches AMD's 1 GHz processor

SANTA CLARA, Calif.—Advanced Micro Devices Inc. (AMD) had a short-lived hold on the claim to being the only company shipping computer processors capable of cranking at 1 GHz. Intel Corp. (http://www.intel.com/) announced the availability of its own 1 GHz Pentium III, just two days after AMD unveiled its record-breaking 1 GHz Athlon processor.

In matching AMD in the speed department, Intel managed to one-up its competitor on price. The new 1 GHz Pentium III is currently tagged to sell at US\$999 each when purchased in quantities of 1,000, while AMD's fastest Athlon was launched with a price tag of US\$1,299 when purchased in bulk.

Paul Otellini, executive vice-president and general manager of the Intel Architecture Business Group, said the new Pentium III is now the "highest performance microprocessor for PCs," citing a variety of benchmark tests which factor in variables beyond raw clock speed. However, independent labs have yet to test machines available to end users which pack the new processors.

Dell Computer, Hewlett-Packard and IBM will be manufacturing systems based on Intel's 1 GHz processor, while Compaq and Gateway have announced systems using AMD's offering. —Newsbytes

New 850, 866 MHz added to lineup

Following the announcement of the 1 GHz chip, Intel released new 850 and 866 MHz Pentium IIIs, which rounds out its chip lineup to 13 processors, the slowest now being a 450 MHz model.

The chiprnaker says the new 850 and 866 MHz processors are "designed to power an Internet experience filled with rich audio, video, animations and 3D that make information come alive." The new Pentium IIIs are targeted for home and office environments.

But with 11 chip speeds on the market already, how does Intel plan to convince its customers that 866 is any better than 850 MHz? And is there a significant difference between 850 and 800 MHz?

According to Kevin Krewell, a senior analyst with MicroDesign Resources, we shouldn't rely on the published numbers alone. The difference between these chips is in the details.

The 850 MHz offering, for example, uses a 100 MHz front-side bus. And, says Krewell, "I suspect this will be the last time we see an Intel product that supports the BX chipset."

This older chipset adheres to the equally old 100 MHz speed. Now that the bus is known as the main throttle-point for computer performance, the more the better. Thus, although Intel's two new chips stand only 16 MHz apart, the 866 MHz Pentium III, with a 133 MHz front-side bus, should perform substantially better.

As far as Krewell is concerned, Intel is putting an end to the overclocker's need for speed with the faster Pentium III. Apparently Intel caught its Taiwan partner, Via Technologies Inc., pushing the 100 MHz Intel chipset to 133 MHz.

"You can't officially overclock the motherboard," Krewell said. "They weren't designed to work faster than 100 MHz."

In the end, Intel sued Via, but the American arm also learned a lesson. Make the product faster, or others will do it for you.

If this is the case, why bother with the 850 Pentium III at all? Krewell said not everyone is willing to toss the old motherboard, even if they want a faster processor. In the end, Intel's marketing makes sense.

"You have a mix of old and new from a motherboard point of view," Krewell said of Intel's target audience.

Monitor system via Web, Palm, cell phone

BURLINGAME, Calif.—Serena Software (http://www.serena.com) has taken the wraps off ChangeXpress, a software package that allows software updates to be approved (or denied) using mobile devices such as mobile phones and Palm PDAs (personal digital assistants), as well as fixed and mobile Internet access devices.

The software is designed to interface with the firm's existing Change Man (for legacy systems) and eChange Man (for distributed systems) packages, allowing IT managers to leave the office, and yet still be able to securely approve software updates.

This facility is useful, the company says, where IT managers are responsible for IT systems that service large numbers of users inside an organization or, perhaps more critically, for publicly accessible computing platforms.

A spokesperson for Serena said the firm's software is in active use at more than 2,000 IT installations around the world.


The most important feature of ChangeXpress, the firm says, is that it provides a consistent Web-style interface for Change Man and eChange Man-driven systems.

Tony Stanyer, Serena's vice-president of marketing, said that extending the firm's software into the mobile and Internet-accessible environment is the next step in integrating seamless enterprise software change management.

Serena says Change Man and eChange Man automatically trigger a notification when changes on any major computing platform are ready for a manager's approval. Notifications can now be sent via email, and relayed immediately to pagers, mobile phones, and Palm handheld devices

UWO's Beowulf debuts

The University of Western Ontario (UWO) is Canada's computing juggernaut, thanks to a \$200,000 donation in computer equipment from Compag Canada Inc.

With a grand total of \$1.6 million worth of chips, screens, motherboards and wires, the school's Centre for Computational Research is "up and running," according to Peter Poole, a professor of applied math at UWO and one of



the centre's directors, "This is the most powerful Beowulf [a Linux cluster] in Canada by far," boasted Allan MacIsaac. also a director at the centre.

For its part, Compaq is

boasting 70 Alpha microprocessors in ES40 and AlphaStation systems running in a Linux environment. UWO's researchers will use the massive computer (which MacIsaac described as a "monolithic block of machines") to study fluid dynamics and materials modeling, among other traditionally computation-heavy

subjects. Researchers also plan to access the centre's computing power to sort out complex scheduling problems. "We're demonstrating that Linux is not only invading the desktop," said Poole, a self-described Linux fan. "It's invading the high end as well. And it works well."

Poole's penchant for Linux speaks to his work as a researcher. "We want to spend our research money completing throughput," not equipment, he said. Linux, the free, opensource operating system means, "we haven't spent a cent for software."

And as far as Poole is concerned, UWO could have an "in" with companies seeking serious number crunching. "If a business wants a solution pretty quick... with facilities like this we can go out to a customer and say, 'we have the computing muscle to solve your problems.""

a private-sector partner with the hardware to handle high-level number crunching.

"We spent two years trying to capture attention," MacIsaac said. "Especially Compag's."

According to the professors, Compag had the right equipment: fast, robust microprocessors, server technology and the wherewithal to put it all together.

"It's a new direction for them [Compaq]," MacIsaac said, referring to earlier acquisitions of Digital Equipment Corp. (creator of the Alpha chip) and Tandem Computers Inc. "Before, they were focused on the PC. By buying Digital, they got Alpha. And with Tandem, they got the server... They were developing network technology. Compaq said, 'let's turn that into a commodity product.

UWO doesn't plan to stop here. With the help of other post-secondary institutions in southwestern Ontario, the school plans to organize a "cluster of clusters," according to Poole. Through the federal government's Canada Foundation for Innovation-a \$1.9 billion fund for high-tech research projects-UWO, the University of Guelph, Laurier University, McMaster University and the University of Windsor hope to turn Canada into a world-class computing nation.

"We want to go further," Poole said. "Canada isn't traditionally thought of as a super-computing nation. And Canada's universities have never even been on that map." -Stefan Dubowski

Star Wars Online expands frontier

Star Wars fans can soon become inhabitants of George Lucas' faraway galaxy by making the jump into cyberspace.

To create its first online role-playing game, Star Wars Online, LucasArts (http://www.starwars.com/) has some heavyweight help. Online PC game developer Verant, which created the massively popular multiplayer game EverQuest, will develop the PC-based game, and Sony Online will exclusively host the Net play on The Station (http://www.station.sony.com). The game, due in 2001, will be sold at retail (no price set), and monthly subscriptions will be about US\$10.

As with EverQuest, Star Wars Online will be a first-person role-playing game that lets gamers choose from several roles to portray in a huge fantasy world. (EverQuest has more than 200,000 paying subscribers, 120,000 who play daily.) Players' characters perform tasks, tackle quests and do battle. And unlike single-layer games, everything that happens affects the entire fantasy world. In this case, the fantasy world starts with Luke Skywalker's home planet of Tatooine, about the same time the original Star Wars film began.

The once and future king (of graphics)

Canada's ATI covers the PC graphics market from end to end, while playing catchup to NVIDIA in the 3D gamer ghetto

ounded 1985. in ◀ Technologies Inc. has grown to become the largest maker of PC and Mac graphics hardware in the world. Yet, for the last two years, in the high-end, real-time 3D-gaming segment, the Thornhill, Ont .-

based firm has been surpassed by two recently formed upstarts, 3DFX and NVIDIA. These two U.S.-based firms have consistently produced hot graphics processors that attract a large contingent of leading-edge software developers, and the graphics cards based on their chips consistent-

ly win performance shootouts from

Whenever I talk about personal computer graphics with Sean Carruthers, the head of The Computer Paper's Test Lab, he rates the graphics performance of PCs using the latest 3DFX and NVIDIA chips well ahead of PCs using ATI RAGE 128-based graphics cards. Yet ATI in general has continued to forge ahead as the market leader in the PC industry. How is this possible?

ATI's mobile graphics chip line has gone from zero market share two years ago to 37 percent of the global mobile graphics market at the end of 1999.

From soup to nuts

The answer to this paradox is clear if you look at the PC market as a whole, rather than focusing solely on the high-powered, 3D-gaming sector. Unique among graphics chip makers, ATI has developed a line of products that spans the entire

price/performance range from entry-level, budget PCs, to high-performance, big ticket power user PCs. The low-end ATI graphics cards offer decent performance for common tasks, such as running office software and educational multimedia CD-ROMs, and cost less than \$50 in some cases (and much less in

> bulk, or as chipsets to install on motherboards), making them popular in PCs that are not intended for high performance games or 3D software.

ATI has also developed extremely effective graphics products for the notebook PC market (the

mobility line) and for the Apple Macintosh platform. The mobile graphics chip line has gone from zero market share two years ago to 37 percent of the global mobile graphics market at the end of 1999. Apple has bought millions of ATI

cards or chips to install in both desktop and notebook Macs, including the ATI Rage 128 Pro for the Power Mac G4 line. Most recently, ATI announced strong support for the Linux market, promising to develop Linux drivers for its products.

Converging on the future

In conversations with ATI engineers and product managers over the last year, the depth and range of ATT's product strategy for a "converged" world of digital media has been laid out pretty clearly. For example, ATI virtually created the mass market for digital video on the PC with its All-In-Wonder line of multi-function cards. The All-In-Wonder cards combine TV tuner, video capture, picture-in-picture display, MPEG2/ DVD digital video playback, as well as 3D graphics acceleration.

There have been lots of other PC TV tuner or entry-level desktop video or MPEG playback cards, but the ATI approach—of offering a huge, well integrated set of video features on one card-has enabled it to sell around 1.5 million All-In-

In mid-February, ATI announced its first really large corporate acquisition, with the purchase of Palo Alto, Calif.-based ARTX, Inc. for about US\$400 million. ARTX, a leading developer of 3D/graphics and multimedia technology, was purchased in an effort to boost ATI's ability to compete in the future PC and consumer electronics markets.

And, in late February, ATI announced a new, integrated chipset, the S1-370TL, aimed at the budget PC market, offering very high price/performance for general purpose PCs.

ATI showed it was once again ready to go head to head with NVIDIA and 3DFX, when it announced its Charisma Engine and Pixel Tapestry Architecture in early March. ATI claims the new chips will deliver a tenfold increase in 3D graphics power. No doubt, NVIDIA and 3DFX will have their own announcements of new generations of 3D chips in the months to come (NVIDIA has been chosen to supply graphics processors for the forthcoming Microsoft X-Box).

What all the players in the PC graphics market should keep in mind, however, is that they are no longer playing in a PC-only world. Over two-thirds of games software sold in North America in 1999 was for video consoles, such as Sony PlayStation and Nintendo 64. This fall, PlayStation 2 will land in the North American market, with an undoubtedly large impact on the PC 3D-gaming industry. When that happens, ATI's ownership of so many different parts of the graphic market, and its ventures into digital television and mobile computing, may cushion it from the post-PlayStation 2 fallout better than its hotshot 3D rivals D
